### **BLACKHAWKS:** Schulte gets 700th win after losing father previous day.

BURLINGTON – SCC Head Coach Justin Schulte recruits on his record of winning one-run games.

That small-ball mentality just landed him his 700th win and a trip to the NJCAA Division II World Series next week in Enid, Oklahoma.

The Blackhawks defeated Williston State out of Williston North Dakota Saturday 3-2 to take the North Plains Championship two games to 1.

Southeastern split a doubleheader with the Tetons on Friday winning the second game 6-1 after losing game one

"If you look at our one-run record we gotta be 8-2 or 7-1, we've won a lot of close games," Schulte said after the emotional win.

"I've coached a long time and we've won almost 200 onerun games in my career. That's 25% of my career. We've played .700 baseball in one-run games in my career. I show that to recruits.

"That's how I coach. That's how I teach."

SCC took an early 1-0 lead into the fourth inning. With runners at 1st and 3rd an infield hit to second slipped

# Central Lee/HTC enter into shared football agreement for 2023/24

DONNELLSON — The Central Lee Community School District Board of Education approved a 28E sharing agreement for football with Holy Trinity Catholic Schools at its May board meeting.

The sharing agreement is for grades 7-12 and will be for two years. It is the first sharing agree-

ment Central Lee has had for football and the district's first sharing agreement with HTC Schools for any sport. The agreement will be in place for the 2023 and 2024 football seasons.

"We believe this sharing agreement is a win-win for both schools," said Wes McGraw, Central Lee

Activities Director. "It provides HTC a partner so that their students can play football. We also feel the additional players HTC can provide will give us some additional depth, allowing us to be more competitive at both the varsity and junior varsity

# Miller-Meeks sponsors VA act

WASHINGTON D.C. -U.S. Representatives Mariannette Miller-Meeks (IA-01), Chairwoman of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs Subcommittee on Health, Mike Bost (IL-12), Chair of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs, Jack Bergman (MI-01), Aumua Amata Radewagen (AS-00), Greg Murphy (NC-03), Derrick Van Orden (WI-03), Jen Kiggans (VA-02), and Nancy Mace (SC-01) today introduced the Veteran Care Improvement Act, legislation to improve and expand VA health services. Most notably, the Veteran Care Improvement Act will incentivize partnerships between the VA and community providers. "Our men and women in uniform dedicate their lives to protecting our nation, and it's our duty to ensure they receive the best possible care—both during and after their service," said Miller-Meeks. "Improving the quality and accessibility of care for veterans has remained one of my top priorities in Congress, and I'm proud to lead this important piece of legislation."

"Our veterans have earned world class healthcare and deserve no less than timely access to it. I applaud Health Chairwoman Mariannette Miller-Meeks' introduction of the Veteran Care Improvement Act of 2023 to provide just that and continue to positively transform the VA healthcare system," said Bost. "Specifically, this bill would set a base-

line expectation for timeliness of care and establish an access standard for Substance Abuse Disorder treatment, which, following our oversight hearing on substance abuse, we know is long overdue. This bill also addresses head-on issues we've continued to hear about community care access. I am grateful to Chairwoman Miller-Meeks for her leadership and commitment to providing our former servicemembers with the best care catered to their individual needs."

The Veteran Care Improvement Act would continue to make the VA health care system more accessible and accountable to those in need of its services.

It would codify current access standards, setting a baseline expectation for timeliness of care.

It would establish a defined access standard for the provision of residential substance abuse treatment, recognizing that when a veteran decides that help is needed, time is of the essence.

It would require VA to be more transparent with veterans when they are deciding their best options for care, whether in the VA or in the community.

It would create a pilot program through the Center for Innovation to incentivize how community providers interact with VA, creating a more collaborative and value-based approach.

# State jobless rate drops . 1%

DES MOINES, IOWA - Iowa's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped to 2.7 percent in April from 2.8 percent in March while the state's labor force added 4,300 new workers. The total number of Iowans with jobs increased to 1,681,400 in April, up 5,800 from the month before.

In comparison, the U.S. unemployment rate dropped to 3.4 percent in March.

Iowa's labor force participation rate increased to 68.3 percent, up from 68.2 percent last month. The number of unemployed Iowans decreased to 46,800 in April from 48,300 in March.

"Iowa continues to have a strong labor market, and fantastic opportunities remain for those seeking jobs," said Beth Townsend, Director of Iowa Workforce Development. "Manufacturing, health

care, and retail grew significantly in April despite the external pressures of high inflation and rising interest rates that were felt in other industries. Iowa is the land of opportunity, and IWD can help make connections between workers and employers looking for help."

