Fort Madison police nab suspect of last week's search

FORT MADISON - The suspect of a multi-jurisdictional search last week, has been taken into custody by the Fort Madison Police Tuesday afternoon.

According to a release from Fort Madison Police Chief Mark Rohloff, Dakota William Burgund, 34, of Fort Madison was apprehended at a residence southwest of the city limits at about 12:50 p.m..

Burgund was the subject of a Lee County CrimeStoppers posting concerning a previous apprehension attempt a week earlier.

Burgund had been sought by the Lee County Narcotics Task Force on drug charges when spotted by Fort Madison officers, leading them on a high-speed chase before abandoning his car in rural Lee County. A

Transplant no holiday for Holaday

Most everybody in Henry County, and a lot of SE Iowa, know Jim Holaday. Back in the early nineties he started a business called Holaday Satellite, installing 10' satellite dishes. Remember those? Jim's reputation as a hard worker and provider of excellent equipment and service was well established. He had a young man, Efrain Gutierrez, working for him who dug the 4' deep holes for the center post. The 10' dishes were soon replaced by the smaller saucers of Direct and Dish, and Jim Holaday worked seven days a week installing them.

Jim eventually sold Holaday Satellite to Efrain and became an employee of Holaday Satellite. The well known name of Holaday Satellite remained the same. Why change a name that's time honored?

Recently, Jim, in his mid sixties, noticed that he was, on occasion, short of breath. When this happened, he would take three aspirins and, in half-anhour, feel better. He didn't give it much thought. Efrain was doing most of the heavy work anyway, so it all worked out.

However, on June 3rd of this year, Jim was sitting in their Mt. Pleasant office sweating profusely. He soaked three paper towels. Efrain, not liking how Jim looked, said, "I'm taking you to the Emergency Room. Let's go."

"Naw. I'm all right," Jim said.

"Now. You're going."

Long story short, Efrain took Jim to the emergency room at Henry County Health Center (HCHC). HCHC transported Jim by ambulance to the



She was born on May 26, 1942 in Marshalltown to Oliver and Sarah Lovejoy Olson.







Suspect facing multiple charges Old heart became new life

SE Iowa Regional Health Center in Burlington (Great River Medial Center), and Great River air lifted Jim the next day to the University of Iowa Hospital. He was there a week-and-a-half. His heart was barely functioning, even after installing balloons to open up clogged arteries. They sent Jim home to die.

However, the heart of a 35-year old person became available. Jim was called back to the University of Iowa Hospital and they told him he was going to have a heart transplant the next morning. Jim actually video recorded the heart arriving at the hospital.

On Sunday morning, August 4th, at 6:00 am, Jim underwent eight-and-a-half hours of surgery to receive a new heart. He came to with a tube down his throat and another in his nose. He could barely move his arms, they were so swollen with fluid. But he was alive. He's just now starting to get his voice back.

All-in-all, Jim was in the hospital three months, minus the week-and-a-half he was home. It took him a while to regain the use of his hands to where he could feed himself. He thanks his life partner for the great care she gave and continues to give him.

Jim now sits in the office in Mt. Pleasant and lets Efrain do most of the work. Jim doesn't even answer the phone because it rings through to the Holaday Satellite office in Burlington. If someone walks into the Mt. Pleasant office, Jim will assist them. People hardly recognize him, he has lost so much weight. He is down to 138 lbs from 171. But people are happy to see him and amazed at his story of a heart attack and heart transplant. He turned 65 on July 5th. He will be on anti-rejection medication for the rest of his life. Jim thinks that by spring he will be able to do more work to assist Efrain who saved his life. Jim smiles and says that he doesn't like going out on the snow and ice anyway.

Amazingly, like a miser who won't throw anything away, the University of Iowa Hospital can use Jim's old heart for spare parts. The valves and arteries can be reused in other peoples' hearts. Modern medicine has come so far.

Jim wants everyone to know that he is alive and getting stronger everyday. You probably won't see him on a roof in the future, but he is here, with a new heart, to help Holaday Satellite usher in the era of live streaming. God willing.

Holy Trinity girls finding form with sweep of Mediapolis

FORT MADISON -Melissa Freesmeier knows every year she can count on her seniors to provide leadership.

It's how you become a power in Iowa high school volleyball, and Freesmeier has two seniors playing big roles on Holy Trinity's team this season.

Anna Bendlage and Teagan Snaadt have become big voices within the Crusaders, and they provided some of the big plays in Tuesday's 25-22, 25-16, 25-23 win over Mediapolis at Shottenkirk Gym.

