GROWTH: Realty firm looking at multiple site options for retail/service sectors

FORT MADISON - It's becoming a familiar tale. Developers continue to look to Fort Madison as a place of growth and energy, and potential earnings. Ryan Nagrocki, President of Midwest Realty Group, is in the process of clearing out more than six acres of land west of 48th Street in Fort Madison. Nagrocki purchased the property for \$95,000, according Lee County property records, about a year

Hancock County deputies shoot, kill suspect in Wednesday incident

CARTHAGE - Illinois State Police are investigating an officer-involved shooting that has left one person dead near Route 136 and County Road 2500 E in Hancock County.

According to release from the Illions State Police, the Hancock County sheriff's deputies

responded to a report of a suspicious person in the area.

During the interaction with the subject, the subject entered the first responding officer's patrol vehicle and held the officer at gunpoint. The officer exited the patrol vehicle and shots were fired at the subject. The subject then turn control of the patrol vehicle and fled the scene.

A second responding officer was on scene and picked up the first responding officer and engaged in a short pursuit that ended with an exchange of gunfire between the officers and the subject.

The subject was pronounced deceased at an area hospital a short time later. No officers were injured in the incident.

DES MOINES - Iowa Workforce Development is reshaping itself to become more responsive to business needs and make it easier for Iowa employers to get the help they need with their workforce issues.

Two new division administrators and a new deputy director of employment and training joined IWD in June (although Tim Goodwin won't officially start until September) as part of a restructuring to help the agency focus more effort at becoming a one-stop center for employers' workforce needs.

"As we continue to realign to make it easier for our customers and employers to find and access workforce services in Iowa, the hire of three new leaders will enhance our ability to get unemployed Iowans reemployed faster, return more unemployed to the workforce, and create a one-stop customer service center for employers," said Beth Townsend, Director of Iowa Workforce Development. "Under Governor Reynolds' leadership, we want to make it easier for employers to understand and use the workforce resources that Iowa provides to empower their growth."

Outreach to the business community will be a primary task for IWD's new senior leaders.

Sherri Behrendt, who has been involved in a number of business organizations and served on state boards, has joined IWD as the agency's new Deputy Director of Employment and Training, overseeing the IowaWORKS centers, Workforce Services, a new Business Engagement Division, and IWD's new Workforce Training and Education Division.

Another carbon capture line proposed for eastern Iowa

DES MOINES - The Iowa Utilities Board (IUB) today issued an order approving the dates, times and locations for six public informational meetings requested by Wolf Carbon Solutions US, LLC (Wolf), which includes a virtual meeting option. The meetings are to discuss Wolf's proposal to build and operate a carbon capture pipeline system that will transport liquefied carbon dioxide from local facilities in eastern Iowa to an underground storage facility in Illinois.

Wolf requested the meetings in a letter filed on July 11, 2022, and also filed a proposed pipeline route overview map in Docket No. HLP-2022-0002.

The IUB will schedule five in-person the public informational meetings and one virtual meeting as follows:

Customers already calling with interest on 48th Street lot

ago because of the energy and development he had been seeing around Fort Madison, especially on the west end.

The banker-turned real estate developer said he was excited about getting the property after he saw Farm & Home across the intersection.

During the COVID pandemic, Nagrocki got his real estate license and after doing that for a couple years, opened his own firm, Midwest Realty Group, Inc. with his wife, Stephanie. He lost his father just before the pandemic and said, "life is too short, if you enjoy doing something go do it."

He then formed the realty group in West Burlington and said he had an option on the property from the Hoglan family, who had owned the property since it was a drive-in theater.

"I kept in touch with Dr. Hoglan and he called me one day and said a Chicago firm had offered him pennies on the dollar for this property and he was thinking of selling. I asked, "would that apply to me to" and we ended up reaching a deal," Nagrocki said.

The land is valued at \$191,000 according to assessor records.

At that point, Nagrocki said he initially had no plans for the property, which extends from behind the Quicker Liquor strip building north to the back side of the Connection Bank facility on Avenue L and east to the

Dollar Tree.

Nagrocki, who used to live in Fort Madison, said he was talking with Fort Madison Mayor Matt Mohrfeld about all the things going on in Fort Madison and got excited about the prospects of the lot.

"I saw Mayor Matt here a while back and have been reading about the Marina project and the different things going on down here, and I wanna see things happen," Nagrocki said.

"This thing is a diamond in the rough and just waiting for something and you couldn't see it before. It was just so rough."

Nagrocki has three or four different layouts of property and said he's currently talking with two retail companies and a service company. One would include a strip building on the north side. Other options include an anchor tennant with about 20,000 square

He also has spoken with some small footprint food service outlets. One retail prospect is looking at making a decision in the next 45 days.

But for now, he's contracted with a demo firm out of Burlington to clear the lots and they are in the middle of that progress currently.

"My goal is to clean the thing up and start marketing it again to other businesses. I was so happy to see Farm and Home went in there and it didn't get turned into a warehouse," he


Nagrocki built nine homes in 2021 and has seven more going on right now. His firm is also working on 48 townhomes that are going up north of Target in West Burlington.


"This kind of hit the back burner for a while."

Nagrocki is just one of many lately who have been investing in the area. A Quick-Care urgent care facility has gone up on the city's west side. The Madison is currently undergoing an \$8 million add-on, and Chase Gibb has invested in the city by acquiring the Middle **School Apartments** citing the city's momen-

Nagrocki said the banker in him makes him a bit cautious with today's economic climate, but said momentum creates momentum.

"You got momentum. I know Matt and I like





his thought process on growing the area and bringing people in. You have to be pro-business and pro-growth," he said. He said there has been

a little easing in construction costs recently, so he's feeling a bit better about the investments.

The site has utilities located on site and has two access points, one on 48th Street and the other on Avenue O. Nagrocki said traffic counts by the lot are about 12,700 per



IWD's new Workforce Training and Education Division will be led by Jared Baldwin, former Program Chair at Faith Baptist Bible College and Theological Seminary in Ankeny. Baldwin (far right above), who has significant experience in strategic planning and translating strategic visions into action, designed the college's Organizational Leadership degree program and grew it from inception to 57 full-time students in three years.

AG Miller urges legislature to pass "red flag" law

DES MOINES — Iowa Attorney General Tom Miller urged the Legislature to support a "red flag" law in Iowa to help reduce gun violence.

"This is a common-sense, scientifically supported solution to a crisis," Miller said. "No single solution will prevent shootings, but we must take advantage of tools that can be effective."

Congress has passed bipartisan legislation that allocates \$750 million for states to develop and implement red-flag laws, or extreme risk protection orders.

Studies show that such laws work. A group of universities funded by the National Collaborative on Gun Violence Research reviewed extreme risk protection orders over a seven-year period and deter-

mined that more than 600 people who made mass shooting threats were disarmed. Researchers at the University of California Davis School of Medicine found 58 cases over three years in which extreme risk protection orders were used when mass shootings were threatened, and none of the threats were carried out.

Nineteen states and Washington, D.C. have laws that allow law enforcement and sometimes others to petition civil courts to confiscate firearms from people who may be a danger to themselves or others.

"Critics point to other states as proof that red-flag laws don't work," Miller said. "However, in many cases, the laws are new and narrow, and officials are unaware of how the laws work. Awareness and implementation are critical."

The AG's office trains law enforcement officials and prosecutors on a range of laws and will do the same if a red-flag law is passed in Iowa. Educating the public is also important, he said.

"If I saw loved ones threatening themselves or others, I would want access to this tool to save lives," Miller said. "Red-flag laws empower family, friends, and others to prevent tragedies."
