

Four turn in papers for mayor's chair

Helmick, Eaves, Mohrfeld, and Hoskins get on ballot

FORT MADISON - According to Fort Madison City Clerk Melinda Blind, four people will run for the mayor's seat for Fort Madison in the November 5 election.

Current City Councilman Matt Mohrfeld announced his candidacy last month, but since then Rodney Hoskins, Jason Eaves and Joseph Helmick all turned in papers before Thursday's filing deadline. Current Mayor Brad Randolph said he was not going to see re-election last month.

At-large councilman Kevin Rink turned in papers to retain his council seat and will be challenged by Jerry

In the first ward, Rebecca Bowker and former mayoral candidate Chris Sorrentino will battle it out.

For the 3rd ward seat only Tyler Miller turned in papers, and Chad Cangas will run unopposed to hold onto his 5th Ward seat. Mohrfeld currently holds the 3rd Ward seat.

Burlington gets \$135K for runway project

WASHINGTON. - Congressman Dave Loebsack announced today that the Southeast Iowa Regional Airport will receive an \$135,267 grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Aviation Ad-

ministration (FAA) grant program.

The funding will be used for design review and construction inspection of the runway reconstruction project.

Broadband grant program open for applications

Bloodhounds' offense opens up in 26-7 win

FORT MADISON - Fort Madison High School's defense wanted the shutout.

But Friday's 28-6 win over Burlington at Richmond Stadium was more than good enough.

"We were so close (to the shutout), but we just couldn't get it," said junior Will Larson, whose big night on both sides of the ball helped the Bloodhounds (3-1) get the victory.

"It feels good. We knew we could do this. We have a defense where everybody does their job."

"It would have been nice to have a zero up there," Fort Madison coach Derek Doherty said. "It didn't happen. But we still played hard.

"This was a great win for us."

Burlington (1-3) didn't score until the fourth quarter, when D.J. Pugh scored on a 3-yard run on fourth

Until then, the Bloodhound defense was in command, with three interceptions and a fumble recovery to stop the Grayhounds.

"It was just a roller-coaster game," Doherty said. "We did a great job of fighting through some adversi-



The margin of victory could have been larger the Bloodhounds had two touchdowns called back because of penalties.

"We have to sharpen this penalty stuff up, no matter how we feel about it — good call, bad call," Doherty said. "We can't be in those situations, and that's on me. We have to fix that. If we do that, I think we're a good football team."

Larson threw for all four of Fort Madison's touchdowns — two each to Quentin Schneider and Parker

Larson threw a 14-yard pass to Schneider for the first score on Fort Madison's opening possession after an interception. He added a second-quarter 2-yard

TD pass to Denning, then threw a 9-yarder to him in the third. A 63-yard TD pass to Schneider later in the third quarter closed Fort Madison's scoring.

Larson threw for 243 yards and added 79 rushing yards on just five carries.

"He's starting to develop into an RPO quarterback," Doherty said. "He's starting to see things, he's understanding the offense better and better every week. He's a film-study guy. We're really happy with the progress he's making."

Fort Madison had 395 yards of offense. Schneider had 129 receiving yards. Calem MacLearn had 60 rushing yards.

Burlington had 261 yards of offense. Trey King rushed for 101 yards.

"We came out, we had the energy, effort and attitude," Larson said. "That's what they preach to us. And we knew we could get the win."

Fort Madison opens Class 3A District 6 play at Solon next Friday.

"It will be the same kind of week for us," Larson said. "Just keep playing the way we've been playing."

Romeo Maestro led the Hounds on defense again with nine tackles, five solo. Larson and Tate Johnson both had interceptions for Fort Madison.

Central Lee falls to 0-4 with Homecoming loss

West Burlington scored a touchdown in each quarter, three on runs and then on a 45-yard pass play from Anthony Hoffman to Kendall Baker.

Central Lee scored in the third period down 14-0 when David Vance picked up a fumble and raced 23 vards to the endzone to close the gap to one score.

But the Falcon's would score again just three minutes later on the pass to Baker and then added an insurance score in the 4th on another one-yard plunge to put the game away with just under seven minutes

The Hawks were led on the ground by Dalton Westercamp who had 55 yards on 10 carries. Adam Boeck, who started at quarterback for the game had 22 yards on nine carries and went 5 of 16 for 33 yards in the air.

Evan Pohren and Connor Moore each had six tackles to lead Central Lee's defensive efforts.

Central Lee falls to 0-4 on the year and plays at Mid-Prairie on Friday. West Burlington (1-3) secured it's first win of the year and hosts Louisa-Muscatine on Friday at Bill Nelson Field.

Together, we can help increase the availability of high-speed Internet access in the State of Iowa."

Up to 15 percent of total project costs are available to be funded through the grant program for communication service providers that facilitate broadband service in Targeted Service Areas of Iowa. Both private sector telecommunication providers and public sector entities that wish to expand broadband access in underserved areas of the state may apply for funding.

The Office of the Chief Information Officer also released a new broadband map of Iowa today that incorporates the latest broadband availability data published by the Federal Communications Commission.
