KEOKUK - Now that the Keokuk City Council has identified the Connection Bank and Insurance Buildings on Main Street as the next home for the city offices, the City Hall Committee is now faced with the task of narrowing down eight proposals that have been submitted tor architectural services.

City Administrator Cole O'Donnell laid out the goal for the City Hall Committee when they meet Thursday night at the Pilot Grove Savings Bank Suite on Main Street that is currently serving as the temporary Keokuk

Eight total proposals were submitted to the City of Keokuk for architectural services after the Connection Bank and Insurances Buildings located at 501 and 515 Main Street, respectively, were selected to become the

Man hospitalized in FM collision Thursday

FORT MADISON – An afternoon accident involving a motorcycle and vehicle has sent one man to the hospital in stable condition.

According to Lee County Sheriff's deputy Craig Burch, a motorcycle driven by a male, who's name and age was not released, was headed southbound on 20th Street near Avenue I, when a vehicle came out of the alley east bound south of Avenue I and struck the motorcycle.

The motorcycle came to rest in the right hand lane, and the driver was being attended to by emergency crews from Fort Madison Fire Department and Lee County EMS on the curb of the east side of the road.

"The injured party was sent to the hospital with unknown injuries at this time," Burch said.

He said the accident remains under investigation and it is unclear if charges will be filed.

Fort Madison Police and Lee County Sheriff, as well as several witnesses, assisted at the scene.

Keokuk looking to beef up services with new city hall

next city hall locations. O'Donnell explained exactly what those prospective services will include.

"Well what they're gonna do first of all is they're gonna go in and take a look at the infrastructure. See if there are any upgrades or changes that need to be made in order to meet our needs or our code. They'll also help design the modifications to the space to meet our workflow needs," O'Donnell said.

Once an architectural

firm is selected, that company will then also help out with designing the new layout of the City Hall, according to O'Donnell.

"So then they will design everything, draw up the plans and specs, work through the bid process, and then also manage the construction phase once we accept the bids."

The city staff has also been very integral in defining the needs for the new city hall by letting management know certain features that have been needed at city hall in the past but weren't available.

"So the staff came up with ideas like, 'We need a vault. We need space for a public works lab'. So we decided to look at these buildings and decide how they can meet our needs," he said.

The goal, as stated earlier by O'Donnell is to narrow down the list of eight companies to a manageable number of firms that can then be asked to come in to the next City Hall Commission meeting to present their ideas and credentials to the committee.

"At the next meeting, the selected companies will present to the committee and explain some of the similar projects that they've done in the past. But they'll also present their ideas for how this space can be used to accommodate our needs," O'Donnell said.

The Keokuk City Hall Committee meets tonight at 5:30PM from the Pilot Grove Savings Bank building at 601 Main Street.



Reichelt named 1st team All-Conference

The 2019 Southeast Conference all-conference teams have been released and Fort Madison and Keokuk were well represented across the board.

Junior Brandon Reichelt was named first team all-conference as a designated hitter. With a minimum of at least five at bats, Reichelt led the Bloodhounds in batting average at .339, on base percentage at .494 and a slugging percentage at .500. He also led the team with 24 RBIs, tied for the team lead with one home run and was second on the team in doubles.

Senior Dayne Cordray was named second team all-conference for his phenomenal season on the mound. Cordray tossed a team-high 58.1 innings and finished the season with an overall record of 5-3.

Cordray led the Bloodhounds' starting pitchers in nearly every statistical category, finishing 2019 with 36 strikeouts, an ERA of 2.40 and a WHIP of 1.509.

Vasin Thurman was named second team all-conference as well for his play at first base. Thurman batted .250, was second on the team with 19 RBIs, second on the team in walks with 24 and led the team in triples with two. Thurman also was tied for third on the Fort Madison roster with 21 hits on the season. He finished the season with an OBP of .432 and a slugging percentage of .321.

Keokuk's Senior Dalton Boecker was named second team all-conference as a catcher, leading Keokuk in nearly every statistical category. Boecker finished the season with a batting average of .392, an OBP of .495 and a slugging percentage of .608. Boecker collected 31 hits, two of which were home runs. He also knocked in

12 RBI, 13 runs and 15 bases on balls.

Senior Jordan Gerdes was named all-conference honorable mention, finishing the season with an average of .273, an OBP of .445 and a slugging percentage of .352. Gerdes also grabbed 17 RBI and led the Bloodhounds in hit by pitches with 12. Jason Thurman was also named honorable mention with a season average of .255, an OBP of .418 and a slugging percentage of .309. Thurman also tied for third on the team with 18 RBI

Freshman Jordan Sisk and Senior Gavin Walker were also named honorable mention for Keokuk.

