Mayor Walker dies

WEDNESDAY: Paul Walker dies in West Point after battle with lung cancer

WEST POINT – It's a sad day for the City of West Point as an icon that helped shape the city's past, present, and future died early Wednesday morning after battling lung cancer.

West Point Mayor Paul Dean Walker, 79, of West Point, Iowa, died at 2:32 a.m. Wednesday, at the West Point Care Center in West Point, Iowa.

He leaves behind his wife: Mary Beth; one son: Jay D. (Amy L.) Walker; grandchildren: Margaret E. Walker and Mason T.



Walker; step-grandsons: Jordan L. Brown and Aden R. Alfred; sisters-in-law: Kate (Dennis) Menke, Rosemary Klemtt, and Dorothy (Tom) Peters. Also surviving are several nieces, nephews, and cousins.

Mr. Walker's obituary appears in tomorrow's e-edition and on our website now.

City Administrator Randy Welding said no one was more proud of West Point than Walker.

Holy Trinity Elementary hosts student science projects

WEST POINT - Sixty-five projects were laid out in front of judges and parents in the old Holy Trinity Catholic gymnasium Wednesday night.

The projects were the brainchild of a wide array of students from fifth to

eighth grade, and even a junior in high school.

This year's annual Holy Trinity Catholic Science Fair was a bit different as Science Fair coordinator Ernie Schiller challenged students to think a little outside the box, but within the scientific formula.

"I think this is the biggest group we've

had," Schiller said.

"I was impressed with how I gave them a challenge and they really ran with it."

One of the most outside the box projects was by Evan Pauly, who tested four rooms in a house to see which room was actually the "dirtiest".

Central Lee may cap open enrollment

Class size could result in some students being declined enrollment

DONNELLSON, IOWA — At its December meeting, the Central Lee Board of Education finalized the school district's open enrollment policy.

This permanent change will help district administration make decisions regarding students who apply for open enrollment. Last year, the Iowa legislature removed the March 1 deadline for OE, forcing the district to shift how it manages the process moving forward.

Superintendent Dr. Andy Crozier said the numbers pertain to specific class sections.

If the district has five sections of kindergarten, it can allow up to 100 students per grade level. At this time, more than 100 students have enrolled in kindergarten due to higher-than-usual resident enrollment. If a family were to apply for OE for next year's first grade, they would likely be denied due to class size limitations," he wrote in a release Wednesday morning.

He said the dynamic has been created by a multitude of factors.

"It's a combination of facilities, class size, and the ability to finding quality teachers," Crozier said.

"In the past, we could have a surge of elementary students in the summer and I could hire a teacher in late July/ early August. Now, the labor market is pretty dry coming mid-April."

In July 2022, the Board of Education approved an emergency policy that articulated class size limitations for OE. These numbers do not change with the permanent policy, as the class size maximum will be 20 students per section in grades K-2 and 25 per section

WB looking for survey volunteers

WEST BURLINGTON - The City of West Burlington was selected as one of 10 communities across the state to participate in the 2023 Iowa's Living Roadways Community Visioning Program, the goal is to develop a transportation enhancement plan that graphically illustrates the vision of West Burlington residents. Part of this process involves obtaining input from residents on how they use the transportation system in West Burlington, compiling the information we collect, and presenting it to the West Burlington Community Visioning steering committee.

Focus Group participants will identify and map transportation assets and barriers, as

for grades 3-5.

These numbers pertain to specific class sections. If the district has five sections of kindergarten, it can allow up to 100 students per grade level. At this time, more than 100 students have enrolled in kindergarten due to higher-than-usual resident enrollment. If a family were to apply for OE for next year's first grade, they would likely be denied due to class size limitations.

Part of the board's duty to develop a permanent policy was to provide guidance on future incoming kindergarten OE students. Families of kindergarten students who desire to open enroll in Central Lee will need to do so by March 10, and attend our kindergarten information night on March 1 at 5 p.m.

The district will then prioritize students on the open enrollment list based on the following priorities:

Students who have a parent employed by Central Lee will receive top priority.

Students who attended Central Lee four-year-old preschool will receive the next priority.

Students who have another sibling attending Central Lee schools will receive the last priority.

If spots remain after those three priorities are fulfilled, remaining OE students will be accepted based on the date their application was received.

"Open enrollment has been a net positive for Central Lee over the years," said Dr. Andy Crozier, Superintendent. "While growth is important, we also want to ensure we manage this process for the years to come. Ensuring our class sizes remain manageable is critical for our staff to be successful, especially at the elementary level."



"Two weeks ago, he told me he got bad news. I got to see him Thursday and we carried on a good conversation. I guess over the weekend it got pretty bad.

Welding said he's been friends with Walker for years and when the mayor needed something, he just only need ask.

"I got to know him when he first asked me to serve on the chicken committee with him many, many years ago. Everytime he needed somebody, he just had to come and ask. He's the only Mayor I've ever worked with."

Checking for recalls is quick and easy. During Vehicle Safety Recalls Week in March, we are urging everyone to take a few minutes to check for an open safety recall. Remember that every vehicle recalls are free important and should be repaired immediately. The best part? All repairs are free. Your diligence will help keep you and others safe on the roadways.

Check for recalls Two Ways:

First, drivers can use the free, user-friendly Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) Look-Up Tool, located at NHTSA.gov/recalls. This web tool allows vehicle owners to check for open safety recalls on their vehicles or automotive equipment, such as tires and car seats. Drivers can also check for open safety recalls by downloading the free SaferCar app. Once in the app, enter your vehicle's VIN and NHTSA will send you an alert if a safety recall is issued on them.

Both methods for checking recalls is free and easy. In both cases, you will need to enter the vehicle's VIN, located on the lower portion of your car's windshield on the driver's side. The VIN is also located on your registration car, and it may be shown on your insurance card.

Although last year's recalls affected millions of vehicles, tires, car seats and other equipment, millions of recalled vehicles still go unrepaired every year. This puts drivers, passengers, and other road users at risk.




