Local, state officials take aim at vaping

BY CHUCK VANDENBERG

FORT MADISON - Several efforts are underway to minimize the impact of vaping and e-cigarette usage in public and with underage users.

On Thursday, the Fort Madison Police Department issued a statement indicating they will be utilizing the Iowa Alcoholic Beverages Division's I-PLEDGE program to help keep tobacco and vaping products out of the hands of underage users.

Also on Thursday, the Lee County Board of Health signed off on a position statement that Lee County Health Department Administrator Michele Ross will


be presenting to Lee County Supervisors advocating for banning e-cigarettes and vaping instruments from all smoke-free areas in the county.

On Wednesday, Governor Kim Reynolds' office announced it was launching a new vaping awareness campaign aimed at informing teens about the realities

and consequences of vaping.

FMPD ends short standoff peacefully

20-year-old said he was just trying to keep mom from selling father's guns

FORT MADISON -Authorities were called to a home in the 3000 block of Avenue L on Thursday morning on a report of a man who had barricaded himself inside.

At approximately 8 a.m., Fort Madison police were dispatched to 3027 Avenue L where a subject with weapons and ammunition had barricaded himself in his home prompting authorities to cordon off the entire block, including some of Bus. 61.

After a short stand-off, the man agreed to come out and speak with law enforcement officers, and the scene was cleared at about 8:50 a.m. without incident.

Fort Madison Police Chief Mark Rohloff said Caleb M. Ford, 20, was

arrested and charged with a misdemeanor.

Rohloff said the incident didn't involve someone possibly using weapons in a dangerous fashion. The man had barricaded himself in the room with the guns because they were his

father's, who had passed away years ago.

"This was a low-level domestic call," Rohloff said. "He had barricaded himself in his room with his father's guns because his mom had said she wanted to sell them, but there was no threat to her or danger. He just didn't want her to have the guns.

"But we get a call like someone's barricaded in with guns that means something to us, so we set up a perimeter. But it de-escalated very quickly

LCHD, Governor all hit vaping issues this week

Iowa Department of Public Health.

"As a mom, grandma, and governor of Iowa, I believe we have an opportunity and a responsibility to combat the teen vaping epidemic," Gov. Reynolds wrote in the

"By increasing awareness and education on the known risks of vaping, we can help prevent our young people from setting themselves up for a lifelong addiction to nicotine. Working together as a team we can address the issue holistically, and effectively reach teens and parents with the right information."

According to figures from the IDPH vaping has more than doubled nationally since 2017. Today more than 1 in 4 high school aged youths vape and 1 in 9 high school seniors report vaping almost daily. IDPH also indicated that one vaping pod is the equivalent of smoking 20 cigarettes.

The county board of health, in its statement, indicated it supported a prohibition of the use of e-cigarettes in state and local smoke-free air regulations and policies in order to maintain current standards for clean indoor air and prevent involuntary exposure to nicotine and other aerosolized emissions.

The board is also encouraging strategies that reduce e-cigarette use among youth and restrict youth access to the products in retail settings. Those strategies, the board wrote, could include licensing retailers, implementing price policies and strategies to curb advertising and marketing that appeals to young people.

Fort Madison Police Chief Mark Rohloff said the I-PLEDGE places the emphasis on retailers to help curb the underage usage of the products.

"I-PLEDGE's retailer training is a great way for clerks to prepare themselves to refuse illegal tobacco, alternative nicotine, and vapor product sales," he said.

"The training also assists retailers to ensure they maintain a compliant and responsible establishment."

Rohloff said FMPD officers will be conducting compliance checks on local establishments as part of the program. Underage customers, under the supervision of law enforcement officials, will try to purchase tobacco and related products. Citations of up to \$500 for two or more offenses will be given on site for any violations.

"By partnering with Iowa Alcoholic Beverages Division, we hope to educate clerks and maintain a compliant retail environment in our community," Rohloff said.

"Moreover, we pledge to help keep tobacco, alternative nicotine and vapor products out of the hands of Iowa's youth."

I-PLEDGE to focus on underage vaping, tobacco

FM Police to bump effort at selling products to minors

FORT MADISON - The Fort Madison Police Department has taken a pledge to keep tobacco, alternative nicotine and vapor products out of the hands of Fort Madison youth.

Known as I-PLEDGE, the program is a partnership with the Iowa Alcoholic Beverages Division (ABD) to educate local retailers and to enforce Iowa's tobacco, alternative nicotine and vapor product laws. Since the program's inception in 2000, the statewide tobacco compliance rate has grown to 91%. By participating in the program, the police department has committed to do its part to increase the compliance rate even more this year.

I-PLEDGE places emphasis on retailer training. Clerks who successfully complete an online training course and then pass an exam will become I-PLEDGE certified. This allows a retail establishment to use an affirmative defense against a civil penalty if the certified clerk makes an illegal sale.

"I-PLEDGE's retailer training is a great way for clerks to prepare themselves to refuse illegal tobacco, alternative nicotine and vapor product sales," Chief Rohloff said.

"The training also assists retailers to ensure they maintain a compliant and responsible establishment."

Officers will also be conducting compliance checks on local establishments as part of the I-PLEDGE program. Underage customers, under the supervision of law enforcement officials, will enter establishments and attempt to buy tobacco, alternative nicotine and vapor products. Clerks who make the illegal sale will be cited on the spot.