Fort Madison's Dayne Cordray, Austin Heidbreder, Jordyn Gerdes, Logan Rashid, Brandon Reichelt, Jace Burgher and Reed Fehseke were all named to the academic all-conference squad along with Keokuk's Gavin

Bass fishing heating up at local waterways

The following is the weekly Iowa Department of Natural Resources weekly fishing report for the week ending Wednesday, July 31, 2019 for southeast Iowa.

Iowa River (Columbus Junction to Mississippi River)

The Iowa River is rising slowly due to some heavy rains upstream on both the Iowa and Cedarn rivers; the rise will only be by a few inches. Channel Catfish – Fair: Try stink bait or grass frogs this time of year. Flathead Catfish – Fair: Flatheads are mostly done spawning and are starting to get back on the feed.

Lake Darling

The water has cooled off a bit, but still remains in the low 80's. Angler numbers are starting to rebound with the cooler weather. Largemouth Bass – Fair: Bass are out around the rock piles and brush piles in 6-10 feet of water coming in shallower early in the morning before it gets hot. Bluegill – Fair: Most bluegills have moved off into deeper water (8-10 feet) around the rock piles and brush piles. Channel Catfish – Fair: Catfish have wrapped up the spawn. Try drift fishing with cut bait along the old creek channel in the lake. Black Crappie – Fair: Slow drift or troll over the habitat in 10 to 12 feet of water. Early morning or late evening is best.

Lost Grove Lake

Water temperature is holding in the low 80's. Starting to see more anglers with the nicer weather. Largemouth Bass – Good: Anglers continue to catch bass; work them out along the edges of the weed beds and around the trees and brush piles in 4-6 feet of water using soft plastics. Black Crappie – Good: Anglers continue to pick up crappies out around edges of the flooded timber in 8 to 10 feet of water. Try vertical jigging or using a slip bobber and minnow. Bluegill – Fair: The hot weather has put a quick end to the spawn. Look for the bluegills around the deeper habitat now. Channel Catfish – Fair: The spawn is mostly over. Start working the areas below the flow under the causeway and along the creek channel.

Skunk River (Coppock to Mississippi River)

There is a little bump in the river level moving through due to some heavy rains upstream, but it won't last long. Channel Catfish – Fair: Some decent catfish have been working the flats around the sandbars at night. This is also the time of the year to collect a few grass frogs for bait.





chose Fort Madison as their new home!"

After growing up the small Michigan town of Clare, which see describes as similar to Fort Madison, but on a smaller scale, Heyland said she's happy to begin practicing with families in rural Iowa.

"It was a small agriculture town, one high school and an everybody-knows-everybody kind of town," she said. "Fort Madison is very similar to the town I grew up in with the small-town pace."

Her dental career came at kind of a 90-degree turn after she had moved to Arizona. Her degree from Michigan State was a four-year interior design degree, which Heyland said she dabbled in before deciding to go into the health care field.

"It was kind of an interesting avenue into interior design, but then I decided to take a different route and pursue dentistry. I moved out to Glendale and took a couple course and got into dental school at Midwestern University."

Midwestern is a health care specialty university with campuses in Glendale, Ariz., and Downer's

Heyland worked for a while in Arizona before making the decision to pursue the dental degree, a degree her father held as well. She said much of her family has health-care related careers.

"My dad's a dentist so it's always kind of been in the realm of possibility for me. That work environment and working with people had me wanting to go into health care. My sister's in health care, a lot of my family's in health care," she said.

"I like families, I like that part of the draw to dentistry, to work with families. I watched my dad practice with generations of families and that's part of the excitement."

Heyland said dentistry has improved in many ways since she was a child watching her father's career.

"I think dentistry has come a long way in that a lot of people didn't like going to dentist, but we've become more savvy and there's better flow and streamlining to visits.," she said. "You hear the horror stories about the pain people used to go through, but now you hear, "Oh, that wasn't so bad", and that's refreshing to hear."

Technological upgrades have also given the profession a better feel. Heyland said going to the dentist is much more inviting and calming than past genera-

"There are a lot of lasers now that eliminate the need for needles, which people say is the worst part," she said.

"In school we did a lot of same-day crowns, which is becoming more prevalent and people are interested in that more and more - it's one less trip to the dentist. There's lasers, there's computers, there's 3D - and people relate more to the technology of today."

But she said corporate driven dental practices don't have the same feel as the locally owned practices.
