Everything You Wanted to Know about Levies and Bonds

Part 1 of 2 parts

If you live within the Cascade School District (CSD) boundaries, your tax statement shows five line items related to education. Why we have five different items can lead to some head-scratching.

Thus, in a series of two articles, the school taxes will be illuminated to show how they are distinct and why they are all important.

Washington state collects two of the taxes and then redistributes them to every school district across the state. On your tax statement you'll see "State School" and "State School 2." There used to be only one line item for the state. The Second State School Levy started showing up on tax statements in 2018, in response to the McCleary case, which found WA State inadequately funding districts of varying assessed property

values. The state needed to start collecting more money for schools to cover salaries, particularly for the mandated all-day kindergarten and low class sizes for K-3rd grade.

The other local taxes that fund CSD show up as "Cascade SD 228 Bond," "Cascade SD 228 Cap Proj" and "Cascade SD 228 General." The first one is the bond voters passed in 2015 to build the three new schools. The latter two are levies, each with a specific purpose.

Let's Talk about Levies

Some confusion has derived from the fact that the "Cascade SD 228 General" is known by many names. In the past it was called the Maintenance and Operations (M&O) Levy, now it's called the Education Programs and Operations (EP&O) Levy, while at the state level it's referred to as the Enrichment levy.

This (henceforth known as) EP&O levy has been capped by the state

at \$1.50 in 2019, the rate charged per \$1000 assessed property value. This cap, combined with the "State School 2" money, represent a "levy swap," allowing schools to get their needed funds without gouging less financially backed districts.

The state money is based upon a "prototypical school model." When the CSD school board hears of needs that aren't being met, those are considered "unfunded mandates," that they can aim to cover through the local levies.

It's not a perfect system, but CSD benefits because, given our relatively high assessed value, it has an EP&O rate of only \$1.18 in 2019, the lowest in the county.

Both the EP&O levy and the Capital Project levy follow four-year cycles, last approved in 2017, and up for the next approval in 2021.

The EP&O levy renews funding for critical programs not covered by basic state money. These programs

include music, art, athletics, other electives, advanced classes, intervention specialists, counselors and helps supplement transportation, food services and special education.

For instance, CSD has higher transportation costs than most districts because our busses drive great distances on their circuitous routes. The EP&O funding supplements gas and vehicle wear and tear. In addition, the school board and administration have decided that two state-covered counselors are not enough to meet the needs of six schools. So CSD has three counselors, one at the elementary schools, one at the middle school and one at the high school.

The current Capital Project levy, which costs taxpayers only \$.13 per \$1000 in 2019, covers technology, safety and security upgrades. With this levy, Icicle River Middle School's security features have been updated to match the standards of the new

schools. This includes a camera system and a badge-operated entry system. This levy also provides additional support for keeping technology current throughout the District. The 2013 version of this levy had a broader focus; it paid for needed athletic facility improvements including lights and restroom facilities.

These two levies, up for renewal in 2021, are critical to meet the needs and provide opportunities for all students in the CSD. Without these funds, the District's budget would shrink by 17% and programs labeled "exploratory curriculum," offering students a chance to learn outside the core classes, would suffer, as would support infrastructure relating to special ed and mental health.

Stay tuned for the next installment which will serve as a refresher about the bond, how taxes are calculated and Cascade School District's financial position compared to other school districts.

Chicken Marsala over Rice

It's a time to offer thanks, and I am SO grateful for this wonderfully easy and tasty chicken recipe, which keeps me from having to make fried chicken!

The first time I made Chicken Marsala in my Instant Pot, my husband Charlie declared it was the best chicken he'd ever eaten.

"Better than fried chicken?"

I asked. "Much better. Best chicken, ever!"

While in Germany visiting our daughter this summer, I haunted the aisles of the smaller German markets, seeking out the spices and chicken to make Chicken Marsala for her in her own Instant Pot.

Finally, I had gathered together everything I needed except for the Marsala wine. With my broken German, I tried to explain what I was looking for, but none of the markets I visited had any.

"Let's try Kaufland, the supermarket at the edge of town," she suggested. Kaufland did have wine, four full aisles of it. But sadly, no Marsala. After half an hour of fruitless searching, we gave up and settled on a bottle of sherry. With the sherry instead of the Marsala, the chicken was tender, but it was

very bland. And it DESPERATELY needed some salt.

I've served this over mashed potatoes, pasta, even mashed cauliflower. But it is especially good with rice, and I've included my favorite rice recipe for you as well. The recipe comes from an Instant Pot cookbook from Jennifer Robins. You don't have to do Paleo to enjoy the recipes, though. I've made over a dozen of them and they've all been wonderful.

I suggest that you NOT substitute the Marsala with any other cooking wine in this recipe. Just saying...

Chicken Marsala in the Instant Pot Makes 4 servings

Prep Time: 5 minutes

Cooking Time: 28 minutes

- ◆ 4 tbsp (60 ml) avocado oil
- ◆ 1 onion, chopped
- ◆ 20 oz (560 g) sliced mushrooms
- ◆ 1 tsp sea salt
- ◆ 1 tbsp (3 g) dried parsley
- ◆ 1 tsp garlic powder

- ◆ ½ tsp ground black pepper
- ◆ ¾ cup (180 ml) Marsala wine
- ◆ 2 lbs (900 g) chicken, chopped
- ◆ ½ cup (120 ml) chicken broth

1. Press the Sauté button on your Instant Pot, then pour in the avocado oil, letting it warm up for a minute before adding the onion and mushrooms to the hot oil. Stir for about 10 minutes, or until the mushrooms begin to brown.

