Search warrant served results in recovery of stolen property from new constructions sites in four counties

100's of unopened bottles of alcohol recovered believed to be stolen

EAST WENATCHEE - The Columbia River Drug Task Force reports that a search warrant was served on May 22, in the 100 block of North Keller in East Wenatchee resulting in the recovery of hundreds of thousands of dollars in stolen property from new construction sites in Chelan, Douglas, Grant and Franklin Counties. Part of the CRDTF's expanded

mission is to combat emerging crime trends in the Wenatchee Valley. CRDTF learned of widespread theft occurring at construction sites in Chelan, Leavenworth, Wenatchee, East Wenatchee and Rock Island going back as far as January of 2022. Detectives began compiling clues from construction contractors and the deputies and officers that took the initial reports that the suspect vehicle appeared to be a dually style pickup truck. An attentive citizen contacted a Hispanic male with a dually pickup truck on a job site in the Sunnyslope area off of Easy Street in the early morning hours. The pickup truck was stuck in a ditch and the citizen wrote down the license plate which eventually made it to law enforcement for

follow up. CRDTF began surveillance on the truck and residence on Keller Street and applied for a search warrant. On May 19, a Douglas County Deputy on patrol, ran a license plate of a trailer being pulled by the suspect vehicle and the trailer came back stolen out of Quincy. The vehicle was stopped and a suspect was arrested for possession of stolen property. A male passenger was identified and \bar{r} eleased at the scene. The dually pickup truck was impounded and will be seized since it was used in the commission of a felony.

CRDTF detectives served the search warrant at the residence in the early morning hours of May 20, and discovered a large amount of items that had been reported stolen from Sage Homes, Real Homes, Eider Construction, Pinnacle Custom Builders, and Carlisle Classic Homes, along with numerous others. At the residence location over 12 Heat Pumps were located, 7 which had been stolen from new construction sites in Rock Island and Sunnyslope in the last month. Thousands of dollars in stolen lumber was recovered as well as flooring, siding, window packages,

Cold spring means slow runoff into Lake Chelan

Chelan PUD managing lake levels to balance multiple objectives

CHELAN - Every year is unique for Lake Chelan Basin runoff and refill, and this spring started with a healthy snowpack that's slow to melt. That means the annual runoff that refills the Lake Chelan this time of year is delayed.

It's been colder than normal

these past several weeks. Temperatures in April averaged 6.3 degrees below normal, as recorded at Pangborn Airport. So far, May temperatures have averaged 6.2 degrees below normal.

Snowpack in the Lake Chelan Basin was about 90 percent of average during the April 1 snow survey, and it's staying put. Forecasts indicate about 22 feet of refill water remains in snowpack, and there is 9 feet of room in the lake. Any excess water will either be run through the dam for power generation or spilled into the Chelan River. Lake Chelan is the reservoir

for the Lake Chelan Hydro Project. Managing the level of popular Lake Chelan requires balancing several objectives within its federal operating license that together provide recreation, protect fish, provide flood control, reduce erosion and restore year-round flows to the Chelan River.

In order to speed up lake refill, Chelan PUD began to curtail energy generation on April 24, and shut down generation on May 13 as lake levels gradually rise closer to target elevation. Lake levels are nearly 1,091 feet as of May 23. The goal is to reach the 1,094-foot target elevation

Managing the level of the lake is not an exact science. It involves a series of forecasts and calculations, with the added uncertainty of weather. Check lake levels any time at chelan-

Chelan PUD also offers a free app - Current - which includes real-time data for local rivers and lakes. Features include: Lake Chelan levels, boat launch water depth and real-time water flow. The Current app is available for iOS and Android platforms. You can find the download link and a 30-second video at chelanpud.org/app.



Locally grown winemaking team brings home honors for Tsillan Cellars

CHELAN - What happens when you put two childhood friends with farming roots in the Entiat Valley together as a winemaking team? Following in the footsteps of former Tsillan Cellars winemaker Ray Sandidge, Garrett Grubbs and Nic Stevens teamed up to produce seven Double Gold and three Gold Medals at the 2022 Seattle Wine Awards Competition. These 10 wines combined for two 97 point, four 96 point, one 95 point and three 93-94 point scores in the competition. Among the 10 Double Gold/Gold award winners were six Tsillan Cellars 2021 vintage white wines that scored 93-97 points despite the challenges of a record hot 2021 growing season.

Garrett Grubbs and Nic Stevens grew up together and have a common passion for viticulture and winemaking. Shane Collins head winemaker at Tsillan Cellars from 2007 to 2017 said that 80% of wine quality is grown in the vineyards and 20% is the winemaker's art and science. Stevens, Tsillan Cellars Director of Vineyard Operations



and Assistant Winemaker, can be found daily in the vineyards supervising the vineyard crew and nurturing the grapes to optimal perfection. The rest is up to Mother Nature and the skills of the winemakers. Grubbs brings 15 years of wine making experience to the Tsillan Cellars team to

compliment Stevens work in the vineyards.

Tsillan Cellar's owner Bob Jankelson comments "This is an auspicious start for our new winemaking team at Tsillan Cellars. I could not be more pleased with the dedication and expertise that Garrett and Nic bring to our



We witnessed this community pulling together to help those in need both through quiet acts of anonymous giving and big community-wide campaigns. Below are some highlights of how your Community Foundation made an impact in FY2021:

In numbers:

• \$1,083,393 was raised by you — members of the general public—who contributed to

NCW nonprofit organizations through both Give Methow and Give NCW. Thank you.

• \$1,061,700 was awarded in scholarships to 228 students throughout NCW to help them accomplish their academic

goals and get closer to the life and career they envision for themselves. CFNCW manages 133 scholarship funds and works with over 200 volunteers who carefully review and select deserving students every year.

• \$5,000,000 in grants to non-profit organizations was made through our Community Grants Program as well as Individual Donor Funds. This includes \$450,000 for crisis relief efforts: the 'Back to Basics' campaign supported students with immediate needs, the NCW Fire Relief Fund helped survivors of wildfires, and the 'Hugs for Healthcare Heroes' acknowledged the tireless work of our healthcare providers during the height of the pandemic.

She states: "Since age seven, I have translated for my parents at stores, doctors' offices, hospitals, and parent-teacher conferences. My parents, brother and I slept in a single bedroom. From my parents, I learned to be diligent and responsible. I will be the first person in my family to graduate from high school and go to college. My going to university is a dream come true for my family and

· Our furry friends in Okanogan County received food, medicine, emergency care and spay and neuter services through the Okanogan Regional Humane Society when resources dried up during the pandemic. Most of the animals they serve have never been to a vet as many of their owners cannot afford this care. With grant funding from CFNCW, the humane society was able to continue their important work during a difficult time.
