FM's Hauck is lowa Games' strongest

FORT MADISON- Guns, lots of yelling, heavy objects flying through the air and risk of possible injury - no, this isn't war, it's the Iowa Games Strong Man Competition.

For the second-consecutive year, Fort Madison native Ian Hauck competed in the masters division of the Strong Man competition, this year taking the gold.

"That's my goal is to improve myself every year," Hauck said. "I'm getting older and I'm getting better. I'm not getting worse as I'm getting older, I'm getting better. By the time I'm 50 I hope I'm doing better."

The Iowa Games Strongman competition consist of four events. This year at the games there was the farm-

Keokuk woman wins \$20K on \$2 scratch off

CLIVE, Iowa - A Lee County woman whose boyfriend alerted her she'd won a \$20,000 prize said she didn't believe him right away.

Teri Maxwell, 50, of Keokuk, won the fifth of eight top prizes in the Iowa Lottery's "Iowa Black Premium" scratch game. She purchased her winning ticket at Hy-Vee, 3111 Main St. in Keokuk.

Maxwell scratched it later that day at home, but didn't realize it was a winning ticket until her boyfriend pointed it out. She said she didn't believe him because he often jokes with her about winning tickets.

"He goes, 'No, serious, trust me, it's a winner!" Maxwell told officials on Tuesday as she claimed her prize at lottery headquarters in Clive. "I thought, like always, he was pulling my leg. And he was right!"

They returned to the store, where they double-checked the ticket on the lottery terminal and verified Maxwell's big win.

"Always double-check your tickets - always!" Maxwell said. "I didn't think I would ever win that much

Maxwell plans to use her winnings to pay off a loan and purchase a new grill.

Central Lee plans two public bond meetings

Voters will also have more options to cast early ballots for \$12.9 million upgrades

DONNELLSON — The Central Lee Community School District will hold two community forums and three satellite voting opportunities in advance of a bond vote September 10.

The forums will allow community members to learn more about the district's facility needs and how the upcoming bond would address those needs. Attendees may also ask questions of district administrators and board members. The forums will take place Tuesday, August 13 and Thursday, August 29. Both will start at 6 p.m. at Central Lee High School, located at 2642 Highway 218 in Donnellson.

"We would like to invite all members of the Central Lee community to learn more about the district's needs and how the bond issue would address those needs," said Mark Hulsebus, board president. "Throughout this process, we are working to be as open and transparent as possible to ensure everyone who wants to provide their input has an opportunity to do so. This event is helping us do just that."

Registered voters in the district may also cast their ballots early at three satellite voting opportunities. The first will be Saturday, August 17, from 2 to 8 p.m. at the Montrose Watermelon Festival, while the second will be Thursday, August 22 from 3 to 9 p.m. at Central Lee's Back to School Night. The third will be Saturday, August 31, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Pilot Grove Savings Bank Community Room, at 521 N. Main Street in Donnellson.

Voters must mark their ballot at the satellite location and cannot take the ballot home with them. Satellite stations will also be accessible to individuals with disabilities.

If approved, the bond would provide the district with \$12.9 million in additional funds to incorporate a new office at the main entrance of Central Lee High School that would improve security and allow staff to better monitor visitors entering and exiting the building. This would add to measures already taken to

enhance safety through the addition of secured front doors and a school resource officer.

The funds would also be used for new class-

rooms for band and vocal programs, along with new preschool classrooms that would free up two additional classrooms to meet space needs at the elementary level. There would also be a new competition and performance gym for elementary, middle and high school events and ADA-accessible locker rooms. Additional plans call for an expanded commons area for better student collaboration and improved building flow.

The board has presented a bond question that would not increase local property taxes. If passed, the tax rate in the Central Lee Community School District would be \$12.19 per \$1,000 of assessed property value.

Sargent tapped to be new FMHS girls hoops coach

FORT MADISON- Typically a coach that has a coaching record of 144-42 with a program is someone that would be kept around for as long as they wanted. That wasn't the case with Central Lee High School and Tony Sargent.

After six seasons at the helm of the Hawks, Sargent's contract wasn't re-newed, making him a free agent. Having just lost their head coach a couple of months ago, Fort Madison jumped at the opportunity and made Sargent the new Head Coach of the Bloodhounds' girls basketball program.

"I've had some good players over the years that have helped me achieve what I've achieved," Sargent said. "It would be easy to say, 'Oh, I've done this and this,' but basically, my girls have always done it for me. It's not like it's been something I've done myself, I've had a lot of quality girls over the years."

On top of his six seasons as the head coach at Central Lee, Sargent's ties to Lee County date all the way back to his high school career.

Sargent graduated from Keokuk High School in 1973 and started his coaching career immediately after when he was 18 years old. Many may know Sargent from his stint with Cardinal Stritch from 1999-2001 when he helped coach his team to

the state tournament.

