General Rules and Regulations

Premiums: \$5, \$4, \$3 (Unless stated otherwise)
See 4-H & FFA Rules- Exhibitors should carefully note SPECIAL RULES listed under the various departments in which they are exhibiting-

1- In no event shall the Grant County Fair, or its officers, directors or members be held

responsible for any loss or damage to the property or persons of exhibitor or other persons while on the Fairgrounds whether said loss or damage shall arise from an accident or any cause whatsoever-

2- ONLY RESIDENTS OF GRANT COUNTY AND APPROVED FAMILIES ARE ELIGIBLE TO EXHIBIT IN THE 4-H, FFA and OPEN CLASS AREAS OF THE FAIR.

3- All animals must be kept and cared for by the exhibitor.

4- Stall cards will be provided by the Fair Office and MUST be displayed on the appropriate stall/pen.

5- No person may make more than one entry per class and entries must have been made or produced since last year's Fair (except where stated otherwise). The exhibits must be the handwork of the exhibitor where skill is required, the owner when agricultural or hobbies are entered.

6- Ribbons and premiums will be given to all exhibits based on quality.

7- No Premium shall be awarded upon an article or animal unless a class is designated

8- Any exhibitor or superintendent attempting to interfere with the judges during the adjudications or who publicly expresses disapproval in the arena or grounds, of the decision of the judges shall forfeit premiums.

9- All entries including open class Livestock must be entered on an entry card before entering at the

Fair. EACH EXHIBITOR WILL BE ISSUED AN EXHIBITOR'S NUMBER, and this number along with name, address, division and class number must be on all entries. Exhibitor's number and card will be available at the Extension Office and Fair Board Office before the Fair and on the Fairgrounds on entry day (Tuesday)- Please make sure cards are filled out COMPLETELY before entries are brought to the Fair.

10- ALL EXHIBITS except open class livestock (only required to be on grounds during livestock shows) must be in place in designated areas on the fairgrounds by 10:00am, Tuesday, and remain in place until 10:00am, Saturday. EXHIBITS REMOVED BEFORE 10:00AM WILL FORFEIT ALL PREMIUMS. Exhibits left after 12:00pm on Saturday, are left at owner's risk Release of Livestock will be immediately after floored animals are loaded and superintendent has approved release on

Saturday, July 24th, 2021.

11- Premiums awarded by the Judges will be distributed from 10:00am to 12:00pm on Saturday, in the South Room at the Civic Center/Fairgrounds-

12- Open Class reservations will be needed for booths- Call the Fair Board Office (356-1808) by June 1st, 2021- 4-H reservations should be made to the Extension Office (356-1721).

13- 4-H and FFA members may not enter the same animal or project in Open Class and in the 4-H or FFA Division.

14- The use of ATVs and other unauthorized vehicles by underage drivers is prohibited on Fairgrounds.

15- The Fair Board, through its management, makes all rules and regulations governing the Grant County Fair and reserves the final and absolute right to interpret and enforce the existing rules and regulations.

General Rules and Regulations - Livestock Division

All general rules on the preced-

ing page(s) apply to livestock.

1- Open class livestock are not required to be stalled at the Fairgrounds and need only be present during their respective shows.

2- All open class livestock exhibitors must have an open class exhibitor number to pre-register their animals.

3- All animals must be kept and cared for by Exhibitor.

4- NOTE SPECIAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS UNDER EACH DIVISION- The Animal Health Check In Committee may refuse to check in animals showing signs of disease or that for any reason may endanger other animals, exhibitors or spectators.

5- Animals that require a tranquilizer shall be removed from the Fairgrounds as soon as possible.

7- 4-H and FFA members may not enter the same animal in Open Class that is entered and shown in the 4-H/FFA division(s) with the exception of PeeWee

Showmanship.

8- PeeWee Showmanship will be held prior to the 4-H Showmanship classes for each of the following species: Market Beef, Bucket Calf, Goats, Sheep and Swine. Participants must be younger than 7 years of age on January 1st and may use their own animal or a 4-H animal. Participants must not be enrolled in 4-H- Participants may have adult assistance and will receive an award only and will not receive premium money.

9- Other members of a 4-H family will be allowed to ride a 4-H ID'ed horse in Open Class performance classes (not in conformation classes).

10- Livestock registered with multiple breeding associations may only be shown in one conformation class.

3- The Beef Show will be "Blow and Show"- The use of paint, glue/adhesives, hair coloring, spray painting, hoof painting and boning soaps WILL NOT BE ALLOWED. Show Sheen will be allowed. Any attempt to alter the animal's color or breed characteristics including the addition of hair or other added material, natural or manmade is prohibited. Animals will be checked before entering the ring and violators will be disqualified. Open class beef will be judged by breed; age will determine class. Add following letters to class numbers to determine breed: H-Hereford; A-Angus; SH-Shorthorn; CC-Charolais Cross; SC-Simmental Cross; OC-Other Cross; G-Gelbvieh-

Any attempt to alter the animal's color or breed characteristics including the addition of hair or other added material, natural or manmade is prohibited. Animals will be checked before entering the ring and violators will be disqualified.
3- Sheep with active, oily fungus will not be allowed to show.
4- The Superintendent of the Sheep department is authorized to refuse entry of animals show-

ing signs of any communicable disease and those animals will not be allowed to remain on the premises to exhibit.

