2019 Santa's Store needs help, donations

FORT MADISON - This year's annual Santa's Store program is currently accepting donations, but is also looking for elves and helpers.

This year's children shopping event is being held Saturdays, Dec. 7th and 14th at the St. Paul Lutheran Church at 1934 Avenue I in Fort Madison.

Children ages 2-10 can shop for up to six items for a \$5 donation. The children have to be able to shop with the assistance of an elf. Elves can be ages 12 and older. Proceeds go to the veterinary fund at P.A.W. Animal Shelter in Fort Madison.

PAW Director Sandy Brown coordinates the event and said volunteer hours for public school students can be applied to the graduation requirement for community service.

"Last year we did pretty well getting high school students to help the younger kids shop," Brown said.

"But if your little ones are too shy or afraid to shop, they can try again next year. They have to be able to

shop with the elves because grandmas, aunts, uncles, moms and dads aren't allowed to shop with the kids."

The Santa Store is open from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m both Saturdays. Donations are being accepted this week on Monday and Tuesday and next Monday and Tuesday the 25th and 26th at the church.

Donations are accepted through the alley entrance. Brown said she has the volunteers she needs to handle accepting the donations, but needs help on the days of

"It's all employee driven," said McDowell.

"They submit the idea to the selection committee which is done at a global level. They have a standard set of criteria to make the selections and we were fortunate enough here in Fort Madison with the Test Kitchen, being one of nine that will receive the award this year."

McDowell said the grant requires involvement of the employees where they volunteer with the different activities that take place at the Test Kitchen.

"We've been in here quite a bit. It's a fantastic operation that Kumar has set up. We can't thank him enough for what's he's done here. I think the results speak for themselves. So we look forward

"They're retaining people in the community and this is a good way to support that retention. I think that's why you're seeing this," said Paul Schulte, one of 11 board members

Wickramasingha said the grant comes at the perfect time.

"This award could not come at a better time because the program is growing at an extremely faster rate than I can change the minds in the community about supporting the program," he said.

Wickramasingha's main mission is to bring awareness to education and let the community know how important our teachers are.

"Until we take very seriously, the profession of education there's no solution as to what we're going to face. That's why it's so important to me."






