CAPITOL HILL Grassley says Congress still eveing ARPA activity

LEE COUNTY - U.S. Senator Chuck Grassley (R-Iowa) said it may be time to start looking at pulling in some of the America Rescue Plan Act funding if it's not being properly appropriated or even left unspent.

Grassley made the comments during his weekly Capitol Hill Report where he meets with a member of radio/broadcast media and a member of print media. This weeks report featured Pen City Current and Nathan Konz of Carroll Broadcasting Co. of Carrol, Iowa.

Konz and Pen City Current's Chuck Vandenberg pressed Grassley, who voted against the stimulus package, on ARPA funds and if the funding is getting away from its intention.

"From time to time we're spending money on some new project or policy in the United States, and sometiomes we try to offset that money by taking money that's not COVID-related, or is unspent and try to reallocate that. But we haven't been successful in it," Grassley said.

But he said transparency is the key as far as he's concerned.

"First of all, if this is going to be spent, they're going to have to point to the law that allows it to be spent for that purpose. So if its something that's not being spent, my policy is that Americans deserve transparency to make sure the taxpayers' money isn't being lost to fraud or being misspent in any other way. That's what Congressional overrsight is all about. I would expect members of the appropriations committee to ride herd on that money to make sure it's spent in an appropriate, legal way." Grassley said he didn't vote for the stimulus package out of fear of what would happen to inflation. He said Democratic



also services unlike other midwestern laundries.

To start, the Dexter line of washers and dryers are top-of-the-line made right in Iowa and these machines will do anywhere from 1 to 8 loads at a time.

Cobb said he wanted to provide larger machines to help reduce people's time in doing laundry.

"We're not just selling laundry here, we're selling you time," he said.

He's not only marketing the laundry to residents in rental properties or those traveling through, he wants the restaurant, hotel, bar, and industrial business as well.

"We've talked with the local hotels about referring their customers here for laundry services. We're talking with restaurants about our ability to do their towels and aprons and things. Again, giving time back to those busy people," he said.

Although he doesn't have all the details worked out yet, Cobb said there are plans being finalized for people, business, companies and travelers to drop off their laundry, have it done, and then come back and pick it up.

"We're about a month away from having that service ready," Cobb said. "We'll have a drop off right through the double doors. We will wash it, dry it, and fold it. Probably not ironing and that kind of thing, but we can provide a service that allows you to catch up with your time."

He said the machines are also big enough for spring

cleaning, drapes, comforters, and other bulk laundry.

Cobb has spaced out the traditional load machines so everyone has plenty of workspace and there are tables at the end of each row of machines and along the walls.

One very unique aspect to Fort Madison laundry services is the Dexter mobile app that allows you to reserve and pay for washers and dryers right from your phone. Cobb said there will eventually be specials on the app for users with potential savings for repeated use.

Using the app, one person could pay for the machines from anywhere using the app and another person doing the laundry would just have to load the machine and

press start.

He's also going to be installing some child-friendly amenities in the next month that will includy dry-erase boards, books, and some games to keep children occupied during cleaning.

Patrons can also expect vending machines with snacks and drinks in the coming weeks.

Grassley leads hearings on police staffing shortages

economists told the leadership that it wasn't a good spend.

"None of the leadership listened to them and that's why we have the inflation we have today," he said.

Grassley also lead a hearing Tuesday morning focused on bringing attention to suffering staffing situations in law enforcement. An Iowa police officer Zach Andersen was present at the hearings in Washington D.C. and delivered opening remarks about the critical need for support of America's law enforcement agencies.

Grassley said he attributes the increase in violent crime, including attacks on police forces, as a reason agencies suffer in recruitment and retention.

"We're after a couple things and that's to bring attention to a bill that I've introduced that would gather more stats on gang shootings on police officers," he said.

"But the overriding purpose is to highlight the lack of morale of policeman for their profession."

The 88-year-old Senator, who's seeking another sixyear term in the November general election, said he spoke with law enforcement officials in Davenport several months ago and learned that morale is down, there are difficulties in recruiting, and people are retiring without a sufficient backfill of those positions.

"There's just not enough people applying for these jobs and law enforcement is weak as a result of it."

Grassley also spoke about the possibility of a recession saying he prefers to call it a "couple quarters of negative growth".

"I don't think it will be a deep recession, but from my meetings in the 99 counties, I'm hearing it's the small business people that are the ones who frequently use the term. Democrats don't like it because they are embarassed by it."

Grassley, a former farmer who has a natural gas line running through his property in Butler County, said current discussions and negotiations around carbon capture pipelines are in the hands of the Iowa Utilities Board. He said he gets questions at his county meetings about the pipelines and said the issue is highly controversial.

"People who want to establish this need to do a better job of communicating with landowners,' he said. "And the people who think it's beneficial need to be more proactive about it."

Another Opioid Settlement

Miller reveals deal reached with Teva

Settlement includes \$4.25 billion in cash over next 13 years

DES MOINES - Iowa Attorney General Tom Miller has reached an agreement in principle on key financial terms with opioid maker Teva, which would provide up to \$4.25 billion to participating states and local governments.

While critical details of the settlement remain the subject of ongoing negotiations, Teva disclosed the first details of the agreement ahead of its earnings announcement Wednesday.

"This is another major step in addressing the opioids crisis," Miller said, noting that Iowa was a leading state in negotiating today's agreement with Teva. "We expect these funds to make a significant difference in preventing fatal overdoses and treating opioid addiction disorder."

Teva, an Israel-based drug manufacturer, makes Actiq and Fentora, which are branded fentanyl products for cancer pain, and a number of generic opioids including oxycodone.

States alleged that Teva:

•promoted potent, rapid-onset fentanyl products for use by non-cancer patients;

•deceptively marketed opioids by downplaying the risk of addiction and overstating their benefits, including encouraging the idea that signs of addiction are actually "pseudoaddiction" treated by prescribing more opioids; and

•failed to comply with suspicious order monitoring requirements along with its distributor, Anda. The parties have agreed on the following financial

•Teva will pay a maximum of \$4.25 billion in cash over 13 years. This figure includes amounts Teva has already agreed to pay under settlements with individual States, funds for participating States and subdivisions, and the \$240 million of cash in lieu of product described below.

•As part of the financial term, Teva will provide up to \$1.2 billion in generic naloxone (valued at Wholesale Acquisition Cost or WAC) over a 10-year period or \$240 million of cash in lieu of product, at each State's election. Naloxone is used to counteract overdoses.

•The settlement will build on the existing framework that states and subdivisions have created through other recent opioid settlements.

A final settlement remains contingent on agreement on critical business practice changes and transparency requirements.

"Leading a coalition of states to hold accountable the manufacturers of opioids is a priority for our office, which is why I have directed substantial resources toward this effort," Miller said. "We are dedicated to ensuring that help is available to Iowans who are victims of the opioid epidemic."

The negotiations are being led by the following states: California, Illinois, Iowa, Massachusetts, New York, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, and Wisconsin. While New York is among the 12 states that negotiated this proposed settlement framework, Teva and New York are still engaged in further negotiations.
