Some FMHS seniors graduation at risk

Slater says about 40 students are missing requirement

FORT MADISON - With less than two weeks before graduation ceremonies, approximately 40 seniors at FMHS have yet to meet their community volunteer service hours.

At Monday's regular meeting of the Fort Madison

School Board, board president Timm Lamb said FMHS Principal Greg Smith had indicated that there were some issues with seniors getting the hours complete. All students are required to perform 10 hours of community service during their time at FMHS. Starting with next year's incoming freshmen, that requirement will be bumped to 20 hours of service.

" I just spoke with Greg today and he said there are still quite a few people who have not completed their service requirements...a lot," said Board President Timm Lamb. "They're going to hold to the fact and they aren't going to graduate." They've had a lot of opportunities and they just aren't taking advantage of them. I think some of them think it's not going to happen."

Board member Gayla Young asked what the contingency was for the students that didn't get the hours completed. Lamb said they won't go across the stage at graduation on May 27th. He said as soon as the students complete their volunteer service hours they will get their diploma, but they won't be able to go across the stage with their classmates. But he reiterated that

Boost kids graduate Monday

FORT MADISON -The inaugural year of the Bloodhound Boost program was a rousing success as more than 15 fourth and fifth grade students graduated Monday evening at the Elliott Test Kitchen.

Spurred by the success of the Test Kitchen's high school programming aimed at increasing ACT performance among local students, Fort Madison school officials put together a group to create a curriculum based on food and study to gauge interest from a younger group of students. "I've put about \$1.6 million into the purchase and renovations of the hotel," he said. "The front lobby has all new tiles and the breakfast area has all been remodeled. The outside foundation was also all redone last fall."

He said the hotel will still feature a morning breakfast with hot and cold offerings from 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. including eggs, sausage, biscuits, and waffles among other things.

Kumar said he's heard a lot about the Tri-State Rodeo and is looking forward to it again this year, but innocently said he just doesn't know much about rodeos, other than he's booked full for this year's event.

they won't receive their diploma or graduate until the volunteer service hours requirement is met.

"Greg was telling me today what he and Patrick (Lamb, assistant principal) have put together. They've gone way over board to help get this done," Lamb said.

District Superintendent Erin Slater confirmed after the meeting that Smith had told her it was about 40 students who have yet to complete the service.

In other action, the board passed several policy revisions including a provision that would provide an alternative meal for any student whose lunch account is more than \$10 delinquent. Students would be allowed to pay cash for lunch while in the delinquent stage, but no charges would be allowed until the account is brought current.

The meal would include a choice of fruit, vegetable, and milk.

Slater said the Iowa Association of School Boards is requiring a policy to be on the books by July 1. The district had incurred shortages of close to \$60,000 in the past for unpaid lunch accounts.



Hernandez and Seaney still have tennis action left as they play in the state doubles tournament May 26 - 27 at Burns Park in Waterloo.





in Massachusetts, and they said forget about the strategies and all that stuff you do. The two biggest indicators of success later in life is, one, if you can delay gratification and, two, if you eat as a family in a family style setting.

Zirkel said it's a perfect setting to have Kumar Wickramasingha, the Test Kitchen founder, creating a space for students to study, learn to cook, and have a good meal in the after-school study environment.

"We are so lucky to have Kumar and his expertise, he bring in chefs and he covers that whole food part of it. The relationship you can build with kids across the table versus at a desk is very compelling."

The teachers in the program, including Amy Diewold and Misty Koser from the middle school, and Debora Hentzel from Fort Madison High School, were integral in building the curriculum.
