At 20.75 inches, he is the first baby to be born at the new Lake Chelan Health Hospital (LCH) facility, which opened on December 5. Parents Esther G. Cruz Padilla and Mario Espinoza Lopez were shocked and overjoyed when they were told that their baby was the firstborn at the new LCH facility. Excitement was equally shared by Columbia Valley Community Health's Dr. Jennifer Snyder and resident Dr. Matt Acosta, who delivered baby Victor in one of the four Labor and Delivery, Recovery and Postpartum (LDRP) rooms. The new LDRP rooms are not only spaciously designed to comfortably accommodate patients and staff during the birth process, but they allow mother and baby to stay together in the same room throughout their stay. They no longer must be transferred to another room as was the case in the old hospital. "We received great care and attention from everybody. We are happy that our baby is the first born here in this nice hospital." said Esther and Mario. Staff presented a baby basket donated by ADAMS Management Services Corporation. Donation goes to building affordable homes on Iowa St. in Chelan

CHELAN - Chelan Valley Housing Trust (CVHT) recently received a \$10,000 grant from Washington Federal Bank earmarked for two homes being built this spring on Iowa St. in Chelan.

"We know how crucial affordable housing is to Chelan and love what Chelan Valley Housing Trust is doing to make a difference in our community," reports Ken McLain, WaFd's Central Washington Regional President.

"Supporting the Chelan Valley Housing Trust is important to WaFd Bank because we want to see everyone in the community thriving where we live and having access to affordable housing is crucial to that success!" said April Wiggins, WaFd's Branch Manager.

CVHT is building two 3-bedroom 2 bath homes on Iowa Street in South Chelan for local wage earners making 120% Area Median Income or less, according to Rachael Goldie, the trust's Executive Director. These homes will be finished by Fall 2023.

Chelan Valley Housing Trust's Mission is to develop stable and secure housing that is attainable to Manson and Chelan wage earners.

have the quality of help that they have at the store and "Pat and I could not do anything with out having a great crew .. we hire people who like people, you can always tell. A lot of people have been with us 20-25 years."

He also said that Ace Hardware has helped them tremendously and that has been very, very good.

When someone at the presentation, thanked him for staying in Chelan that many years and staying open, Gene replied, "People have supported us, that's the thing, local people have supported local business, and if we don't do that, the town goes down ... a lot of people don't realize how important it is to support local businesses, all kinds of local businesses. Trade local."

Asked about his favorite day when working, Gene said.

"A lady came in with a nice looking hat on, and I waited on her, and I said to her, you look a lot younger today, because of the beautiful hat you have on. Guess what she said to me? I am leaving your store, because I don't like the

remark you just made. That's a true story. That stuck with me folks ... I changed my approach."

Gene went onto say, "Sixty three years ago when I first came back here, you could walk up and down main street and find nobody there, even in the summer ... things have approved so much ... I know a lot of people don't like tourists, but we gotta have tourism in the area ... just have to have it. The same way with different nationalities of people, we've got to have that in the community, that is all there is to it ... we have to treat everyone good. I went out of this business, just as easy as you can possibly go out, after 63 years, why, because I had someone that took over and did one helluva better job, ... and that was Pat."

When asked what the store was like when he came on board he said.

"Four employees, you wait on the customer, take their money, put in the till, you did everything ... follow them around the store."

He said at that time they had several wholesalers, then they joined Ace Hardware. They were one of the first Ace Hardware dealers in the state of Washington. Merchandise was shipped into Portland on the train, put on trucks and delivered out of there. He said they never knew when you were going to get a shipment of merchandise, but that everything eventually

Gene was living in Moses Lake working as a car salesman and struggling, when his brother Wayne Kelly called him up and asked him if he was interested in going into business or working for him. He told Wayne he knew nothing about hardware and Wayne asked him if he could learn, to which he replied, "Well I think i can."

Gene joined his brother Wayne Kelly in the fall of

Gene bought into business and became a co-owner with his brother; with Wayne's son, Pat, joining the company later on. Wayne passed away in 1991.

Gene went onto say, "I am fortunate to be able to live as long as I have, and enjoy the people that we have working here at the store."

When asked by his nephew Pat about selling appliances, Gene replied.

"Well I needed a couple, that was the reason."

for about five years, but stopped selling them because they could not service

"If you sell a product you need to stand behind it," Gene said.

