Chase ends in rollover

SUSPECT HURT: Henry County, state patrol chase motorist into Lee County at high speeds

LEE COUNTY – One man was injured and sent to Henry County Health Center following a vehicle rollover that resulted from a high speed pursuit into Lee County.

The vehicle was heading southbound on Hwy 218 out of Henry County into Lee County when Lee County deputies deployed stop sticks just north of 190th Street.

At several points, the chase entered the northbound lane of 218 heading

Group looks for daycare support

GRANT OPTIONS: Governor's Child Care business grant aims to build capacity

LEE COUNTY – A consortium of child care advocates in Lee County is looking for support for several grants in the works to help increase the number of day care slots in Lee County.

Breanna Kramer-Riesberg, a development specialist and the Community Outreach and Development Project Coordinator for the Lee County Health Department, said a meeting was held last week between child care providers and local business and industry partners to discuss a new child care incentive grant offered through the state.

"We are meeting again next week and are welcoming additional providers and businesses to join," Kramer-Riesberg said.

Governor Reynolds announced a new \$25 million Child Care Business Incentive Grant Program on May 31, targeted at helping employers offer or expand child care options as a benefit to their employees. The program is part of the Future Ready Iowa initiative.

A total of \$20 million will be awarded to support local infrastructure investments to build or expand child care capacity. An additional \$5 million will be used to support arrangements between employers and child care facilities to expand and reserve child care slots.

Kramer-Riesberg said the group is looking at applying for two grants. One would help with infrastructure costs, while the second would help with the costs of reserving a slot at a county child care center.

But she said discussion at the meeting also focused on possibly generating financial support to build a child care center or help expand current centers to increase the number of slots available.

Navigator sets up more meetings on CO2 pipeline

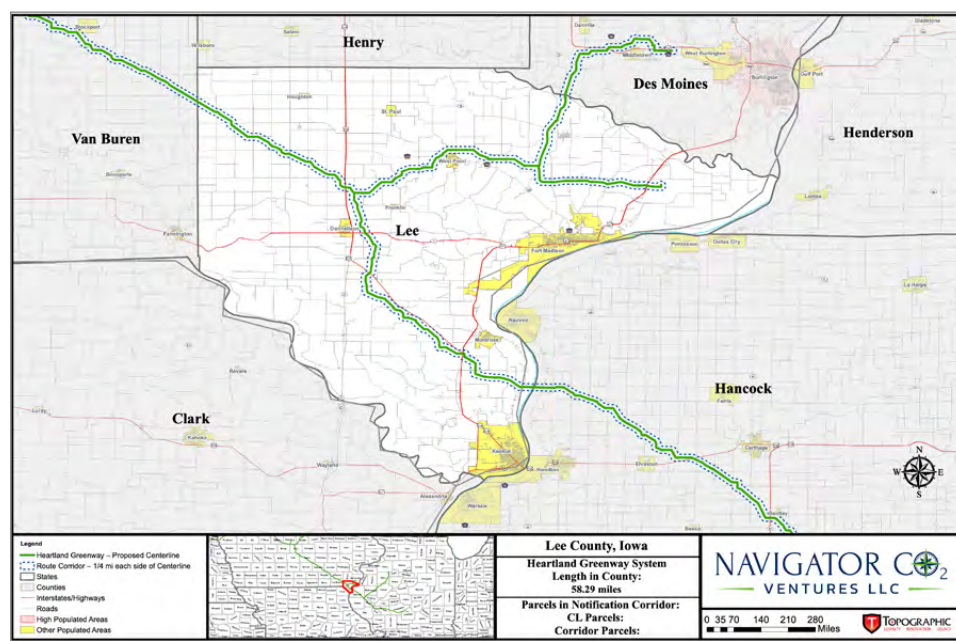

DES MOINES – The Iowa Utilities Board (IUB) today filed a letter approving the dates, times and locations for 13 additional public informational meetings requested by Navigator Heartland Greenway LLC (Navigator). The meetings are to discuss Navigator's proposal to build and operate a large-scale pipeline system that will capture and transport liquefied carbon dioxide from local facilities spanning approximately 1,300 miles across five Midwest states, including Iowa.

Lee County Supervisors will meet with pipeline officials on Thursday at the American Legion in West Point at 11 a.m. The meeting is open to the public but is being planned as an information only meeting with limited to no questions being allowed.

The pipeline is projected to span 58.29 miles through the county with a split northwest of Donnellson off 190th Avenue. It will impact 95 land tracts along the route and 74 property owners.

Navigator requested the meetings in a letter filed on June 15, 2022, and also filed a



new proposed pipeline route overview map in Docket No. HLP-2021-0003.

This is the latest Lee County map of the proposed Heartland-Greenway CO2 capture pipeline being proposed by Navigator Ventures. A change in the proposed route is requiring the additional public meeting on Sept. 15 at Lee County Fairgrounds starting

at noon.

Lee County will have another public meeting on Sept. 15 starting at noon at the Lee County Fairgrounds in the Youth Learning Center.

