# FM has \$50K unclaimed Powerball ticket

Ticket was sold June 6 at Casey's on east end of town **BY CHUCK VANDENBERG** PCC EDITOR

FORT MADISON - Dig deep in your wallets, look under the car seats, check the sofas. Someone purchased a \$50,000 winning Powerball ticket in Fort Madison and it's still unclaimed.

According to Mary Neubauer, Vice President for External Relations with Iowa Lottery, the ticket was purchased for the June 10th Powerball drawing at the East end Caseys at 1208 Avenue H.

"It's been more than two months now that that ticket has been sitting out there unclaimed," Neubauer said. 'But don't worry, there is still plenty of time to claim the prize."

She said Powerball tickets in Iowa expire 365 days after the draw day. If that day were to fall on a holiday or a weekend, their would be additional time added. She said this particular ticket would expire on June 11, 2018.

"A couple of months is little unusual for a prize that

"It was pretty large bang and shook the windows so I ran outside and I heard a jet overhead," Cirinna said. "We get these things about once a year or so and in

the past I've called around to Scott Air Force Base (Illinois) and other places and they always say 'We don't know of anything, so who knows."

He said he didn't call around to bases this time, but also said the area is in an active meteor shower and he's heard of occurrences where meteors, if they get inside the atmosphere, can create sonic booms, but he's betting it was a military plane.

"That's the only explanation I can give you, but I have heard of meteors causing booms like that, but I'd bet it was a jet."

"They're not supposed to fly over heavily populated areas, but I don't know how firmly they stick to those guidelines." he said.

## Task forces continues busy August with another Keokuk bust

Third narcotics bust in the past five days

BY PCC STAFF KEOKUK - The Lee County Narcotics Task Force reports the arrest of a Keokuk, Iowa man on misdemeanor drug charges.

It's the task force's third bust in less than a week in the Keokuk area.

David Eugene Thomas, 57, of 923 South 14th Street, Keokuk, Iowa was arrested on August 14th,

2017 at the Keokuk Police Department on misdemeanor drug charges. Thomas is charged with possession of marijuana, a serious misdemeanor, and maintaining a drug house, an aggravat ed misdemeanor. If convicted, Thomas faces up to 3 years in a state correctional facility.

The arrest of Thomas stems from an investigation by the Lee County Narcotics Task Force into allegations that he was involved in the use of illegal drugs in the Lee County area. A search warrant was served in connection to this investigation and items that support the charges were discovered.

The Lee County Attorney's Office, Keokuk Police Department, Iowa Division of Narcotics Enforcement, and the Lee County Sheriff's Office assisted the Lee County Narcotics Task Force in this investigation. The defendant is presumed innocent until and un-

that would cost less, but I can't speak to that. So there are some significant costs associated with it but right now our budget doesn't include that \$200,000 study at this time."

She said the prison is currently spending \$1,000 per day in utility costs inside the secure perimeter so a project like this would help the

prison with it's resources. Bowker said the infrastructure is in place that could be used for a project like this.

"It's a decent space with some basic stuff in there that you may need. We did talk about parking, there is a separate what we used to call a wagon gate where they used to roll in the old galllows, that would probably be

the door that would have to be modified for whatever program you would use. That would be the entrance and somehow parking would have to take place in there," she said.

Lee County Economic Development Chief **Operating Officer Dennis** Fraise, said the visit was just part of the overall research on the possibility of a Lee County regional education center. The LCEDG has taken a facilitating role with the project.

The center would be a facility for high school and adult education trade course and continuing education courses. The project would require the collaboration of industries, business and educational centers including county high school and Southeastern Community College.

"There some plusses. It has the garage doors and

some of the things that would be good, but can you overcome the stigma. That's the psychology aspect of it."

Fraise said the prison, if and when the \$200,000 study was completed and showed some feasibility, would probably be eligible for some state and federal grants to offset some of the costs of the renovations, but

he said more research would need to be done to see if that made financial sense.

"There's a possibility of that. No one is suggesting it's a perfect scenarior, but it's part of our group's due diligence. We don't want to leave any stone unturned. Let's go look at it. Let's get a cost estimate. It's just part of the process."

He said the original timeline was to have something up and running by the 2019 school year.

"But that's just us sticking our finger in the wind and not knowing things - like how to pay for it."

The group was scheduled to also tour the former Midwest Academy near Keokuk, but that tour was postponed until a later date.

size," she said. "That's a significant amount of money and that ticket is usually claimed quickly. But maybe this person is doing the right thing and getting their ducks in a row."

She reminded all players to double check their tickets because some players check jackpots and don't look for other winning combinations like this one. This winning ticket matched four of the first five winning numbers and the powerball.

"The longer it sits out there, the more we get worried it will get lost or thrown away."

Winning tickets of this size can be claimed at any Iowa Lottery office in the state with the closest being Cedar Rapids. Neubauer said lottery officials write a check that day for the winning amount.
