P.O.R.T on tap for City Council meeting

Council also to consider incentive package for hotel

FORT MADISON - The second and third phases of the Fort Madison recreational trail will be in front of the city council on Tuesday evening.

At their regular meeting Tuesday night at 5:30, the council will vote on a resolution awarding construction of Phase II to Jones Contracting of West Point, Iowa in the amount of \$147,777. The next phase will be a cement path built con-

necting the first path near Ivanhoe Park with 48th street along an easement just sold to the city by the Fort Madison Community School district.

The path will be an east-west run from the current path to 48th Street. Future plans, or Phase III, calls for this path to be connected to a trail head right across from Avenue L at 48th

Street. The path will run west 2,300 feet to the current Fort Madison Community Hospital's outdoor exercise path.

The Council will also be voting on a resolution to apply for an Iowa Department of Transportation TAP (Transportation Alternative Program) grant that would provide up to 80 percent of the cost of Phase III in reimburse-



ment funds if the city kicks in 20% of the cost of the project.

Phase 1 of the Promot-

Empty Nesting is driving me crazy

 \mathbf{I} n the fall of 2011 I had an emotional breakdown. I don't cry very much as an adult, but I sobbed like a baby filling my tank with gas outside of the University of Central Florida, I think it was Hess station. I remem-

ber facing east, tears running down my face, and in a full bodied cry as I just dropped off my oldest daughter at college and was heading back to Iowa.

This was the same girl that made me cry when she was eating a french fry, I think she was, like, six at the time, and ate too far down forgetting to move her



fingers back in time. I looked over to see huge crocodile tears running down her face.

"What's wrong, honey."

"I bit my finger eating my french fry," she said breaking into a full cry. I got that nervy feeling in my stomach you get just before you tear up. It was heartbreaking. Dad hadn't taught her the proper way to eat a french fry.

Now my youngest is skipping her senior year at FMHS and going on to college as part of an academy that brings about a dozen students to the University of Iowa. She's earned it and I couldn't be more proud of a child. I worry about the social implications of skipping your senior year of high school to go off to college, but I'm comforted that the academy is filled with two grades of students just like her ready to begin the pro-

Keokuk man busted with drugs, a firearm

The Lee County Narcotics Task Force reports the arrest of a Keokuk, Iowa man on felony and misdemeanor drug charges.

Isaac Isaiah Seay, 34, of 1209 Blondeau Street, Keokuk, Iowa was arrested on June 10th, 2017 in the 700 block of Ridge Street in Keokuk on felony and misdemeanor drug charges. Seay is charged with Possession of Marijuana with the Intent to Deliver in Possession of a Firearm, a class D felony with an enhancement,

Drug Tax Stamp Violation, a class D felony, Possession of a Controlled Substance (Marijuana), a serious misdemeanor, and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, a simple misdemeanor. If convicted, Seay faces up to 16 years and 30 days in a state correctional facility.

The arrest of Seav stems from a traffic stop conducted by an officer with the Keokuk Police Department. During the course of the traffic stop, items that support

ing Outdoor Recreational Trails project is nearing completion according to committee chairwoman Rachel Benda.

"Things are really moving along well," she said. "We're finishing up the added touches on Phase 1 including lighting, fencing, benches, etc. Phase II should be breaking ground soon. Now we're seeking TAP money for Phase III."

According to City Manager David Varley, Phase II of the project should begin and be completed before the end of the summer if everything goes according to plans.

The council will also be voting to hold a public

hearing on an incentive offer to Boulders Inn & Suites as part of the new construction at the hotel.

The city gave the company about \$400,000 in incentives when the first section of the hotel was built in 2014 under an urban development agreement with the city. Varley said the hotel came back to the city when they executed plans for the 38-room addition.

"They came to the city again and we put together another incentive package for them," Varley said. "They wanted \$600,000, \$300,000 up front and then the \$300,000 rebate on property taxes on the new addition. We thought that was a little high. The package will be the same as the first package except we're recommending the council give them \$250,000 up front and \$250,00 capped on property tax rebates over six years."

Under the initial agreement, when the hotel was first built, the city paid \$200,000 up front in a forgivable loan and then rebated the lesser of \$200,000 or 80% of the increased tax on the property valuation over five years. The new agreement proposes \$250,000 up front and then a rebate of the lesser of \$250,000 or 80% of the increased tax over six years.

In other action, the council;

- will consider a support resolution for the reconstruction and rehabilitation of 1,000 feet of trail surface at Rodeo Park.
- will consider a resolution authorizing \$110,000 in seal coating projects for the city with W. L. Miller Company of Hamilton, Ill.
- will consider a resolution approving a contract for transportation services between the city and Southeast Iowa Regional Planning Commission.
- will consider a 2nd Amendment to the city's Urban Renewal Program.

who gets my crazy sense of humor, lost on most, and a large home with no children.

Our cats have become the kids' surrogates. And if you don't believe me, I offer you this.

I was outside watering my dying perennials Wednesday (I'll blame it on the heat). I leave the door open because our two cats like to come outside and roll around on the pitted concrete patio. It's warm and feels good on their hides. After about two minutes of watering I hear some panicked chirping. I ignored it for a couple seconds because birds are crazy creatures. But then I turned and see

the boy, Bailey, hunkered down on the brick step as several robins dive bomb him.

"Hey, whatya think you're doing," I yelled over at the crazed robins with their feathers all poofed out. I start to walk over as Bailey belly crawls toward the house, looking around, still under attack.

But he sees me coming and looks at me, "Dad what the hell?" is what I imagine from the look on his face.

I actually say out loud, "You OK, buddy?" He stops and turns around now feeling a little more confident with his wing

"I can grab a snow

shovel or something...?" yep, actually said that to the cat.

The enemy barnstorming robins flitter up to the top of the fence and look at me and the boy. Angry birds, both of them. Both with ticked off looks in their eyes. I'm a little intimidated.

In the meantime, I get this crazy job to keep me from going into battle with my cat on the neighborhood vermin.



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
