The U-Fitness Wellness Room and Gym at 204 E. Wheat Ave. keeps people in motion by offering weight and cardio machines, free weights, a basketball court, gymnastics mats and personal training sessions and advice with the GCRC staff.

Daily and annual memberships to U-Fitness are available. Wellness classes such as Zumba, Yoga, Kickboxing and PiYo, are included in the membership to the U-Fitness Wellness Room. Fitness hours: are 5am-8:30pm, Monday-Thursday; Friday 5am-8pm. 24/7 access to U-Fitness is available with a membership.

The GCRC Activities Center/Teen Center at 120 W. Grant Ave. is a hub for gamers and leisure enthusiasts alike. Foosball, pool tables, a ping-pong table, an open gym, basketball court, a big screen TV and Nintendo Wii games are available. The Teen Center is perfect for private parties and company functions. 
The Rec has top-notch indoor and outdoor swimming pools. Daily admission, monthly and annual memberships, and



Dick Kreie Baseball Complex

Located west of the Grant County Civic Center, 1000 W. Patterson. Softball and soccer fields are just east and west of the Civic Center. The county fair-grounds, rodeo grounds, and a park with playground equipment and picnic shelters are also located at the Civic Center Complex.

Memorial Park

Located directly across the street from the Bob Wilson Memorial Hospital, 400 N. Main. It provides a quiet, peaceful spot to rest and reflect. Local scouting facilities are nearby.

Prairie Winds Park

Located next to the Grant County Recreation Wellness Center and pool complex, 204 E. Wheat, and features picnic shelters and playground equipment.

Barb Dye Park

Located on South Cheyenne street. Playground equipment, a basketball court, and a spacious picnic shelter make this an inviting place for friends and family gatherings.

Russ Binney Park

Located across from the Post Office, 208 S.Baughman. Landscaped with beautiful flowers and plants and a walking path, the park is a wonderful place to visit. Playground equipment is also available.

St. Mary's Park

Located on the corner of San Jacinto and College, next to Mary Queen of Peace Catholic Church, across the street from Celebration Baptist Church and is in the shadow of the Ulysses water tower. It has playground equipment on the east side, and a field for ball games on the west.

There is so much to see and do, bring the family out and have a great time at the 74th annual Grant County Fair!











The premier Historic Adobe Museum in Ulysses is steeped in history right down to the building it is housed in. The adobe building, built in the 1930s, is amazing given the circumstances of the era and the tenacity of the people who con structed it.

The adobe building, constructed in 1937-38 as a machine shop for Grant County, was one of six WPA projects funded in Grant County between 1935-1938. The walls are composed of adobe blocks laid with mud mortar. Upon comple tion, the exterior adobe walls were covered with cement stucco and whitewashed. During the 1970s, the adobe county shop building was converted to a museum and the whitewashed adobe walls were painted a buff clay color, more in step with natural adobe. Adobe fireplaces with brick hearths stand in the two front rooms.


The museum has evolved to a gallery-style look with artifacts placed in natural settings, making this premier museum a must-see for all museum enthusiasts. The displays are enhanced with murals by artist Larry Britton. Visitors are treated to scenic panoramas that tell the story of life on the High Plains and give a glimpse into the lifestyle of the nomadic Indians and adventurous pioneers who settled the area. An Indian encampment, a sod house and a freight wagon loaded with trade goods are just a few of the tableaus created in the Museum gallery for viewing life in south west Kansas from the mid-1880s to the present.

The Hotel Edwards, built in 1887 in Old Ulysses, was cut into three sections and moved along with the entire town to the site of New Ulysses in 1909. Complete with period furnishings, it is now located at the museum complex.

The District #1 one-room school, also authentically furnished and on museum grounds, is used by area schools to enhance field trip experiences.

The museum features special exhibits throughout the year and hosts Holiday Open Houses the first two Sundays in December.
