SE lowa hit hard by flu; rest of state hit harder

Rashid pharmacy manager says it's worst he's seen in 23 years

FORT MADISON - Despite record levels of flu shots being dispensed in the area and the veracity of the influenza A virus that's ripped through the area the past three months, it appears Lee County and southeast Iowa weren't hit as hard as other parts of the state.

According to data from the Lee County Health Department, influenza activity remains high in Iowa and is widespread, but samples from the State Hygenic Laboratory, the main reporting agency in the state's week-to-week results, 24 schools in the state reported 10 percent or more illnesses at least once during the week. The southeast region, which includes Lee County, reported just two schools in the week ending Feb. 17 and 28 schools since Oct. 1.

Statewide, there have also been 157 influenza-related

deaths reported for the whole flu season.

Tom Nelson, pharmacy manager and 18 year employee of Rashid Pharmacy in Fort Madison said it's easily been the hardest this area has been hit by the flu in his 18 years dispensing medicine.

"I've been a pharmacist for 23 years and I've never seen it this severe before," Nelson said.

He said both generic and

brand name TamiFlu doses have been very high as well.

"We've dispensed over 310 children regiments of Tami-Flu capsules in generic form and then about 50 of the name brand, plus 400 doses for adults and children that can swallow the pills. Both brand name and generic were off the charts this year. And that doesn't count


Partners trying to lock up Opportunity Zone

FORT MADISON - A new incentive program aimed at generating private investment in lagging Iowa communities, could be coming to Fort Madison.

The program was born out of the Tax Cut and Jobs Act of 2017, where private investment helps spur economic development in areas designated as Low Income Community Census Tracts, or Qualified Opportunity Zones. The initiative allows private investors to roll what are called unrealized capital gains, or gains on investments in stocks that haven't been sold, into O-Funds.

The incentive is to allow the private investors to defer capital gains taxes on the earnings until Dec. 31, 2026, while at the same time seeing possible earnings in the O-fund which, depending on how long

the investor leaves the money in the fund, could result in no capital gains tax on the earnings in the fund. The initial money rolled over into the fund, would be subjected to capital gains rates at the time

the fund is sold. If an investor leaves the money in the O-fund **GOBBLE** for a mini-

mum of 10 years, there



would be no capital gains tax on the money earned in the fund, minus the original investment. There is a sliding rate at seven and five years in the fund.

According to the Iowa Economic

Development Authority, the state has 239 areas that would qualify for the the program, but Gov. Kim Reynolds would only be able to submit 25%, or 60, of

those areas to the U.S. Department of Treasury to be eligible for the zone status.

Officials need to act quickly as a March 19 deadline is pressing.

Fort Madison Partners Executive Director Tim Gobble, who said he didn't even hear about the Opportunity Zone until late last week, is preparing the application for the governor to consider. He said this is another opportunity to access possible grant

"Obviously, it gives us another opportunity to look for potential investors," Gobble said Wednesday. "Whether we're looking at something for kids or some other venture where someone didn't have all the capital to build, they might have access to these funds. This is another opportunity for grant money or some type of funding to help get projects off the ground."

Gobble said he wasn't sure what the Governor's timeline was on getting the designated areas to the government, but he had to have his done by March

He said Fort Madison should have a shot at getting one of the 60 state designations because Lee County is still labeled as a stressed county and the state has seen, and been a part of, some of economic projects including the Iowa Fertilizer plant.

"They have a presence here and they want to build on that," he said.

The map below shows what parts of Fort Madison have been identified as qualified zone areas, as well as areas along Hwy 61 and Hwy 2 in North Lee County. Much of the Keokuk area is also a qualifying area.

Most of Fort Madison's east and west corridor are included in the zone, but there is a stretch that's not included north of Avenues E and D from 2nd to 18th Streets, as well as a six-block area south of Avenue H at 18th-20th Streets and a six-block by six-block area north of Avenue H from 18th to 24th Street.

cough syrups so...yeah, it's been a very busy winter."

A spokesperson for Hy-Vee's corporate office said the chain does not disclose the number of flu shots or other flu medications, but agreed that it had been a very busy

Nelson said Rashid Pharmacy administered 482 flu shots from Sept. 1 through March 6, but that was down from 600 that were given during the same time period last season. He said most pharmacies are offering the shots as are local health departments so the demand is being spread out more this year.

According to the Iowa State Hygenic Laboratory, the highest age group in influenza A detections was 64 and older with 447 or 48% of all detections. The next highest is 50-64 and 18-24 with both showing 12% of all detections. Age groups 5-17, 25-49 and 0-4 each accounted for 9% of all detections.

Influenza B had similar ratios with the exception of the 5-17 age group, which represented 24% of the detections. 64 and over was the highest with influenza B at 33% of all detections.

The number of schools that were reporting higher than 10% of school absenteeism was led by Region 6, which is the greater Quad Cities area with nine schools reporting in the week ending Feb. 17. That region reported 100 schools with 10% or greater absenteeism since Oct. 1.

According to data from the Fort Madison Community Hospital through the end of last week, there were





339 positive tests for Influenza A and 99 positives for Influenza B for 443 confirmed positives at the hospital. However, when the flu is as prevalent as it was this year, several providers don't consistently test for the virus and treat the symptoms, so that number could be lower than actual infections.

The hospital gave more than 2,000 influenza tests so far this season and have administered 3,010 vaccines, which includes 520 to FMCH employees/volunteers, which are required as a condition of employment unless otherwise indicated by a physician.

The Center for Disease Control released information that indicated the vaccine effectiveness against illness caused by the Influenza A and B virus was estimated to be 36 percent.

A breakdown shows vaccines to be 25% effective against A (H3N2), 67% effective against A (H1N1), and 42% effective against B strains.

Children aged six months to eight years had considerably higher effectiveness estimates, with 59% against influenza A and B overall and 51% against influenza A(H3N2).

The Iowa Department of Public Health is still recommending influenza vaccination for those who have not yet been vaccinated this season because influenza will likely continue to circulate for several more weeks.