When asked what was next for him, Gene replied, "I am not telling because i don't know myself. I might go back into the used car business, since I don't need a income. Thank you for Social Security.

History

The following is reprinted from the June 1, 1977 issue of the Lake Chelan Mirror and was written by Wayne Kelly.

Kelly's Hardware was originally started in Chelan as Chelan Hardware Company by Merle Higley in the early 1920's.

Jim Reed and his father John purchased it in 1926 and it was located where the present post office is now. The store was moved from there to Woodin Avenue right next to the Ruby Theatre. This building is now being occupied by KOZI Radio Station (now Westside Pizza). In 1935 a new brick building was built next to the Episcopal Log Church and Chelan Hardware Company had a new home, still owned by Jim Reed and his father.

It was at this time, a long time friend of Jim Reed, Barney Slaugenhaupt Sr., moved to Chelan and went to work for Chelan Hardware Company.

In April of 1946, when I was discharged from the Navy, I went to work for Chelan Hardware Company. The crew then consisted of Jim Reed (owner), Warren (Hardware) Harris, Lil Fisher, Claude Bennett, and Wayne Kelly. About four years later the store was enlarged as we encompassed the space formerly occupied by Richardson's Barber Shop. Now the store frontage was 40 feet.

In 1958 Jim Reed sold the business to me. Having 12 years previous experience in the store, I knew I liked working in the hardware business and working with people. We had many ideas that we wanted to try and over the years we have tried them very successfully.

Each year we have done some moderizing, some remodeling and added new merchandise.

In 1966 we encompassed another building, which was originally the Chelan State Bank. This now gave us a 66 foot frontage or 6,600 square feet of main floor store.

Affordable, innovative camper

They say misfortune is the mother of innovation and for Kyle Hart, that was certainly the case. The 34-year-old inventor and entrepreneur was elk hunting with friends near Ashford in Western Washington. Kyle had a roof top tent camper in the back of his pick-up truck and he and his companions used dirt bikes to get to the area they wanted to hunt. However, when they returned, they found someone had taken a Sawzall and literally sawed the tent structure right off the bed of the truck and as an added bonus, they also stole the trailer for the motorcycles.

Kyle needed another tent camper but he didn't want to go through this heartbreak again. That's when he came up with the idea that led to the prototype of the Lone Peak camper. What Kyle came up with is ingenious. It is a lightweight (300 pound) hard shell, aluminum camper. Like a pick-up canopy, you put it on top of your truck's bed rail

and clamp it in. Side panels open up giving you access to storage boxes that hold a lot of the things you'll need for your camping or overlanding expedition. Going to the back of the truck you fold down your tailgate, lift up the lockable camper door, and get inside the camper. A tall, wedgeshaped tent quickly opens up giving you ample room to stand. In fact, the roof of the tent at the back of the truck bed is nearly 10 feet high and has zip screen windows giving you great views. The bed, as long as a queen size bed and 54 inches wide, lies over the cab of the truck and is definitely spacious enough for two. Better still, it's four inches thick, double the standard foam bed you find in many truck campers.

When standing inside the camper you can fold down shelves on both sides, perfect for cooking food on a small camp stove or working on a laptop. The bed can also be moved out of the way so you can have the entirety of the truck bed available for use. Other accessories include both interior and exterior lighting available from a Juice Box that can be controlled by pushing buttons on the unit at

the back of the truck or by using a cell phone app. Kyle has his prototype mounted on his Ford F-150 truck but said his campers will useable for up to 74 different models of trucks, to include smaller pick-ups like the Toyota Tacoma.

Perhaps the most amazing thing about this camper is the price point. A full-scale truck camper can cost anywhere from \$40,000 to \$80,000. Many pop-up truck campers cost more than \$25,000 and even tent-style roof-top truck campers go for north of \$10,000. The price of the Lone Peak Camper? Only \$5,995. That's the base model without any accessories but Kyle explained he wanted to make this as affordable as possible for consumers.

As for the accessories? Those include LED lighting, Gear Vault storage boxes, a cab pass through window, grab handles, ladders, laser light bars and roof fans. These can all be added on to the base model camper and installed when you order one.

Kyle lives in Wenatchee, and is currently building these campers out of his garage. After he built his first one, he went on a 4,500-mile, multi-state road trip through Western America putting the camper

through its paces and meeting up with potential customers and installers. The trip was worth every mile. When Kyle launched his roll-out campaign this fall, he received pre-orders to the tune of one million dollars in his first week.