The IUB will schedule other public infor-

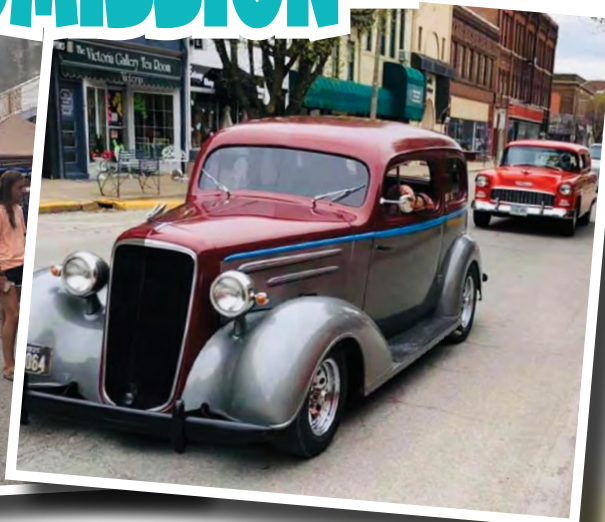

Bloodhounds sweep Keokuk on senior night

WILLIAMS LEADS: Kane Williams goes 5-7 in two games with four runs scored to lift Hounds

FORT MADISON – Fort Madison junior Kane Williams went 5-for-7 at the plate with four runs scored and a couple RBI as the Hounds swept Keokuk 11-1 and 5-1 in a twinbill at Fort Madison Monday night.

Williams was 3-4 in the first game with two RBI and two runs scored to lead Fort Madison.

The Hounds held a 3-0 lead after three innings and then put up a four-spot in the bottom half of the fourth.

Aidan Pennock reached on 3rd strike passed ball and Landes Williams, who got the win on the mound returning after being gone all of last week, drew a walk to put two on. Kane Williams then doubled to left scoring Pennock and moving Landes Williams to third.

Reiburn Turnbull executed

a squeeze bunt scoring Landes Williams, but Turnbull was thrown at first for the first out of the inning and a 6-0 lead.

Tate Johnson followed with a walk and Jordan Simpson plated Kane Williams on a sacrifice fly to left. Senior Matt Hopper singled to score Johnson before a fly out wrapped up the inning.

Fort Madison would put up a run in the fifth and then three more in the bottom of the sixth to set the 10-run rule.

Johnson opened the bottom of the sixth with a single off a 1-2 pitch to left. After a Simpson fly out, Hopper tripled on a line drive to center field scoring Johnson all the way from first. Aiden Mitchell then doubled to left scoring Hopper for a 10-1 lead. Caden Barnes' double scored Mitchell to end the game 11-1.

Williams went five innings without allowing a run and striking out three on two hits. Luke Hellige came on the six with a line of two hits, one run earned and strikeout. Hopper was 2-2 at the plate with two runs and 2 RBI.

In the second game, Hopper took the mound and went all seven innings allowing just one run unearned on seven hits and fanning four in the win.

Fort Madison held a 2-0 lead going into the third inning. Keokuk put up a run in the top half when Jordan Sisk scored on a fielder's choice ground out to short.

But the Hounds would answer with two in the bottom half. Johnson led off with his second double of the night and Simpson followed with an RBI single to center. After a strikeout, Caden Barnes wore a pitch and Simpson moved to third on a wild pitch. He would score on Pennock's fielder's choice to short to make it 4-1.

The Hounds would add an insurance run in the bottom of the sixth when Turnbull hit a two-out sacrifice fly to left scoring Kane Williams, who had doubled in the previous at bat.

Kane Williams, Johnson, and Pennock all had multiple

hit games for Fort Madison. Landes Williams, Turnbull, Simpson and Pennock had the RBI for Fort Madison.

Nick Profeta took the loss for Keokuk. He also led the Chiefs at the plate going 2-3.

Fort Madison superintendent Dr. Erin Slater threw out the first pitch Monday night and was caught by Jeff Lamb, the FMHS new activities director.

The Hounds (13-5 Southeast Conference, 17-6 overall) take on Davis County tonight on the road in a non-conference matchup. They travel to New London on Wednesday to take on the Class 1A 3rd-ranked Tigers (21-0). They wrap up the busy week with a doubleheader on Thursday against Burlington and another at home Saturday against

Class 3A No. 1 Davenport Assumption to close out the regular season.

The post season opens on July 8 when the Hounds host Oskaloosa (7-19) in a Class 3A Region 5 substate quarterfinal 7 p.m. start. Fort Madison is the 3-seed in the regional bracket.

The winner of that game will face the winner of No. 2 Marion (19-10) vs. No. 7 Mt. Pleasant (7-16) in Marion on July 11. The substate bracket which includes top-seed Davenport Assumption, Washington, Fairfield and Keokuk in the top half, will have its final on July 13 with the highest seeded school hosting the game.

This year's state tournament for Class 3A and 4A will again be played in Iowa City starting July 18.

