### **JONES REVS UP:** Junior racks up 70 kills as Central Lee comes back to win Pool

DONNELLSON – The Central Lee Lady Hawks got the win they've been looking for all year.

And then they got another one, and another one, and ended up winning the top seed out of the Central Lee Pool of the Southeast Iowa Superconference volleyball tournament.

The Lady Hawks were seeded 12th overall in the tournament and No. 3 at the Hawks' gym.

Fourth-seeded Wapello was the favorite in Central Lee and wound up with the No. 2 seed going into Saturday's finals at Southeastern Community College after falling to the Lady Hawks 21-18 in the No. 1 seed tiebreaker.

The unorthodox tiebreaker had Wapello, New London,

# **High school** rodeo next up at arena

THIS WEEKEND: Iowa High School Rodeo Association brings hundreds into town for national qualifier

FORT MADISON – The rodeo'n just ain't quite over yet in Fort Madison.

The National High School Rodeo Association is once again bringing its qualifier to C.E. "Eddie" Richards Arena this weekend. It will be the 25th year the Iowa High School Rodeo Association has brought either a qualifier or state finals event to the Tri-State Rodeo arena.

National Director James Young said this year should be another two full days of competition on Saturday and Sunday.

"It's a qualifier for kids in grades 5th – 12th grade and I think you're gonna see close to 200 participants this year," he said. "It's a great event and free to the public, so people can just come and enjoy the weekend watching kids compete."

Lisa Wood, who's a member of the Tri-State Rodeo Operating Committee, has been a big part of the High School competition since her children competed.

She said not only are there Iowa high school rodeo kids competing, but some families close to the border in Illinois, Missouri, and even Nebraska will make the trip because it's closer than other parts of their state.

The kids can compete in any state for the qualifiers for the National High School Rodeo, which this year is being held in Rock Springs, Wyoming.

"Our daughters did it in high school about 14 years ago and we've been part of it ever since. We have a support group called the Southeast Iowa High School Rodeo Association that brings the event in each year."

Woods said competition starts on Saturday at 10:30 and runs most of the

day using the main rodeo arena as well as the saddle club due to the high number of participants.

Then competition starts again at 8:30 a.m. Sunday to get things done a little earlier for the people who have a long drive home.

She said there used to be more local families that participated in the high school rodeo back when her children competed, but that has changed and most competitors come from around the state.

"I know there's one family from West Point, but the rest aren't that close anymore. We do see some from Ottumwa and Bloomfield, but those are the closest I can think of. I haven't seen the full roster yet.

"But this is just a great place for a rodeo, so we've stayed involved. Even our kids help with the event. Whether they want to or not, we're just gluttons for punishment.

Kelli Metcalf and her husband Jeff of Fort Madison raised their children around the high school rodeo.

"It's very near and dear to my heart," Kelli Metcalf said.

All three of our daughters grew up in those ranks and now I have a grandson from Dike, Iowa that's competing.

The Metcalfs were also part of the local rodeo boosters. She said she pushed Fort Madison High School to give an athletic letter to kids that participated in rodeo because it was a sport like anything else.

"It was a fight, but we got it done. I think Mic Loebach was AD back then and they set it up so the kids could letter. They had to keep their grades up and everything just like any other sport," she said.

Unfortunately, she thinks the financial aspect has pushed some families out of the

"It keeps a lot of families away. There is a lot of equipment and training required and the rodeos are spread out across the state. If mom and dad don't want to travel, that can be an issue," Metcalf said.

But she said there aren't better families that those participating in rodeo.

"I don't think you'll find a better group of families than your rodeo families. These families camp together. They come in on a Friday and spend Friday and Saturday at the campground. It's a family thing with your family and young ones. You sit around camps and it's family time."

Metcalf said the biggest change has been the vehicles that families are towing now, then back in her day.

"Nowadays you see a lot of fancy motor homes and rigs compared to what we saw in the early 90s. That surprises us more than anything."

She also said allowing junior high kids to compete is also a good change. Her children only were allowed to compete at the high school level.

Young said top performers in Fort Madison will advance to the Iowa High School Rodeo Championships in Des Moines, and the top four there in each category get to go to the National High School Rodeo event in Wyoming in June of 2024.

# Lady Hawks battle through two tie-breakers

and Central, all of whom finished 3-1 on the night, play a round robin of sorts with New London and Central Lee playing a 21-point tiebreaker after the regular pool play was completed.

The Hawks rolled past the Tigers 21-17, leaving the Tigers out of Saturday's final. The Tigers were the only team to beat Central Lee in regular play 21-18, 14-21, 8-15. New London's only loss was to Wapello, and then Central Lee tagged Wapello with a three-set loss in the final regular pool game of the night.

Central Lee Head Coach Amy Cook said the girls needed to get that big win over Wapello.

"Yesterday at practice focused on listening to each other. It was hard for some of them. But we needed a win. We just needed a win to prove to ourselves that we could do it," Cook said.

