## **Tuesday storm** prompts order from Reynolds

**DECLARATION:** Governor issues disaster declaration for Des Moines County

DES MOINES – Gov. Kim Reynolds has issued a disaster proclamation for Des Moines County in response to severe storms that occurred on August 27 and continuing. The governor's proclamation allows state resources to be utilized to respond to and recover from the effects of this severe weather and activates the Iowa Individual Assistance Grant Program and Disaster Case Advocacy

The Iowa Individual Assistance Grant Program provides grants up to \$7,000 for households with incomes up to 200 percent of the federal poverty level. Grants are available for home or car repairs, replacement of clothing or food, and temporary housing expenses. Original receipts are required for those seeking reimbursement for actual expenses related to storm recovery. The grant application and instructions are available on the Iowa Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management website https://homelandsecurity.iowa.gov/ assistance. Potential applicants have 45 days from the date of the proclamation to apply.

The Disaster Case Advocacy Program addresses serious needs related to disaster-related hardship, injury, or adverse conditions. Disaster case advocates work with clients to create a disaster recovery plan and provide guidance, advice, and referrals to obtain a service or resource. There are no income eligibility requirements for this program; it closes 180 days from the date of the governor's proclamation. For information on the Disaster Case Advocacy Program, contact your local community action agency or visit iowacommunityaction.org.

### Hawks hoping to improve in District 5 football play

DONNELLSON - Central Lee's football team got off to a strong start last season

Then district play started.

The Hawks won all three of their non-district games, then went 0-5 in Class 2A District 5 play.

Turnovers proved to be the undoing of the Hawks once district play began, and that's something coach Doug Dodds knows his team has to be better at this season.

"We have to be as mistake-free as possible," he said. "Just take care of ourselves, not give up the big plays. We always want to take care of the football, limit big plays, things like that."

Central Lee outscored its non-district opponents 107-18 last season, but a 20-14 loss to Davis County in the district opener set the tone for the rest of the schedule.

Now it's a new season, and Dodds knows his team learned a lesson from last year.

Dodds liked how his team worked in the summer and how August camp has gone.

"It's been good, and we've had a positive camp," he said. "The guys work hard, come and do what they do. Just like always, the kids are always doing what we need to do."

Last week's scrimmage against Keokuk was a test to see where the Hawks are at heading into this Friday's season opener against Van Buren at Central Lee.

"It was good to get some game-speed experience for sure," Dodds said. "I mean, we needed that look. We got some guys some experience. We saw the things we needed to work on, which we needed.

"It was a different style too. So that's always good to see that. I mean, just to see our guys in space, how we're playing and things like that."

The Hawks return several key players on both sides of the ball. Senior Chase Johnson rushed for 492 yards and three touchdowns last season, and junior quarterback Kayden Calfee rushed for 471 yards and six touchdowns. Both return in an offense that also features senior running back Kegan Damico (48 rushing yards, 2 touchdowns) and Max Jones (76 yards).

Johnson, the Hawks' leading tackler with 55 stops last season, anchors the defense at linebacker.

"Defensively, we've picked up our scheme pretty well this year," Dodds said. "I

think you could see that defensively (in the scrimmage), we were responsible, played gap sound and things like that. I was proud of that.

"The biggest thing we've got to do is just control the line scrimmage. I mean, that's every week."

The Hawks play the same non-district opponents again this season — Van Buren and Durant (Sept. 13) at home and Cardinal (Sept. 6) on the road. Central Lee opens district play on Sept. 20 at Davis County, followed by home games against Albia (Sept. 27) and West Burlington-Notre Dame (Oct. 4), and road games against Mid-Prairie (Oct. 11) and Mediapolis (Oct. 18).

"Every week, we have to keep working," Dodds said. "We're ready to go, ready to get this season started."


Second Place went to Keokuk's Jarad and Jacob Flockart who netted a very respectful 14.41 lb.



# Keokuk gets \$15K for FFA work IUC gives pipeline

KEOKUK - The Keokuk High School was presented with a \$15,000 grant for the new Future Farmers of America (FFA) Chapter, which boasts 82 student members.

The FFA chapter is a part of the brand new Agriculture program that started this fall, which is a pathway for students as part of Career and Technical Education (CTE) at KHS.


"The FFA program is a huge opportunity for students of different backgrounds to participate in many different ways," Brady Martin, Agriculture Program director and FFA advisor at KHS, said. This grant, "helps eliminate barriers right off the bat because most of chapter funding comes from fundraisers in the fall and spring."

Martin applied for the grant in May through Farm Credit Services, the grant provides Ag programs with funds to start the program, and will be used to purchase extra FFA jackets for student members, pay for FFA trips and competitions, help students with dues, also purchase new equipment, banners and flags to run official meetings.

FFA members will show animals at the county and state fair level and go on trips around the State of Iowa and the United States to represent Keokuk.

"It is important to model for students what leadership is like and how important it is," Martin said. "They should be proud of the town they are a part of and want to make it a better place."

The addition of the Agriculture program at KHS was originally proposed based on the results of an

# permit to Summit **Carbon Solutions**

DES MOINES - The Iowa Utilities Commission (IUC) has found that Summit Carbon Solutions, LLC (Summit Carbon), has substantially complied with the requirements of the IUC's June 25, 2024, order regarding the company's application for a hazardous liquid pipeline permit and today has issued the permit under Iowa Code chapter 479B to Summit Carbon in Docket No. HLP-2021-0001. Today's order issuing the permit does not modify the conditions Summit Carbon must establish in order to start construction.

On June 25, 2024, the IUC issued its final decision and order regarding Summit Carbon's petition for hazardous liquid pipeline permit. As a part of its decision, the IUC required Summit Carbon to make numerous compliance filings with the IUC.

On August 5, 2024, Summit Carbon filed the compliance filings required by the IUC. The filings included revised petition exhibits. As it relates to the revised Exhibit H's, Summit Carbon states it made the required globally applicable changes to all outstanding Exhibit H's and made the modifications ordered by the IUC.

The IUC retains subject matter jurisdiction of this docket for purposes of receiving and acting upon such additional filings as may be appropriate.