2. Add the sea salt, dried parsley, garlic powder, pepper and Marsala wine, stirring to distribute the seasonings. Allow them to simmer for about 2 minutes.

3. Add the chopped chicken and chicken broth. Put on the lid of your Instant Pot, lock it and close the pressure valve. Press the Keep Warm/Cancel button, then the Pressure Cook/Manual button. Press the +/- buttons until you have 8 minutes displayed.

4. After the cooking cycle is complete, open the pressure valve for a quick release of pressure, then when the pressure drops enough to allow you to, remove the lid. Use a slotted spoon to remove the meat, onions and mushrooms from the Instant Pot, press the Keep Warm/

Cancel button, and then press the Sauté button.

5. Allow the sauce to simmer, boiling off extra liquid to thicken the sauce, for about 10 minutes. Serve over rice, mashed potatoes, or pasta.

I arrived back home 3 hours later to find my favorite pan filled to the brim with the gummiest, stickiest, crustiest mess you could imagine! I never dared to cook rice on the stove again... until now. Mark Bittman's recipe for short- or medium-grain rice is SO easy, and always turns out perfect.

My Favorite Way to Cook Rice Makes 4 servings. Takes about 45 minutes, but keeps very well.

◆ 1 ½ cups short- or medium-grain rice, well rinsed and drained (rinse until water runs clear)

◆ 2 ½ cups water

◆ 1 tsp salt, or to taste

1. Combine rice, water and salt in a medium saucepan and let sit for about 30 minutes. The rice will absorb most of the water.

2. Cover the pan, then place it over high heat to bring it to a boil. Once boiling, turn down heat to medium-low and cook, undisturbed, for 15 minutes.

3. Turn off the heat. The rice will be done in 10 minutes, and will hold up for up to 1 hour. From: How to Cook Everything, by Mark Bittman.

Treating hair loss

My 60-year-old brother Dennis is lean and fit today, but yet nearly unrecognizable from his high school senior yearbook photo. That's because it shows him with a full head of hair.



Hair loss affects nearly half of Americans, with the most common type the one experienced by my brother: androgenic alopecia, which is male hormone-related hair loss.

Female pattern baldness takes longer to develop and creates an overall thinning of hair, with more scalp showing where they part their hair.

Androgenic alopecia is a genetic condition affecting both women and men. Male pattern baldness shows up as a receding

hairline, with nearly 80% of white males affected by the age of 70. Female pattern baldness takes longer to develop and creates an overall thinning of hair, with more scalp showing where they part their hair.

Our hair grows out of a specialized set of cells in our skin called hair follicles, and grows in 2 phases: a longer growing phase

and a shorter resting phase. During the growing phase, a brand-new hair grows up from the follicle through the skin and then keeps growing above the skin about 1 inch per month. This growth continues for about 3-5 years before changing to the resting phase.

In the resting phase, each hair stays at the same length for about 1-2 years, after which time it falls out as a new growth phase begins with a new hair.

About 90% of our hair is in a growth cycle while the other 10% is in a resting cycle. The longer your hair's growth cycle and faster it grows, the longer your hair can get. Your eyelashes are shorter than your hair because their growth cycle is only 30 days instead of 2-8 years and their resting cycle is only 105 days instead of 1-2 years.

When we were babies, we had 2 main types hair: lots of very short, very fine, colorless and nearly invisible hair called vellus hair, and thicker, hair with pigment on our heads and eyelashes, called terminal hair. At puberty, under the influence of sex hormones, much of our vellus hair changed to terminal hair, resulting in noticeable hair growing in your armpits and along your arms and legs, as well as covering your pubic area. Puberty changes male vellus hair to terminal hair on the face, creating the need to shave and the ability to grow a beard and mustache.

My brother has the most common cause of hair loss, androgenic alopecia. Inside the hair follicles, a special enzyme changes testosterone to its cousin, dihydrotestosterone (DHT). While testosterone stimulates hair growth, DHT does the opposite, triggering hair loss. DHT shortens the growth phase of hair, lengthens hair's resting phase, and changes the type of hair growing back.

In both men and women, shifting testosterone to DHT changes how hair regrows. The thicker, colored terminal hair of the scalp grows back as very thin, very short and colorless vellus hair. You have the same amount of hairs, but the vellus hair is nearly invisible, and some of it doesn't grow long enough to extend above your scalp, creating hair loss.

Hair loss for women with androgenic alopecia starts later in life and progresses more gradually. Women are not as severely affected because they have less testosterone available to shift to DHT and female enzymes that can shift testosterone to estrogen instead of DHT.

One non-prescription treatment for hair loss is Rogaine®, 5% for men and 2% for women. Its active ingredient, minoxidil, was originally designed to lower blood pressure, but people taking it kept noticing hair growth. Further research revealed that minoxidil applied to the scalp increased blood flow to the hair follicles, directly stimulating them. Minoxidil prolongs the growth phase of hair and changes resting hair back into growing hair.

Years ago, before the Food and Drug Administration approved minoxidil as Rogaine®, I'd grind up minoxidil tablets to make a solution to apply to the scalp for hair loss, even making up several prescriptions of it for my own brother.

4 Tips on Dealing with Hair Loss:

1. Avoid pulling on your hair. Braiding your hair or pulling it back tightly can cause breakage and permanent hair loss.
2. Try hair products that create volume. Hair gels, sprays, and permanents can give the illusion of fullness and disguise thinning hair.
3. Be patient. It may take 4 months or more for men and 8 months for women to see results with Rogaine®, and you must continue using it to keep the hair you've gained.
4. Talk to your doctor. Instead of from genetics, hair loss can be from a treatable medical condition.