5- All sheep must be owned by exhibitor for at least 30 days prior to the opening of the fair.
6- All sheep must be slick shorn, including head area, at time of check-in and inspection.

Show Sheen will be allowed- Any attempt to alter the animal's color or breed characteristics including the addition of hair or other added material, natural or manmade is prohibited. Animals will be checked before entering the ring and violators will be disqualified.

3- The Superintendent of the Goat department is authorized to refuse entry of animals showing signs of any communicable disease and those animals will not be allowed to remain on the premises to exhibit.

4- Goats with active, oily fungus will not be allowed to show based on health committee judgment.

5- All market & dairy goats must be clipped with an even length of hair covering above hocks and knees at time of check in and inspection. Goats with hair covering in excess of .40" will not be checked in until clipped.

6- Breeding goats may be shown in hair.

7- Does may not be shown in both market and breeding classes.

8- Goats may be braced for

judging, however, after animal is set all four feet must be on the ground.

9- Goats may be shown with chain collar or show halter- Nylon collars will not be permitted.

10- Goats must be under a year old and still have milk teeth.

11- Horns must be tipped but horns are allowed.

5- THE POULTRY DISEASE CONTROL ACT provides that all poultry, including exhibition, exotic and game birds, but excluding waterfowl, going to public exhibition shall originate from a U-S- Pullorum-Typhoid or equivalent flock or have a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within 90 days of the date of the exhibit- Proof of testing must be presented at time of entering exhibit- A veterinarian will not be present at Fair entry time. A Champion and Reserve Champion will be chosen from each class- An Overall Champion and an Overall Reserve Champion will be chosen from Class Champions.

11 Suggestions for Crops & Garden Exhibit

1- Most exhibits ripe or mature (plump)- Some exceptions: most green vegetables- For example: snap beans, okra, summer squash, cucumbers, etc.

2- All exhibits clean- No foreign material, no insects, no dirt; but do not skin onions.

3- All exhibits sound or whole- No broken ends on green beans; no tipped ears of corn, rhubarb or cucumbers- NO insect or disease damage or mechanical injury.

4- Stems cut not broken- The following should have stems:

A) Milo - 1/3 the length of the head (cut at uniform angle)

B) Green or wax beans, green tomatoes - 1/4" stems

C) Beets, carrots, turnips and pumpkins - 1" to 3"

D) Egg plant, okra, peppers, squash, cucumbers - 1/2" stem cut

E) Radishes - leaves left on

F) Rhubarb - leave 1/4" of leaf on pulled stalk

5- No stem on cantaloupes, mature onions (1/4") or tomatoes.

6- Remove roots from cabbage, cauliflower, kohlrabi, lettuce,

onions and spinach- Remove side roots from beets, carrots, radishes and turnips.

7- Sweet corn exhibit with inner husks on- Leave enough leaves (husks) to cover top of ear- No tipping, worms or worm damage-

8- Average size specimens.

9- Uniform in size, shape, color, quality, texture and degree of maturity.

10- Type - typical of variety

11- Protein, Test Weight, Dockage, General Appearance, Shrunken & Broken, Crop Data Card - these things will be checked for during judging- Top samples will be taken to the Kansas State Fair.

A Champion and Reserve will be picked from each category (SMALL GRAINS; LEGUMES; CORN; GRAIN SORGHUM; FORAGE; GRASS and MISCELLANEOUS FARM CROPS).

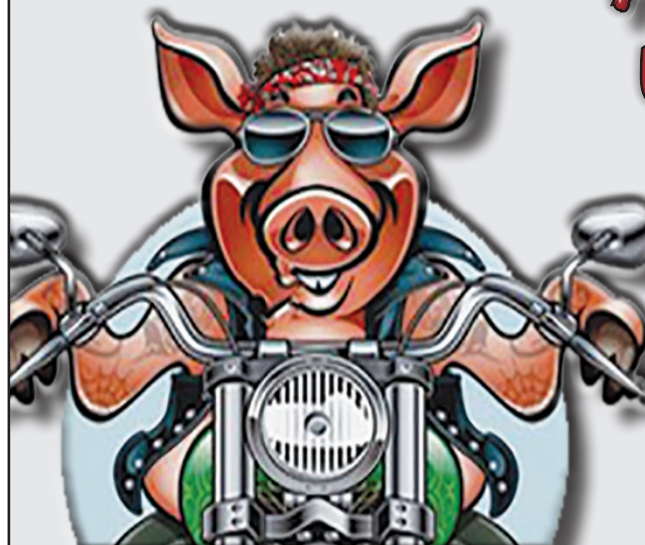
