Burning Restrictions Drop in Portions of Eastern Washington

Lower Temperatures and Rain Ease Fire Danger

OLYMPIA - The Washington State Department of Natural Resources (DNR) announced today that burning restrictions have been lowered in many portions of eastern Washington on DNR-protected lands.

This became effective Sept. 18, 2019 at 12:01 a.m. Rule and permit burns are allowed in most areas,

however, there are still burn restrictions in a few areas. Please check with the local fire district or visit https:// fortress.wa.gov/dnr/protection/firedanger/ before lighting any fire.

Campfires may be allowed in designated approved campgrounds. Always check first with the campground host before lighting a campfire. Individual campgrounds may still prohibit campfires.


Also, follow the conditions of the burn permit, and be careful when burning by following these simple steps: I. Check before burning by calling I-800-323-BURN (2876) or visiting https://fortress.wa.gov/dnr/protection/ firedanger/ for current burning conditions.

- 2. Put a firebreak around your fire.
- 3. Never leave fire unattended.
- 4. Put the fire completely out every night.
- 5. If wind speeds increase, put out your fire.

DNR's wildfire mission

Administered by Commissioner of Public Lands Hilary Franz, DNR is responsible for preventing and fighting wildfires on 13 million acres of private, state and tribalowned forestlands.

DNR is the state's largest on-call fire department and participates in Washington's coordinated interagency approach to firefighting.

Gov. Inslee cuts ribbon to future in Cashmere

CASHMERE – Governor Jay Inslee cut the ceremonial grand opening ribbon at the old Cashmere Mill District site, Monday, Sept. 16, for the newest tenants of the Port of Chelan just constructed, multi-million dollar business park.

Both state representatives Mike Steele and Keith Goehner were in attendance as well as State Senator Brad Hawkins and Chelan County Commissioner Kevin Overbay.

The focus of the event was to show community support for Blue Spirits Distilling, LLC and Hurst International, LLC and it seemed to work quite well as the seating was full with another group of folks standing in various places.

The event was catered by Cashmere's wn Tagueria el Chavo and also featured a guided tour of the Hurst printing facil-

Governor Inslee said he was excited that this particular facility could produce 15 million fruit labels per day. He was personally guided on a tour by Hurst CEO Ari Lichtenberg.



Blue Spirits Managing Member Jeff Soehren spoke to the audience and told them his company will become the "largest distiller in the state" once the Cashmere plant gets going at full capacity.

Blue Spirits Managing Member Jeffrey Soehren announced he had already employed 20 workers averaging \$30 per hour. Cashmere Mayor Jim Fletcher said that it was not too long ago that he worked with Jeff as an small business economic advisor. "He was working out of his garage in Chelan," Fletcher said.

Lichtenberg took the podium and promised the community that his company was "here to stay and working with agriculture companies is our future."

Soehren spoke to the audience and told them his company will become the "largest distiller in the state" once the Cashmere plant gets going at full capac-

Inslee told the crowd, "It isn't often that the Department of Ecology is credited with job creation."

He was referring to the state department helping the Port of Chelan clean the former toxic waste site and making it suitable for new businesses.

The Port of Chelan's Commission President JC Baldwin was the emcee for the event and several other port commissioners from Chelan and Douglas county were also in attendance.

Alicia felt that the story was an appropriate representation of the culture for the audience and expertly directed a discussion pointing out the similarities between our culture and theirs by focusing on the correlation between the style of dress, the housing structures and festive celebrations.

Alicia showed videos taken in Bole, Ghana of the local people celebrating the harvest and correlated it with our own harvest celebrations like the Apple Days in Cashmere and Thanksgiving.

The next "Read Around the World" event will focus on the Dia de Los Muertos in Mexico where visitors young and old can learn about the holiday and explore more about the culture.

In the book "Innocents Abroad" Mark Twain states "travel is fatal to prejudice, bigotry, and narrow-mindedness, and many of our people need it sorely on these accounts. Broad, wholesome, charitable views of man and things cannot be acquired by vegetating in one little corner of the earth all one's lifetime."

The Kodiaks had their first loss of the year against a tough Mount Baker Defense that shut down Cascades offense holding them to only 178 total yards against 385 for the Mountaineers.

The Kodiak defense played tough throughout the game but couldn't stop the opponents completely.

To their credit they did capture the opponents in the end zone for a safety in the third quarter. But it was the only score the Kodiaks put up for the night.

Three pass interceptions ended much of the Kodiak offensive drive and as coach Dominique Coffin said, "we

had our opportunities we just didn't finish well. We had too many turnovers."
