## Van Buren County gets United First Aid grant from state

DES MOINES – Today, Governor Kim Reynolds, Lt. Governor Adam Gregg, and the Iowa Economic Development Authority announced that three \$50,000 grants have been awarded to Calhoun County Public Health, Cass County Board of Health, and Van Buren County Hospital to test an innovative program aimed at decreasing emergency response times in rural Iowa. The total grant funding of \$150,000 was made available through the Governor's Empower Rural Iowa

Initiative.

The program, called Iowa United First Aid, is a model that was adapted from the Israeli nonprofit United Hatzalah (which translates

## Pilot program aimed at rural response times

to "United Rescue"). The Israeli model uses technology to crowdsource nearby volunteer emergency responders and has driven response times down to an average of ninety seconds in cities like Jerusalem and Tel Aviv, and to three minutes on average across the country.

In Iowa, the program will equip trained volunteers with an app on their phone that delivers 911 dispatch alerts when an emergency occurs in their vicinity. Volunteers will be trained and supplied with the materials and equipment necessary to perform first aid, bleeding control, CPR, and use of an automated external defibrillator (AED). The goal is for volunteers to quickly respond to emergencies in nearby areas and stabilize victims while an ambulance is on the way, decreasing the amount of time it takes to receive lifesaving assis-

"I'm proud that the Governor's Empower Rural Iowa Initiative created the Iowa United First Aid program," said Governor Reynolds. "This is what the initiative was intended to do – seek innovative ways to impact the quality of rural life in our state. Iowans deeply value service to their communities and their neighbors, and I believe this program and its volunteers will make a tremendous difference in improving access to emergency services in rural communities and saving lives."

"This model holds real promise in using technology and innovation to solve a serious challenge facing our rural communities," said Lt. Governor Gregg. "I appreciate and commend the applicants who have stepped up to lead the way."

Applicants were required to provide a minimum \$25,000 local match for the grant, for at least \$75,000 in total funding to support this program. While costs vary, it is estimated that this amount can support training and equipping a minimum of 25 volunteers in each county. Additionally, the Iowa Rural Development Council has provided grant funds which will assist in the purchase of first aid supply bags, equipment, and safety identification vests for volunteers. The technology has been donated by NowForce and PulsePoint for the program's pilot year.







## FM boys can't keep up with Liberty in finals loss

NORTH LIBERTY — Sometimes, speed has to be experienced to be fully appreciated.

Fort Madison boys soccer coach Kevin Wellman had checked out plenty of video on Iowa City Liberty, and had scouted the Lightning in person.

Then came Wednesday's Class 3A Substate 4 final, and what the Bloodhounds got from the Lightning was a lesson in quickness.

Liberty struck for two

goals in the first 7 1/2 minutes, staggering the Bloodhounds in a 10-0 win that sent the Lightning to next week's state tournament.

Hayden Saul and Cooper Saul each had three goals and Flori Gembo Motshalindo had two for Liberty (9-8).

"They were better soccer players than we were," Fort Madison coach Kevin Wellman said. "Better soccer players."

The Lightning struck quickly, with three shots on goal in the first 3 1/2 minutes, a stunning fury that set the tone for the rest of the match.

"We were surprised,"
Wellman said. "We knew
(Motshalindo) was very
fast, we knew (Roman
Riggs, who had a first-half
goal) was very skilled,
very good playmaker. We
didn't know all of them
were as fast as they were.

"You can't see that on film. We came up to watch them play Dubuque Senior, and I don't know if we sat too far up on the bleachers and didn't notice. But yeah, we were all surprised."

Cooper Saul opened the scoring with a shot from the middle seven minutes into the match, then Hayden Saul punched in a

goal 40 seconds later for a 2-0 lead.

Cooper Saul added a second goal at the 13:54

mark, then Riggs scored with 5:44 left and Motshalindo scored with 3:52 left.

That lead seemed insurmountable, and the Lightning kept the offense going in the second half.

Cooper Saul's third goal came 5 1/2 minutes into the second half, then Forrest Saul and Hayden Saul scored within 20 seconds of each other to push the lead to 8-0. Motshalindo added his second goal with 29:11 to play, then Hayden Saul ended the match with 3:07 to play with his final goal.

Fort Madison, which claimed its third consecutive Southeast Conference championship, ended its season with a 15-4 record, falling in the substate final for the third consecutive

"I don't know if you heard me after the game, but I told these kids that I wouldn't trade any of their guys for any of our guys," Wellman said, his voice cracking with the emotion of the defeat. "I take away a lot of good things from this season. We had a lot of wins, finishing 15-4. We went through some games that were tough that we didn't go away from, games when we were down and responded.

"It's a testament to the character of these guys, which is why I would never trade them. There is high quality character in every one of them."

Fort Madison loses five seniors, including Xander Wellman, who had 30 goals and 16 assists this season coming off a knee injury near the end of last season, and Jacob Pothitakis, who recovered from a severe leg injury last season to have a 7-goal, 15-assist year.

"This was a great group of seniors, but they're always a great group," Kevin Wellman said.

Then he smiled.

"I really love coaching at Fort Madison," Wellman



# Kramer honored for work countering child abuse



County. The group is a network of community partners that are working together on various projects including the child care market study, Resilience Catalysts network, and raising awareness on child abuse prevention and adverse childhood experiences.

Kramer also oversees the Southeast Iowa Public Health Academic Training Program which is funded by a federal HRSA grant received by LCHD. The program partners with Southeastern Community College, Southeast Iowa Regional Medical Center, and Carthage Memorial to administer a Community Health Worker course. The 8-week course is free and open to the public, with the next cohort beginning in August. The CHW course also partners with the Mobile Connection Center to provide hands-on learning experience assisting Southeast Iowans access community resources and needs.
