

## Open burning now prohibited

WENATCHEE - On Tuesday, May 30, Chelan County commissioners passed a resolution designating the unincorporated areas of Chelan County as under a moderate fire hazard level.

With the moderate designation, several general restrictions go into place beginning June 1 in the county's unincorporated areas. Among those restrictions are:

**Open burning is prohibited.**

Motorists cannot drive off a county roadway, except to access open public lands.

The use of exploding targets and incendiary ammunition is prohibited.

Recreational fireworks are prohibited in Chelan County. Sky lanterns are banned across the state and nation.

Recreational campfires con-

tinue to be allowed in a designated campfire area, including a portable fire pit.

Chelan County is divided into two fire danger zones: Valley and Chelan Mountain. The moderate fire hazard level applies to both zones.

In addition, there are four fire hazard levels in the county: moderate, high, very high and extreme. Restrictions are labeled as either general or Stage 1 or Stage 2. During wild-fire season, the fire marshal, local fire chiefs and partner agencies meet weekly to assess local conditions and discuss updating the fire hazard level and restriction level.

Keep up on the changing fire hazard levels and restriction levels by following Chelan County on Facebook or watching for updates on the Chelan County Fire Marshal's website. The full Fire Hazard Areas code is under chapter 7.52 of the Chelan County Code.

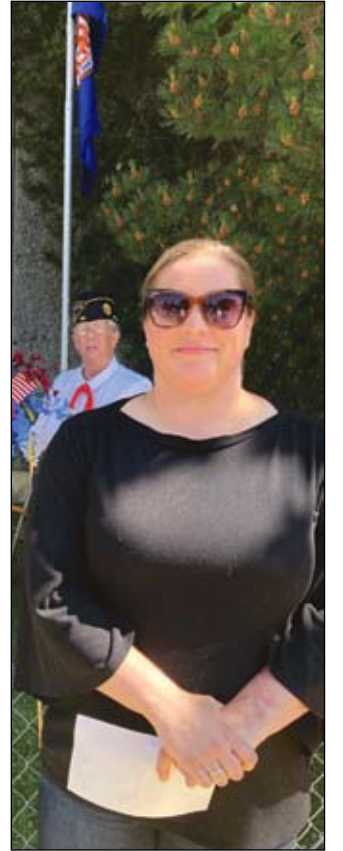

# Ohme Gardens hosting fundraiser concert July 9

WENATCHEE - Ohme Gardens is hosting a concert, July 9, to raise matching money for grants to improve the gardens. "Music in the Gardens" will feature the community inspirational choir, GladSong, and there will be a silent auction of an original painting of the gardens by Ginger Reddington, of Twisp, donated by Kim Reid of Wenatchee. The gardens is located just north of Wenatchee.

"Ohme Gardens truly is a community treasure that the whole community can get behind," said Tim Meyer, director of GladSong. "The Ohme family had the vision

decades ago to create an alpine meadow on the bluffs overlooking the Columbia River and the community can keep that vision going. We would like to see individuals and businesses step up in a big way," Meyer said.

Samantha Segaline, director of Ohme Gardens, said she hopes the concert will generate matching money needed to apply for a grant to restore and rebuild the gardens' Ox Yoke picnic shelter. She said the project may be completed for under \$100,000 but that it might cost closer to \$200,000.

The gardens also needs matching money for grants for lighting and paving its parking lot which easily will cost more than an additional \$200,000 she said.

Ohme Gardens is owned and operated by Chelan County. "People hear that and assume we are county funded, but we are self-supporting. All of our operating revenue comes from admissions paid by visitors. We do not receive any county or taxpayer money for opera-

tions," Segaline said.

Annual operations are budgeted at about \$400,000. Some capital improvements qualify for county funding but the far larger source is grants and donations through the Ohme Gardens Friends Society, Segaline said.

"Community support has dwindled in recent years and we would like to turn that around. We're always looking for volunteers to help with

everything from pulling weeds to caring for cacti on cactus point and helping with fundraisers," she said.

The 9-acre gardens is a favorite tourist attraction, receiving about 25,000 visitors annually. It's a popular venue for weddings, concerts and other events because of its alpine trees, ponds, flowers, rock paths and scenic views of the Columbia River and Wenatchee.

The 6 to 8 p.m. July 9 concert is \$35 per person. Tickets are available at Ohmegardens.org. Admission includes a fruit and cheese plate. Wine and beer from concert sponsors Tsillan Cellars and Watermill Winery will be sold. Tax-deductible donations to Ohme Gardens Friends Society will be accepted. All proceeds will go to the society.

GladSong performs pop, country, jazz and gospel piec-

es. GladSong's 2022 concerts resulted in \$42,000 raised for 11 charitable causes in the Wenatchee Valley. The choir has benefit concerts for the NCW Chaplain Foundation, June 11, at Christ Center Church in Cashmere, and for a Leavenworth group providing weekend meals for underprivileged children, July 23, at Icicle Creek Center for the Arts Snowy Owl Theater. Information about those and other summer concerts is available at GladSong.org.

Sunnyslope orchardists Herman and Ruth Ohme began developing their backyard garden in 1929, planting trees and flowers and building paths. Ohme was quoted as saying, "It was a rock pile, but it had an inspiring view." The family opened the gardens to the public in 1939. The state of Washington bought it in 1991 and Chelan County operated it. The state gave it to the county in 2008.

**Boys Singles**

Junior Rylen Moody represented the Mountain Goats in boys singles, and finished fifth overall - the highest of any public school boys singles player. His medal path began with an opening round loss to Robert DeFrost of St. George's (Spokane), but it was all wins from there on out. Rylen's second match on Friday was a 6-3, 6-2 victory over Luke Chafin of Cle Elum. Forgive the commentary: more than that, the WIAA brackets are unjust and unequal. Note that teammate Rylen Moody suffered a first round loss, but was afforded a double elimination bracket for all entrants. This same experience is not given to the girls entrants, though it easily could be done with minor bracket adjustments. The WIAA has no rationale for this inequality other than it's their "adopted policy" for 12 entry brackets as opposed to 16 entry brackets. Chelan coaches and administrators have been trying to work with the WIAA for over a year to fix this issue, but were not successful. We will continue to try and fix this terrible format between now and next season.

On a brighter note, points scored by the postseason lineup of Paglia, Cowan and Grossberg earned the girls team a third place team trophy for 2023. Third in state, and tops in the public schools.