"We were just like 'what do you have to lose, it's just a game'. They're having fun now and hopefully that will give us some momentum going into Saturday."

Halle Lampe and Taylor Jones rose to the occasion in the final game against Wapello, knowing if they could beat the Arrows, they could force a tiebreaker.

The Lady Hawks fell in the opening set 16-21 and looked to be out of the finals on Saturday. A loss to Wapello would have left the Arrows at 4-0 on the night and New London at 3-1. They would have taken the two spots in the final, leaving the Hawks at home.

But in the second set, Central Lee looked to have found the energy they've been missing all year, racing to a 21-6 win.

Jones had four kills and a huge block in the win, while Lampe had three kills, including a nice little push to the corner on an attack for the win.

Jones said communication and confidence were the keys in the Lady Hawks' comeback.

"When we can communicate ourselves out of a rut, that helps us. We can't get the game back unless we communicate. We were good about that tonight. Everyone played with their heart in the end," Jones said.

"We really wanted this tournament. Nobody wanted to lose that last game when we had come that far.

Jones finished the night with 70 kills in six matches. She was also 45/50 serving with eight aces, had seven blocks, and 45 digs. Lampe had 45 kills, seven blocks, and 42 digs.

Josie Newton was 39-40 serving with seven aces. Brooklyn Jones was a perfect 32/32 serving, while Jalyn Hawk was 38/38 serving.

Cook said getting the No. 1 seed is huge for the Lady Hawks going into the tournament finals.

"We have been struggling with our team chemistry and we just needed a win, let alone being first seed. They see it now. As long as we're communicating and having fun, then everything else will fall into place," she

The Hawks got wins over WACO 21-15, 21-21, 15-9 to win the first round before falling to New London. They then downed L-M 21-10, 21-10 before going on the run with the wins over New London and Wapello.

Saturday's action at Loren Walker Arena starts at 5 p.m. Central Lee will take on Van Buren County, who finished as runner-ups in Pool 3 action. That match will take place following the first matches of the evening.



# HTC girls garner No. 1 seed for SEISC volleyball tourney

**TOURNEY:** Bendlage racks up 14 aces as Lady Crusaders roll through Pool play Thursday night

DANVILLE — Anna Bendlage wants accuracy on her serves.

The Holy Trinity junior hit her spots in Thursday's opening round of the SEI Superconference tournament.

Bendlage was 31-of-32 serving with 14 aces as the Crusaders swept their three matches to advance to Saturday's eight-team final night.

Holy Trinity, which moved up to No. 2 in the Class 1A state rankings earlier in the day, defeated Lone Tree (21-5, 21-8), Winfield-Mount Union (21-5, 21-11) and Danville (21-10, 21-10). Other than falling behind in the second set to Danville, the Crusaders were efficient in their approach.

"I think we knew we could take care of business, it was just a matter of doing it tonight," Bendlage said. "I think we did really well."



"We looked good," Holy Trinity coach Melissa Freesmeier said. "Didn't give up a lot of big runs. Maybe we had a few mistakes, but you're not going to get perfection. But I was happy with the way they just kept working, point by point."

Bendlage — who added six kills, 17 assists and 11 digs — led the way on a night when the Crusaders had just five service errors.

"I think I really just focused on hitting my spots," she said. "I serve really aggressively in practice, but not always in games, just because my goal is to just get it over. Tonight I wanted to serve more aggressively."

"She's got that left hand," Freesmeier said. "And that left hand has a different spin on it. She's got a lot of

movement on the ball."

Bendlage said serving is a top priority during the Crusaders' practices.

"Over time, in practice, I've learned how to serve more aggressively and get the ball when I need it to go," Bendlage said.

That's usually directed by Freesmeier, signaling behind her omnipresent folder.

"I think I'm pretty accurate," Bendlage said, smiling. "Tonight I was really good at it. She knows exactly where to put the ball, and I was able to hit those spots."

It was a night when every Crusader who played was successful with the serves. Taegan Denning (13-13, 1 ace), Adalyn Kruse (11-11, 2 aces), and Jenna Hellman (5-5, 1 ace) were perfect. Mary Kate Bendlage was 9-of-10 with three aces. Presley Myers was 23-of-25 with 3 aces. Natalie Randolph was 20-of-21 with one

Mary Kate Bendlage led the Crusaders with 19 kills and added 10 digs and two blocks. Kruse had 10 kills and a team-high eight blocks. Myers had 14 kills, four digs and a block. Randolph had eight kills, 27 assists and 13 digs. Denning had two kills and 11 digs. Teagan Snaadt had 27 digs and five assists.

Now it's on to Saturday, when the Crusaders will be the top seed.

"We're just hoping we can do the little things and take care of our side of the net," Freesmeier said. "We're going to be challenged all night — there's great defense in all of those teams. We've seen them game in and game out, so we know what our challenge will be."