A survey of Iowa businesses (separate from the survey of individuals used to create the unemployment rate) showed that Iowa establishments shed a slight 300 jobs between March and April, lowering total nonfarm employment to 1,592,800 jobs. This was the first loss since November 2022. Private services showed some weakness in April (-1,800 jobs), mostly within professional and business services. These losses were partially offset by gains in goods-producing establishments. Government gained 600 jobs.



# New agreement won't bump Hawks into higher class

The sharing agreement will add students to Central Lee's Basic Educational Data (BED) counts for football, but will not elevate the team to 3A. Central Lee will continue to compete in 2A for the next two years. The 28E agreement states that if, in future district cycles, Central Lee would be propelled to 3A, the district may elect to end the agreement.

"We are excited to have HTC partner with us for football," said Dr. Andy Crozier, Central Lee Superintendent. "We are mindful of where we are enrollment-wise for future district cycles. I'm confident that we will remain in 2A for the next four years, but both schools will likely see enrollment increases in the future. We feel it is important to be transparent with HTC about what might happen if we were to be bumped to 3A down the road."

Central Lee Head Coach Doug Dodds and his staff will be visiting HTC in the near future to meet with student-athletes and welcome them to the Central Lee football program.



# Blackhawks start Division II World Series May 27

under the baserunner making a difficult play for the Blackhawks' Taichi Nakao at secon negating a potential double play.

Schulte argued for runner interference but got no love from either the infield or plate umpire and the run tied things up at 1 each.

SCC would get out of the inning holding the tie and Schulte had a few more words with the umpires between innings.

The Blackhawks would get the run back in the bottom of the fourth when Fort Madison's Vasin Thurman led off with a single to left that was misplayed allowing him to slip into scoring position.

He would advance to third on a wild pitch and then come around on an RBI single from Sam Skarich for a 2-1 lead.

The Tetons would get to starter Mason Behn to tie things up again at 2, forcing the sophomore from the game in favor of Will Hoernemann and eventually Gage Pearson, neither of whom gave up a run the rest of the way.

The Hawks needed a 6-4-3 double play with a runner on to get out of a dicey top of the 7th and then went to work in the bottom half. Skarich reached on a walk to lead things off and advanced to third on a key single on a Marcus Beatty's single. Nakao would then drive a ball to the warning track in left, plating Skarich with the winning run.

Beatty would also track down the ball in left field to end the game and set off the celebration at Community Field.

The win was even more special for Schulte who lost his father after Friday's game to a short illness.

"It was tough. I'm starting to wind down," Schulte said. "I left the game yesterday before I talked to the kids. I got here this morning and wanted to address with them on what I would have talked to them about last night.

"That was really hard. I had to explain my dad's gone. But my dad would be proud as hell. He loved my career – loves my career. He's proud as a peacock right now. I'm sure he's looking down laughing."

Thurman, and his brother Jason, who played for Fort Madison through 2021, will be making the trip to Oklahoma with the Blackhawks. Thurman said thoughts of Schulte's loss were fresh in the minds of the players, but they had a job to do.

"We're going out there to just play the game. We knew that was in the back of all our minds, but everyone was locked in before the game wanting to get a job done and get to Oklahoma."

Vasin Thurman said he knew coming into the program, that they would have a shot at something special.

"The way this program is ran, and especially the way it's coached, we knew we would be in a lot of baseball games and always have a chance to win. We put ourselves in a lot of those situations and came out on top and now we're headed to Oklahoma," he said.

Thuman has four home runs on the year in 100 at bats and with 24 RBIs and a .290 average.

Jason Thurman rotates into the infield depending on the pitching rotation for defensive purposes. Jason has 20 at bats in 20 games played.

Both will continue their college careers next year at Mid America Christian University in Oklahoma City. Jason Thurman said the Blackhawks play to win the close games.

"We just go out every day and compete as hard as we can to give ourselves a shot to win," he said.

Schulte said the Hawks struggled offensively through the series, but got solid efforts on the mound.

"We left an army on base all three games. It was gonna come down to trying to figure out how to get a run in late innings and Taichi got that sac fly and gave us the lead," he said.

"From there I felt comfortable knowing if I needed to use three or four guys to get nine outs, I can do that. Gage and Will passed the baton and got it done."

Games begin at the David Allen Memorial Ballpark in Enid on May 27. Pairings for the ten-team tournament are scheduled to be released May 23 at 10 a.m.


