

Chelan, Douglas counties remain in Phase 3

CHELAN - Governor Inslee announced last week that Chelan and Douglas Counties will remain in Phase 3. Additionally, on April 9, the governor announced updates to the Healthy Washington criteria:

1. In order to move down one phase, a county must fail both metrics for case counts and hospitalizations. Under the previous plan, a county only needed to fail one metric to move back a phase.
2. The spectator events guidance is updated to make clear what is allowed for counties in Phase 2 and how these events are related to school graduation ceremonies.
3. The Open Air Seating guidance is updated to allow flexibility for eating and drinking establishments.
4. The next evaluation of counties will be in two weeks, on May 3.

Everyone 16 and old eligible for COVID-19 vaccine

EAST WENATCHEE – Washington State Department of Health (DOH) opened COVID-19 vaccine eligibility to everyone 16 years and older beginning April 15.

Currently, the Pfizer-BioNTech (Pfizer) vaccine is the only COVID-19 vaccine authorized for emergency use by the Federal Drug Administration (FDA) for people 16 or 17 years old.

Individuals who are 16 or 17 years old need parent or legal guardian consent to get the COVID-19 vaccine, unless

they are legally emancipated. A signed consent form is required if a parent or legal guardian is not present. If the individual is an emancipated minor, supporting documentation is also required.

The mass vaccination site at the Town Toyota Center currently offers Pfizer vaccine. You can schedule a COVID-19 vaccine appointment at the Town Toyota Center by registering via PrepMod or calling 509-886-6487 if you have language or technology barriers.

Emerson Village: Sold Out!

CHELAN – In a Saturday, April 17 ceremony, Executive Director of the Chelan Valley Housing Trust (CVHT) Mike Cooney was joined by Chelan Mayor Bob Goedde, City Councilman and CVHT President Tim Hollingsworth and about 20 others for the official grand opening of Emerson Village, an affordable housing project here.

Community members were given a tour and had celebratory drinks while socializing after the tour to commemorate the seminal event, which has already sold all five units to committee-qualified applicants.

The \$200,000, 1,170 square foot homes were financed by North Cascades Bank and built by K&L Homes in an effort to ease the affordable housing crunch prevalent in this destination resort city as well as most of Chelan County.

“While Emerson Village is a milestone, it is just the beginning,” says CVHT President Tim Hollingsworth. “We learned a great deal going through the building of our first community. And now that we’ve gotten our feet wet, we are ready to take on a much

larger build ...,” he said, referring to future projects.

“We’re providing homes for five local families today,” said Cooney.

“The completion of Emerson Village is our first tangible step to provide affordable homes for our locals and support a stable workforce,” said Cooney.

“Through the generosity of our community, private

donors, local businesses, the Lake Chelan Chamber of Commerce, and grants from the city and county, we made this happen,” former Chelan mayor Cooney told the audience to great applause.

“I was excited to see so many people representing different aspects of our community turn out for the ribbon cutting at Emerson Village. Building on that wide ranging support,

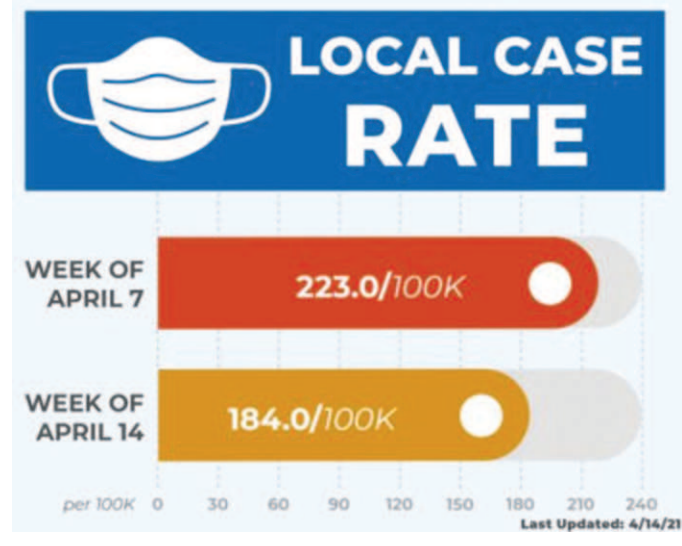

506 vaccinated

In the second largest COVID-19 vaccine clinic held in the Lake Chelan Valley, 506 residents received their first (353) or second (153) dose of the COVID-19 vaccine on April 17 at the Chelan Fire Station. The largest clinic was held on March 25 with 522 receiving the vaccine. The long lines moved quickly on Saturday, and Chelan County sheriff deputies helped re-route traffic so traffic concerns were fixed quickly, according Ray Eickmeyer, Lake Chelan Health EMS Director. They ask that you not arrive more than 15 minutes before for your appointment time. "Being a part of Apple Blossom is a big deal in our family. Even when the whole family moved around Washington state we always came home for the Apple Blossom Parade, Pig Jig, Quilt Show and other activities centered around this special community celebration.

My great-grandma, Edna Bennett made the first crowns for the royalty. Growing up, it was something to aspire to. My sisters (Kathy Jackson and Mona Ferguson) and I

would dress up and borrow the crowns from the royalty when they came over for tea as part of their duties (royalty used to attend local meetings to promote the Apple Blossom activities). My crown was the last crown my great-grandmother made. Great-grandpa John Bennett used to make the chests that the crowns were kept in. Mona Ferguson has since taken over the crown making (it has stayed in the Bennett/Miller family with Nita Bennett and Susi Bennett making crowns for many years).

