ISP officer attacked Wednesday

Union leader demands meeting with DOC to discuss safety

FORT MADISON - The president of the union representing staff at the Iowa State Penitentiary is calling on ISP and Iowa Department of Corrections officials to address safety issues after Wednesday morning's attack on a correctional officer.

The attack is the second on an officer in the last five days and has resulted in lockdowns at the facility. ISP officials confirmed today the officer was attacked this morning with two homemade weapons by offender



Keith Piper, who is serving a 45-year sentence out of Jasper County for being a habitual offender.

The ISP was placed on lockdown/ restricted movement after a staff member was beginning an escort when the offender struck the officer multiple times

with a weapon. The staff member, with

assistance from responding staff, were able to subdue the offender.

The officer was initially sent via ambulance to Fort Madison Community Hospital, but was then transported via ambulance to the University of Iowa Hospitals in Iowa City.

IDOC officials released an updated statement Wednesday afternoon saying the C.O., whose name has not been released, is in stable condition at University of Iowa Hospitals.

"Iowa State Penitentiary continues to review and investigate this incident. Any incident of this nature is considered critical. Staff safety is the highest priority as the investigation into this matter continues. The department will continue to attend to the needs of the injured officers, of both today's incident and the incident on Saturday, and commends all responding staff for their prompt and excellent response to protect fellow officers and prevent any further harm," according to a release from IDOC officials Wednesday.

AFSCME Council 61 President Danny Homan issued the following statement regarding the attack.

"This morning, a Correctional Officer at the Iowa State Penitentiary was stabbed five times by an inmate




SCC to branch out thanks to Alliant Energy

WEST BURLINGTON – Volunteers will plant 56 trees at Southeastern Community College's West Burlington Campus at 9 a.m. on Saturday. The trees were purchased through a \$10,000 grant from Alliant Energy and Trees Forever's Branching Out partnership. This project is one of more than 30 Branching Out tree-plantings taking place across the state this fall.

The project is being done in conjunction with SCC's Building the Dream campus expansion initiative and coincides with the construction of the new Hall of Sciences.

These new trees will do more than just provide a windbreak and shade for our buildings," says SCC President Dr. Michael Ash. "They're intended to serve as a a living lab for our agriculture students and give life to our campus landscape."

College organizers have assembled a small army of volunteers to help with the project including staff, students, local officials, participants in SCC's Choosing Healthy Alternatives to Delinquency (CHAD) program, as well as Alliant En-



The planting project will start at 9:00 a.m.. Volunteers will meet in the new parking lot next to the Health Professions Center (accessible via SCC's Gear Avenue entrance).

In addition to providing trees for shade and beautification, Trees Forever Field Coordinator Emily Swihart says the collaboratively-funded grant program is a great way to help people understand how they can help grow and protect an urban forest.

"When you plant a tree, you save energy, improve air quality, and reduce storm water runoff." Swihart explains. "The entire community benefits when you plant even a single tree."

In case of inclement weather, the planting will be rescheduled to October 23 at 1 p.m.



Hounds winning season on line Friday night

FORT MADISON - The Bloodhound football team will put their winning season on the line Friday night with a tough matchup against 7-1 Washington.

The Demons have been without starting quarterback Ryan Reighard for most of the season, but their only loss was to district powerhouse Solon, a 40-0 setback. The Demons have a few lopsided wins to their credit as well including a 73-0 bombing of West Burlington two weeks ago. But Reighard could see some action at quarterback as Washington gears up for the playoffs.

Washington sophomore Luke Turner is having a good season behind center completing 60 of 100 passes for 905 yards and nine touchdowns against four interceptions. Turner also leads the Demons on the ground with 719 yards rushing.

But Fort Madison has the district's top rusher in yards with Alex Gully at 1,122 yards on the ground. He also has 15 touchdowns, including five last week in a 48-24 win over Keokuk on the road, just one behind Oskaloosa quarterback Seth Howard with 16 rushing scores.

Fort Madison Head Coach Tony Shiffman said Washington will most likely come out in a spread offense and try to move the ball around. However, the Demons should get senior Reighard back under center. Reighard broke his forearm early in the season and has been playing defense but not playing on the other side of the line.

"They're a very good football team. They're a big, physical football team and well-coached and hit the weight room," Shiffman said.

He said his Bloodhounds again are going to go on the field with a mindset of having fun, but thinking about their final game.

"It's their legacy," he said. "It's how they're remembered. Ten years down the road people are going to

remember a lot of games, but they'll remember if you come out and beat a top 10 team like Washington."

He said the Demons will come out in a spread offense and test the Hounds' speed and corners.

"They're spread. They'll get in some two and three wide stuff, but they like to run the power and a power read game and they have a good physical line so they can get out and run, too," Shiffman said.