Holy Trinity, ranked No. 5 in Class 1A, took sole possession of the SEI Superconference South Division lead with the win.

"Any time you can get a sweep in the South, it's a good night," Freesmeier

Freesmeier has stressed that this is a young team, but Bendlage and Snaadt have helped make sure the Crusaders' progression through the early part of the season has continued.

"I think it's just building their confidence up, telling them you are good enough to be out here, you're playing on one of the best teams and the best programs around, that you just have to know that if you're out on this court, you're a really good player, and you're meant to be out there," said Snaadt, the

Crusaders' libero.

Both have been perfect fits into Freesmeier's system.

"Anna's not usually the person that's loud on the court, but she's stepping up and doing that this year, and I know her teammates appreciate it," Freesmeier said. "She's always cheering. She's never down. She just keeps them pumped up. So I think that's huge for us.

"Teagan is just so solid, a real competitor, who does so many good things for us. To have those two as senior leaders has really made a difference for us."

Freesmeier praised the court vision of Bendlage, the team's setter.

"She comes up with big plays, finds the open spots on the floor and just does the little things that make us better," Freesmeier said. "I'm happy with what she's doing, leading our offense and finding new ways to help us."

Bendlage used misdirection and tips to find openings in Mediapolis' aggressive defense, coming up with key points in the second and third sets.

"I think Melissa has done a good job of telling us to be patient," Bendlage said. "Like when they're blocking, wait and see where their hands are. Same with when they are playing defense, if you can just be patient, you can find holes in their defense."

The Crusaders (4-2 overall, 3-0 division) have im-

proved on their aggressiveness on offense throughout their current three-match winning streak.

"I think we've been working at swinging hard at everything instead of tipping," Bendlage said. "Sometimes tonight, when they went on their runs, you really saw us tipping the ball. One of the things we have to remember is to swing at everything."

Holy Trinity had 44 kills, led by Presley Myers' 17. Adalyn Kruse had 10.

The Crusaders play Thursday at New London.

"I feel like we're coming as a team," Freesmeier said. "We got better tonight, we'll get better tomorrow in the gym, then we'll go play New London on Thursday."

Utility board grants Alliant electric, gas rate hike

DES MOINES - The Iowa Utilities Commission (IUC) has issued its final decision and order in Docket No. RPU-2023-0002 regarding a request from Interstate Power and Light Company, a subsidiary of Alliant Energy (Alliant), to increase Iowa retail customer electric and natural gas rates.

On October 12, 2023, Alliant filed with the IUC an application seeking an increase in electric and natural gas rates and requesting a revenue increase of approximately \$284 million in electric rates and a revenue increase of approximately \$14 million for natural gas rates.

On June 20, 2024, a non-unanimous partial settlement was filed requesting the IUC approve a reduction in the annual electric rate revenue increase to \$185 million and a return on equity reduction from 10.0% to 9.65%. For Alliant's natural gas rate increase, the settlement reduced the requested amount to \$10 million. The return on equity would also be 9.65%. Parties to the settlement were the Office of Consumer Advocate, a division of the Iowa Department of Justice; the Iowa Business Energy Coalition; Walmart; and Alliant.

The IUC's order approves the non-unanimous partial settlement agreement and resolves other contested issues in the case. The order:

- Increases the average residential monthly charge for electric customers from \$13 to \$15.50.
 - Approves a conditional electric rate base moratorium through October 2029.
 - Implements a rate increase cap of 15% for each customer class.
- Denies proposals to assess a management efficiency penalty against Alliant.
- Requires Alliant to file updated responses to its 2012 Management Efficiency Audit and its Stakeholder Engagement and Customer Satisfaction Plan within six months after final rates are implemented.
- Requires Alliant to notify customers of bill impacts as an outcome of the rate proceeding within 30 days of new rates being implemented.

The IUC ordered Alliant to file compliance filings and associated tariffs within 30 days of today's order based on the decision and documents in this rate case proceeding. Rate changes for customers will take effect upon the IUC's review and approval of the compliance tariffs.

Under Iowa law, because Alliant used a future test year to determine rates, the IUC will conduct a subsequent proceeding to determine whether the actual costs and revenues are reasonably consistent with those approved by the IUC. This will occur approximately 15 months after the new customer rates become effective.

As part of the proceedings in this rate case, the IUC received hundreds of written public comments and held three in-person public consumer comment meetings throughout Alliant's Iowa service territory and one virtual comment meeting.