Criminal penalties for selling tobacco, alternative nicotine and vapor products to a minor include a \$100 fine for a first offense, a \$250 fine for a second offense and a \$500 fine for third and subsequent offenses. However, handing out citations is not the intent for the I-PLEDGE program.

"By partnering with Iowa Alcoholic Beverages Division, we hope to educate clerks and maintain a compliant retail environment in our community," Rohloff said. "Moreover, we pledge to help keep tobacco, alternative nicotine and vapor products out of the hands of Iowa's

Local swimmers help BHS to win Tuesday

BURLINGTON - The Burlington Grayhound swim team won a triangular meet over United Township and Wethersfield, 104-67-17 Tuesday at the Burlington High

Three swimmers from Lee County led the boys 200 yard medley with a time of 1:52.31, a full 13.31 ahead of the pack. Logan Crank, Jacob Mohrfeld carried the first two legs and Wyatt Hellman anchored the relay with the fastest leg at 24.56.

Another Lee County swimmer in the shared program Niel Macomber was the second leg on the 3rd place team with a time of 2:06.29. Mohrfeld won the 200 yard individual medley going away with a 2:11.51, 26.41 a head of anyone else in the race.

Hellman took 1st in the 50-yard freestyle at 25.94, and 2nd in the 100-yard freestyle with a time of 56.48, 4.73 off the pace.

In the 200-yard freestyle relay Crank, Mohrfeld and Hellman were the first three legs of the first-place Grayhound team at 1:38.73. Taden Jameson carried the anchor for Burlington.

Other top local finishers were Crank with a first place in the 100-yard backstroke at 1:07.32, and Mohrfeld touching the wall first in the 100-yard breaststroke at 1:03.12.

Crank also carried the final leg of the Grayhound 2nd place team in the 400-yard freestyle relay at 4:12.99.







Most area waterways have unsafe thin ice

DES MOINES – The following is the weekly fishing report from the Iowa Department of Natural Resources for southeast Iowa. Most reports indicate thin skim ice is present and is unsafe for fishing.

Mississippi River Pool 19

Tailwater stage is 7 feet at Lock and Dam 18 and is falling. Flood stage is 10 feet at Lock and Dam 18. River stage is 12.39 feet at Burlington; flood stage is 15 feet. River stage is 526.8 feet at Fort Madison; flood stage is 528 feet. We have not received any fishing report information for this pool.

Tailwater stages have been falling this past week. Main channel water temperature is around 32 degrees. Unsafe ice conditions. If you have questions on fishing Pools 16-19 contact the Fairport Fish Hatchery at 563-263-5062.

Lake Belva Deer

Open water and unsafe thin ice.

Lake Darling

Most of the lake froze over Dec. 11. Still some open water. Ice thin and unsafe.

Lake Darling District Farm Ponds

Most of them froze over Dec. 10. Unsafe ice thickness.

Lost Grove Lake

A mix of open water and very thin ice.

Skunk River (Rose Hill to Coppock)

Ice has started to form on the river; chunks were floating on downstream Dec. 12.

Coralville Reservoir

Skim ice formed over most of the lake this week. The lake level will be lowered 3+ feet to winter pool over the next week; ice conditions will be unstable.

Diamond Lake

The lake is partially covered in skim ice.

Iowa Lake (Iowa Co.)

Skim ice formed over most of the lake this week.

Lake Macbride

Skim ice formed over most of the lake this week.

Pleasant Creek Lake

Skim ice formed over most of the lake this week.

Skim ice has formed over the backwaters, but is still unsafe. The boat ramp in Pinicon Ridge is closed for the winter.

Most lakes/ponds now have skim ice; there is no safe ice in this area. For more information, contact the Lake Macbride Fisheries Station at 319-624-3615.

Lake Miami

Skim ice is forming overnight when cold enough, making fishing difficult.

Lake Wapello

Skim ice is forming at night, making fishing difficult.

Ottumwa Park Pond South

Trout were stocked on Oct. 25th. The pond is covered in skim ice, making fishing difficult. You need a valid fishing license (age 16 and older) and pay the trout fee to fish for or possess trout.

Rathbun Reservoir

The current lake level is 905.37 msl. Normal operating elevation is 904.0 msl. Lake Rathbun has zebra mussels, so make sure to properly drain, clean, and dry equipment before transporting to another water body. Most docks have been pulled out for the season and most campgrounds are closed. The bays and coves will start to be covered with skim ice, making fishing difficult.

Red Haw Lake

Skim ice is forming overnight, making fishing difficult.

There has been very little angler activity in the last week. The district includes Appanoose, Davis, Lucas, Mahaska, Monroe, Wapello, Wayne and Van Buren counties. Contact the Rathbun Fish Hatchery at 641-647-2406 with questions about fishing in south central Iowa.

and he came out without incident."

Police stood armed at several locations in the alley and around the home prior to Ford coming out.

Rohloff said there was some pushing and shoving and that's what prompted the charges. Ford was taken to Lee County Jail.

Officials at Richardson Elementary School three blocks west of the scene were notified of the incident and the school was placed on a perimeter lockdown until the scene was cleared.

Fort Madison Police, Lee County Sheriff's deputies and Fort Madison Fire & Rescue all responded to the incident.