Van Buren knocks off HTC 4-3 in walk-off Monday

KEOSAUQUA – A big 3-run fifth inning helped Holy Trinity Catholic tie things up with Van Buren Monday night, but the Warriors got a walk-off in extra innings to stave off the comeback.

The Warriors took advantage of an extra inning error on a grounder to short and would bring the runner around on a Jade Balmer two-out single to right for a 4-3 win in SEI Superconference girls action.

Holy Trinity (9-9, 5-6) was down 3-0 going into the top half of the fifth when Rachel Menke opened the frame with a single on the first pitch of the inning from Van Buren's Alli Campbell. After a strike out Kelli Meierotto singled moving Menke to second.

Anna Sobczak laid down a successful bunt to load the bases and Haile Cain grounded into a fielder's choice to third. Menke scored on the throw home from third and everyone else was safe keeping the bases loaded at 3-1.

Mary Hellige then singled to center scoring Meierotto. Brooke Mueller would line out back to the pitcher for the second out, but Sobczak would come in to score on a wild pitch to knot things up at 3 before Jenna DiPrima hit into a fielder's choice to end the inning.

Neither team would score again through seven forcing extra innings. HTC went 3-up, 3-down in the top half of the eighth. Van Buren's McKenna Caviniss hit a 2-2 pitch hard to short and an error on the play allowed her advance to second base in scoring position.

Julia Meek came in as a courtesy runner and moved to third on a sacrifice bunt. Hellige would get the next hitter looking at strike three for the second out, but Balmer hit a fly ball to right that fell in for the game-winner.

Hellige went 7 2/3 giving up four runs, just one earned on six hits while fanning five and walking three. The junior was also 2-4 at the plate with an RBI. Sobczak was 2-4 with a run scored. Menke and Meierotto had the other hits for HTC.

On Friday, the Crusaders rolled Hillcrest 12-5 at South Park.

HTC put up six runs in the third inning and three in the fourth on the way to the victory. However the girls trailed 3-1 going into the third.

Sobczak executed another successful bunt and Cain walked before Hellige tripled to



right scoring both runners to tie things up. Brooke Mueller would single to drive in Hellige. After a strike out DiPrima was hit by a pitch. Menke then singled to load the bases and Meierotto would double clearing the bases for a 7-3 HTC lead.

Hillcrest would put up a run in the fourth and fifth, but Hellige was able to keep the game under control as the Crusader offense tacked on five more in the Holy Trinity half of the fourth and fifth to put the game away.

Hellige again lasted all seven innings giving up four hits and five runs, none earned on six strikeouts. Hellige led the Crusaders at the plate going 4-5 with two runs scored and an RBI. Mueller was 3-5 with 3 RBI and three runs scored. Sobczak and Kayla Box both had multiple hit nights for Holy Trinity.

Local businesses could help with daycares

“Last week we pulled in some interested providers looking to expand, as well as businesses interested in supporting local child care efforts in one way or another,” she said. “Businesses shared with us what they can do and providers shared what they would be able to do with some investment.”

The grant applications, as with many coming out of the state, have a tight deadline of just seven weeks. The grant was announced at the end of May, with an application window of June 17 to July 18.

“We want to put the word out there to other businesses who want to be a part of this effort. They can either apply as part of the consortium or they can work outside of the grant process and offer to contribute with other resources,” Kramer-Riesberg said.

Child care providers or other businesses and industries interested in working with the group and being a part of the grant effort can contact Kramer-Riesberg at 319-372-5225 or by email at bkramer-riesberg@leecountyhd.org.

The child care centers are being tasked to provide how much staff they need to hire to meet the needs of employers in their centers and home daycares. Businesses, Kramer-Riesberg said, are trying to identify their needs and can form partnerships to address those needs.

The group is also looking for businesses interested in a one-time investment in building a new center.

“We can help people with all those processes if they are interested,” she said.

Earlier this year, Reynolds signed into law an act allowing 16-year-olds to work limited hours unsupervised at daycare providers. Kramer-Riesberg said that change isn't sitting well with daycare providers.

“From the registered providers, that's not well-supported. They're not going to have 16-year-olds watching kids unsupervised,” she said. “There's so much liability and that's a lot of responsibility for a 16-year old. It's about safety and quality of care for our kids.”

Police tried to stop vehicle

south when Lee County Sheriff Stacy Weber decided to divert traffic out of the northbound lanes at Hwy 2 and stopped traffic already in the path to avoid a head-on collision.

The chase then resumed back in the southbound lanes where the stop sticks were laid out across the highway by Donnellson police. The suspect's vehicle, a white pickup truck, lost control at the sticks and rolled across the median coming to rest in the northbound lane facing north.

“There were multiple reports and complaints of erratic driving and after several attempts to get him to stop to see if he was impaired, the pursuit began in Henry County and entered Lee County,” Weber said.

He said the pursuit was a high speed pursuit and the driver went from the southbound lanes to northbound lanes several times endangering vehicles.

“He swerved to miss the stop sticks and it was a good thing that we had stopped traffic coming north because he ended losing control and rolling into the northbound lane,” Weber said.

The driver was the only person in the vehicle.