The Hounds were a bit banged up last week with starting linebacker Diego Lozano out with a shoulder injury, Danen Settles, who has been having a decent season on the line also didn't play last week.

"We're a little banged up right now and it's hit or miss on who's practicing, but they don't want to get embarrassed. I'm more worried about going out and just executing our offense. We're just gonna go out and play and see what happens.

The Hounds are 4-4 on the season and Shiffman said he's a bit frustrated by that record, but also realizes that the Hounds have taken some important strides this year.

"I'm kind of indifferent right now," Shiffman said of this being the last game of the season. "I'm a bit frustrated that we're 4-4 and I think we should be 6-2. It is what it is, but we've done leaps and bounds better than previous years."

He said the team's mantra "brick-by-brick" is taking hold and he said that has had a big impact on the successes the team did have this year.

"That's not going to be something we get rid of either. That's been our battle cry and we're going to keep putting those bricks together, in the weight room, recruiting in the hallways - it's a big part of what we do and we're going to keep using that."

Shance Redd-Donald, despite missing the Solon game three weeks ago, is still leading the district in receiving with 688 yards and nine touchdowns. Washington's Jaivonn Willis is right behind Redd-Donald with 593 yards and seven touchdowns. The Demons' Dalton Myers is fifth in the district with 319 yards and three TDs. Fort Madison's Lorenzo Riles II has 213 yards and one touchdown.

Junior Tristin Westphal-Edwards and senior Tanner Murphy have combined for close to 100 tackles on the year to lead the Demons. Lozano and junior Sam Hayes lead FMHS with a combined 74 tackles.



Randolph says delays hinder city's ability to bid work

were being very helpful as the city worked to reduce some of the costs associated with operating and maintaining the depot at the new location, but was cautious about saying anything specific, simply because he doesn't have a working document in front him.

"Until I see something in my hand, in writing, and we can say, 'Hey, you know what, this looks pretty good,' and we can present it - I just don't want to say too much."

Randolph said he's been working with Amtrak railroad personnel on certain costs he thought were maybe a bit high to make the operation a bit easier on the city's budget.

"I would just say that the numbers that we were getting on the insurance, we're trying to massage that number to make it more economical for us to go forward. We've looked at that, we've looked at other communities and how they are doing it, just to get a handle on why the costs are so high for us and how other communities are dealing with that."

Councilman Chris Greenwald said once the city has the agreement in hand he's going to push for the approval.

"Whether its more palpable or not, once we have that agreement in our hands, we'll be fighting to get it passed," Greenwald said.

Randolph said he's very pleased with the efforts being put forth by the railroad's personnel in helping Fort Madison get to an agreement.

"Amtrak has been very understanding of our position on that and we've been working with risk management personnel and they're trying to work to come to a common understanding with us and we're seeing some positive movement there. That's what we're hoping for."

He said he does have a concern, however, about the process being incomplete because it pushes back the process to get the Iowa Department of Transportation on board and get bids out for construction of the platform.

"My concern is that the DOT is waiting for signed agreements and, until they get it, nothing is happen-

ing. While this continues to happen, we keep getting bumped on the bid let. If we keep pushing that back we're gonna be late summer or fall before we get going on construction," Randolph said.

Randolph reached out to the CEO of Amtrak earlier this year about the project and the fact that it had fallen dead with the Amtrak officials. He said the CEO responded with an email that said they were going to get the project done and assigned a new person to the project.

At a meeting earlier this summer City Manager David Varley said the project could cost the city up to \$50,000 per year to run the depot, but Randolph said at that meeting he thought those numbers were high, but would continue to work with Amtrak to see if some of those costs could be reduced.

"Again, this person with Amtrak is a really good guy. It's been a fluid process and we get these numbers and we kind of peeled through them line by line and said, 'we don't know why you'd charge us this and this'. I think David's numbers were too high, but I needed some figures to back that up. I didn't just want to say that."

wielding two ten-inch shanks. The officer has been transferred to the University of Iowa Hospital, where he is receiving medical treatment. This incident comes on the heels of another assault against a Correctional Officer that took place on Saturday. In that incident, the inmate involved was escorted by the Correctional Officer who was stabbed this morning. Both assaults were carried out by inmates associated with white supremacist gangs.

Homan said the AFSCME has been trying to bring attention to a lack of staffing at the local prison.

"We have been sounding the alarm on the increased frequency of brutal assaults within our correctional facilities with absolutely zero change taking place. Our thoughts are with the two Correctional Officers who were the victims of the Department of Correction's inaction. Thoughts only go so far; I hope their assaults will be taken seriously and acted upon with the urgency they deserve. We are demanding that the Department of Corrections meet with us to discuss this health and safety crisis before someone gets killed."