Kyle is focused now on getting a facility with more space and hiring employees to produce these campers in June and have those initial orders filled by August. Consumers will be able to get these campers installed at facilities in Wenatchee, as well as in California, Colorado and New Mexico. Look for Kyle Hart and his prototype Lone Peak Camper at the Washington Sportsman's Show in Puyallup from February 1-5.

Phytosterols lower your cholesterol

Last fall, 80-year-old Joyce had her cholesterol levels checked. When her lab results came back, there was good news mixed with some bad. Her "good" cholesterol (HDL) was excellent, but her "bad" cholesterol (LDL) and her total cholesterol were both too high. Her family physician recommended she start taking a prescription medication to lower her cholesterol: statin.

Joyce told her doctor she had taken statin medicines simultaneously with an estrogen blocker drug for her breast cancer. Each time she started the statin, she experienced muscle aches, pain, and weakness, especially in her legs. All of these symptoms went away after she stopped taking the statin pills.

When her breast cancer returned earlier this year, Joyce was told she would need to take the same estrogen blocker medicine for the rest of her life. Last fall, when her doctor saw the results of her blood cholesterol. she advised starting a statin medication immediately.

Joyce made a different choice. For the past 8 months, she has stuck with a low-fat/good-fat diet and walked at least 2 miles daily. By making lifestyle changes to encourage her LDL to drop, she hoped she wouldn't have to resort to medication to get her cholesterol under control.

When her doctor repeated Joyce's lipid panel this fall, her LDL had dropped from 125 to 116. Joyce was thrilled, but her doctor wasn't.

"Your LDL is still above 100, so I'll send a prescription for a statin to your pharmacy."

However, when the medicine arrived in the mail, Joyce avoided taking it.

Last week, her daughter suggested she try citrus bergamot. "I took it for 6 months, and now my cholesterol level is normal. My doctor is amazed. It's natural, so it should be safe."

Unfortunately, that was not the case. One of Joyce's cancer medications can be affected by grapefruit. Grapefruit juice, fresh grapefruit, and citrus bergamot contain natural constituents that inactivate a particular enzyme called CYP3A4, which is concentrated in your liver and small intestine. CYP3A4 enzymes take apart specific types of compounds, including many prescription drugs. In the lining of your small intestine, CYP3A4 neutralizes part of each dose of medicine before it gets into your bloodstream.

When Joyce asked me if citrus bergamot was safe to take with her 2 drugs for breast cancer, I answered, "No. Grapefruit and bergamot can make your intestinal CYP3A4 enzymes stop working. Without CYP3A4, you could absorb up to 50% more of each dose of affected medicine, setting you up for an overdose."

I suggested she try phytosterols instead. Phytosterols (PS) are plant-based cholesterol compounds that can decrease

LDL cholesterol by 6-14% yet do not affect "good" cholesterol (HDL) or triglycerides. They also have anti-inflammatory and anti-carcinogenic proper-

The cholesterol in your food gets absorbed into your body by riding on carrier molecules. Each carrier molecule has places for cholesterol to attach to, called binding sites. Phytosterols cover up those binding sites, keeping cholesterol out of your body.

The best sources of PS are sunflower seeds and pistachios, followed by broccoli, Brussels sprouts, corn, and carrots. PSrich beverages include pomegranate juice, carrot juice, and milk substitutes like almond, cashew, and oat milk. Benechol® and Take Control® spreads are examples of PS-fortified foods.

1. Aim for at least 2 grams of PS daily.

A healthy diet gives you between 0.2-0.4 grams of PS daily. Adding one serving of 1.7 grams will get you to 2 grams of PS daily. If you need to lower your LDL by more than 10 points, you'll need two 1.7gram servings of PS daily. 2. Take PS-fortified foods or

supplements twice daily.

Phytosterols are more effective in decreasing LDL and total cholesterol if taken more than once daily.

3. Always take PS supplements or concentrated foods with an adequate meal. You need to have enough fat

in your meal to activate the binding sites for cholesterol. 4. Avoid PS between meals

or with a very low-fat meal. Although drinking PS-rich

pomegranate juice or almond milk is good for you, it won't help lower your LDL if you drink it by itself or at a very low-fat

5. Avoid slow-dissolving or "extended-release" phytosterol supplements.

For best results, PS supplements should be fully dissolved in your small intestine.