But even before his coaching days at Stritch and Central Lee, and even before his high school career in Keokuk, Sargent was always around coaching. Sargent's father, who taught for 52 years, was also a coach and started young, allowing him to grow up around athletics and develop a deep love for coaching.

"My dad coached, so I always grew up in a gym," Sargent said.

He was even able to pass the father coaching lessons on to his own children when they were old enough to

compete in athletics.

"I've been varsity and then back to kindergarten and back to varsity," Sargent said. "I enjoy it."

While his love for coaching was ultimately what drew him to the Fort Madison head coaching position, it was former Head Coach Todd McGhghy who enlisted the help of Sargent.

"Central Lee didn't renew my contract," Sargent said. "Coach (Todd) McGhghy reached out to me before he resigned and said, 'Hey, why don't you think about coming up and being my assistant?"

Sargent was reluctant to the idea at first, but eventually came and helped Mc-Ghghy out with his varsity camp for a few days.

"They've only won three games the past two years, but when I was up there for camp they didn't seem to be bad to me," Sargent said. "I think Coach McGhghy has laid a foundation. Whoever took the job I think was going to be more suc-

Hauck now setting sites on national events

soon as possible in under 60 seconds. Hauck took first with a time of 31.5 seconds.

The next event was the overhead medley where each contestant goes from kettle bells, to barbells, to a log, and finally an axel bar. At the end each contestant has to hoist the weight overhead and carry it across the finish line. Hauck finished first in that event as well with a time of 24.3 seconds.

Even though it was the event Hauck despises the most, he also took first with eight tire flips in 60 seconds. In the bag over bar event, contestants pick up heavy bags with the weight of 100, 120, and 150 pounds off the ground and lift them over a bar. Hauck dominated the competition again with an 8-second finish.

Of course one of the staples of any strongman competition is pulling some sort of heavy vehicle. At the Iowa Games each contestant pulled a truck for 100 feet. Hauck finished in plenty of time with a finish of 23.2 seconds, sweeping each event in the Masters division.

For Hauck, the gold medal has been a long time in the making, having taken silver last year at the same games. Hauck actually didn't have much confidence coming into this year's games, having gone on a vacation just before and getting in very limited workout time.

"I went into it not expecting very good results because a week and a half before we went on vacation," Hauck said. "(I) didn't lift and didn't work out. Then I had a period of about four days working out then the four day weekend I didn't work out."

Despite Hauck feeling like he was ill-prepared, he took first place in the first event and his confidence slowly rose from there.

"After the first event happened, it felt good," Hauck said. "I started feeling better, got to the truck pull, pulled it pretty fast. Started feeling better. Got to the overhead medley, smoked it. Then I was like, 'Yeah, I got this."

And he did.

Hauck swept away the competition, walking away with gold, something 10-plus years ago he never thought was possible after breaking his foot. After the injury, he went through more of a cardio centric workout phase.

When he decided he wanted to get back into heavy lifting, Hauck's goal wasn't to compete in powerlifting competitions, but with the help of a friend he realized he had potential for the sport.

"Me and my other buddy were getting into lifting and we wanted to lift heavy," Hauck said. "We hadn't thought about competing or anything, we just wanted to test ourselves and see."

Hauck passed the test and realized that there were not only different weight divisions in powerlifting, but there were also different age groups. Realizing he would be competing against people his own age and weight, Hauck started to compete and succeeded.

"I never realized there were weight classes," Hauck said. "That's why a lot of people steer clear of the strongman because they think it's a big man's competition. It's an enjoyable sport."

Hauck will be the first to admit that powerlifting isn't for everybody. It's very different from other sports, but many of the reasons it's different are the very reasons he and many others enjoy it.

"The people are like your family," Hauck said. "They treat you good, it's not like your baseball or soccer where people are fighting with each other all the time. Everybody is yelling for each other.

"They're right in your face saying, 'Come on!' It's a great feeling having people root you on that you don't even know. They help you to get your form right, or if you don't know how to do an event they will show you how to do it."

Hauck has a very fit physique, but says when it comes to the competitions, it isn't all about strength. Like anyone who has ever taken a weight training course knows, he says it's all about form.

"A lot of it is technique," Hauck said. "It's not all just raw strength. Especially like the overhead medley. I kicked everybody's butt in the overhead medley. I was the fastest time out of all the people at the Iowa Games in the overhead medley. It's all about knowing how to do it."

After taking the gold, Hauck has now started to set his sights even higher. He would like to eventually take his talents nationally and compete at the United States Strongman.

"I'd like to go there, that's my goal," Hauck said. "It's very challenging compared to the strongmans here because the weights are way heavier. They go beyond my limits, so I've got to build up to that."
