City's new trash cart delivery underway

FORT MADISON - Motorists on the east end of Fort Madison probably saw the beginning of the city's

More than 4,000 of the new carts were unloaded on the parking lot west of the Riverview Park pavilion Monday morning. Semi-trailors rolled in and out of the park most of the morning unloading the new 65and 95-gallon wheeled trash carts.

new trash cart program underway Monday

Then workers contracted by Rehrig Pacific, the manufacturer of the new carts, began unloading the carts early Monday following the city's regular trash pickup routes. The carts were delivered at addresses curbside with a plastic bag containing a card that had information on the new carts and the city's recycling plan.

Laura Legois, a consultant with Municipal Connections which oversaw the rollout, said delivery will go along with the city's regular trash routes. However delivery will continue on Wednesday, a day without a trash pick up in Fort Madison. She said the delivery should be complete by Thursday if all goes well.

"These guys will probably work til dark most days to get these out. They won't work in heavy downpours or lightning or anything, but they're pretty efficient," she said.

More than 2,000 residents filled out cards or went online to register for the new carts. Residents could choose from the 65- or 95-gallon containers, with the 95-gallon costing \$17.50/month and the 65-gallon set at \$15/month, the amount customers are currently paying for solid waste pickup. The \$15 charge replaces the \$15 solid waste fee residents were being charged. Those with the 95-gallon can will see an additional \$2.50 on their city water bill.

Legois said she plans for few hiccups and will be

in town for the week to help with the transition. She said if residents appear to be missing their cart wait a couple days after your regular trash day or until Friday and contact the city public works department.

"If your neighbors around you got a 65-gallon and you ordered a 95-gallon they're going to come back and get you the 95," she said. "Don't worry, that will happen, but if your regular route is on Monday and say by Wednesday you don't have it, go ahead and call

City Hall."

Information on the ongoing delivery will be available on the city's website and Facebook page, but Legois said the process should be relatively simple.

"This should be a pretty easy process for people getting what they want," she said. "We had a really good signup. It was a combination of cards and online.

Menke to step down as West Point city administrator

"Temporary" fill in ends after eight years with city

WEST POINT - After eight years as the City Administrator for West Point, Gary Menke will be stepping down this summer. At Monday's regular meeting of the West Point City Council, Mayor Paul Walker informed the councilmen on the policy administration committee that interviews will start next week for the position.

Menke signed on as the

City Administrator after retiring from DuPont eight years ago.

"I retired once as HR Manager at DuPont and then came here after Art White's death," Menke said. "He died suddenly and I was on the utility board and the mayor asked me to fill in. It was

Trash carts should be in place by Thursday

If people just wanted the 65-gallon they didn't need to respond, but we had about 2,000 people respond so that was very positive."

She also is reminding residents that they can use their old 40-gallon cans for recycling if they just label it so city workers know. She's encouraging residents to recycle as much as possible and said recyclables don't have to

be separated.

"The city wanted to open that up to use other other cans so that people can still utilize those and they don't go to waste, and we really want to encourage that recycling."

If residents want to make a change to the carts they have, they have until the end of July to contact city hall and request a change. Once the carts have been delivered,

residents can move them to their regular trash locations and begin using them for weekly trash pickups.

With regard to the trash stickers, the city has stopped selling them and will allow them to be used through July 20. The city will also be setting a week-long refund period in July where they will buy back any unused stickers.

Thirteen applicants to be considered for Menke's post

supposed to be temporary, but I guess you could say this is temporary."

The city has received 13 applications to fill the position and Menke said he's told Walker that he would be flexible with a stop date to allow the city to get the right person on board.

He said he'd been talking about retiring for about a year and he and the mayor had both been talking about stepping away at the same time, but Walker decided to run again for two more years, however Menke decided to call it quits.

The city is currently in the middle of some major projects that the new administrator will step into.

"We've got a major project with the new lagoon. That's a \$1.5 million estimated project and we've got to work through that," Menke said. "We've got the new school build and we have to work with them on that to make sure that's successful. But financially were in a good place and we've done a lot of improvements since we've been here, park upgrades, a new main street, and we've got five new homes out south in the subdivision."

Menke said the city is in good financial shape with a slightly increasing mill levy, but also property valuations are on the rise and subdivisions are starting to grow.

He said a good timetable for the new administrator would probably by Aug. 1, but nothing was set for sure.

"It's undecided. I'm flexible," he said. "We've accepted applications and that's now closed. I've got 13 that we're looking at and my guess is that we'll do interviews in the next week or so, but when we identify a candidate they'll probably need time to notify their employer. So I'm probably thinking about Aug. 1. I told the mayor I'm flexible."

He said the city has some good options because many of the candidates are from the area including Burlington and several from West Point.

"I think we've got some good choices," he said.

In other action, the council:

- voted 5-0 to set June 30 for the annual fireworks display at South Park with a July 1 rain date.
- voted 5-0 to rename Veterans Memorial Park, West Park Subdivision. The city park is currently being subdivided into three lots for individual sale and development.
- voted 5-0 to increase the amount of new hire contributions to the city health insurance program to 20% of the premium. Current employees will be grandfathered in at current rates.

FMHS get first twinbill win at home in five years

FORT MADISON -Fort Madison head baseball coach Ken Steeples was sort of lost as to how many years it's been since his Bloodhound baseball team has won a doubleheader at home.

The Hounds shut out Keokuk 5-0 in the opening game of a twinbill Monday night at home and then edged the Chiefs 4-3 in the night cap.

"We we're just talking about that and I don't think it's been since I came here in 2012, but I don't know. It may be six years since we've won a double header at home."

A quick check of Quik Stats Iowa showed that the last doubleheader the Hounds won at home was against Washington on July 10, 2013. The Hounds actually won five double headers that year, two were at home. The other team was Keokuk. The Hounds swept Ke-

okuk, West Burlington and Washington on the road that year as well.

But you'd have to go back to July 2, 2007 to find the last time the Bloodhound baseball and softball teams swept doubleheaders at home on the same night, with both teams sweeping Keokuk.

The Lady Hounds knocked off the Chiefs Monday night 8-2 in the opener and 4-1 in the second game.

"It sweet that it's Keokuk, but it's even sweeter yet that we earned the win in both games, we played well and won both games," Steeples said. "We made some mistakes base running in the second game. We had several thrown out. Some of that was being aggressive and some just weren't very smart, but if we get thrown out being aggressive I don't have a problem with that."

Dayne Cordray went five innings and sparkled through the first three not allowing a hit or walk retiring the first nine hitters he faced. But the Chiefs started to dial in on the quick working

gle to left and move Miller to third, but Cordray would pick Miller off at third on the next play to end the inning.

Brandon Reichelt hit a home run to right center off the first pitch he saw in the top of the second to get the scoring going for the Hounds. Lennon Barker singled and Tony Fortado laid down a bunt to move him over, but outran the throw to first for a single. A pick off move to get Fortado went to the fence and both Barker and Fortado moved up a base. Danen Settles then drove a pitch to center scoring Barker, but Fortado was called out at second for leav-