Each of my siblings have enjoyed active participation in Apple Blossom; each of us were in the Royal Court as kindergartners and again our senior years. I was Queen 1980, Kathy (Miller) Jackson Princess 1981 and Mona (Miller) Ferguson Queen 1982. Tim Miller was an attendant to Queen Jennifer Allison 1989.

I graduated from Manson

High School as Valedictorian and went on to graduate with my BA in Education from Eastern Washington University, graduated from Gonzaga University with my MA in Educational leadership with an additional endorsement as a Principal. I taught around Washington State for 33 years, but mainly in Spokane School District. My husband of 30 years, Michael J. Stuiwenga, passed away five years ago. I was blessed to find another widow that had also been happily married for 30 years, Marty D. Fox. We have been happily married for over three years and plan to begin building our dream home below the Manson Elementary School in April 2021.

I still look forward to each "decade" parade that I get to proudly wear my crown again and ride in a convertible in the Apple Blossom Parade, Susie concluded.

Johnson & Johnson Vaccine

The Washington Department of Health (DOH) asks all vaccine providers in Washington State to pause the use of the Johnson & Johnson

(Janssen) COVID-19 vaccine immediately until further notice.

The Federal Drug Administration (FDA) and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) are reviewing data involving six reported U.S. cases of a rare type of blood clots in individuals after receiving the Johnson & Johnson (Janssen) COVID-19 vaccine. 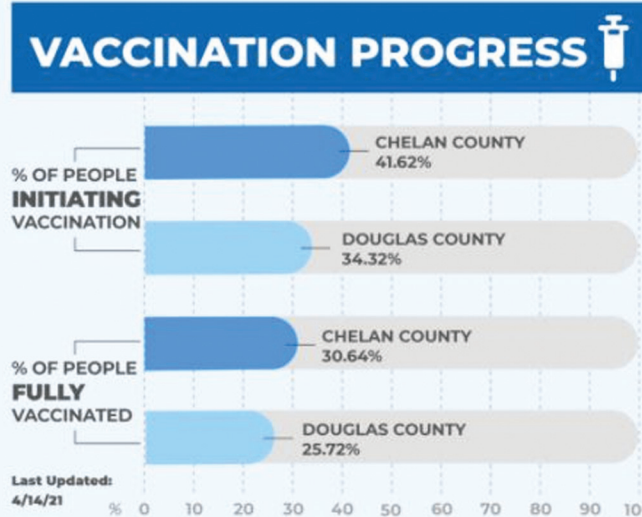
According to a DOH statement, the risk of complication is very low for anyone who received the vaccine more than a month ago. About 90,000 doses of Johnson & Johnson (Janssen) COVID-19 vaccine have been administered in Washington in the past two weeks, but DOH is not aware that any of the six patients were Washington residents. CDHD is following-up with all clinic patients and asks that they contact their health care provider should they develop any of the notable symptoms.

Manson Parks Levy Renewal on April 27 Special Election Ballot

MANSON - The Tuesday, April 27 Special Election Ballot features a request from Manson Park & Recreation District to renew the current Maintenance and Operations levy. Parks and facilities currently benefiting from these funds include Manson Bay Park, Manson Bay Marina, Singleton Park, Willow Point Park, Old Swim Hole, Leffler Field, Wapato Lake Campground, and Old Mill Boat Launch.

The current levy- at a rate of \$0.23 or less per \$1000 of assessed property value- was approved by voters back in 2018 with a 70% approval rating. 60% 'YES' is required to pass. This levy helps fund the standard maintenance and operations for our parks and programs. Here are some examples of where your dollars are spent:

- Lifeguard program
- AAU
- Utilities
- Turf maintenance
- Employee wages and benefits
- Equipment repair, maintenance, and purchases
- Litter and trash removal
- Professional services (including design, engineering, permitting, grant funding, etc.)
- Supplies (office equipment, restroom supplies, irrigation repair parts, etc.)

The requested rate for this levy remains the same as it has for many years. In 2015, Manson Parks reduced the previous amount to \$0.23 or less per \$1000 of assessed property value. What this means is that someone with property valued at \$100,000 could expect to pay,

at most, \$23 each year for the next 3 years. In 2020, the actual rate collected was only \$0.155 per \$1000. The collected rate is determined by the anticipated needs of the district in conjunction with property assessments. Due to the minimum wage increase, an increase in park usage, and aging infrastructure, we do anticipate higher costs than we experienced in 2020. Rising property values also impact the collection amount. You can use your property tax assessment to better estimate what this may mean for you and your family.

The District gets a large majority of its funding through this levy, park fees, and grants.

Grants tend to fund larger expenses, such as the State and County grants used to purchase Leffler Field. Revenue generated by user fees, as well as the levy, help to fund park programs and maintenance expenses as previously mentioned.

Our Board of Commissioners would like to thank Manson residents for their continued support of your parks. They are proud to serve the community of Manson, and encourage you to make your voice heard by voting by April 27. PUD commissioners consider expanding support of affordable housing

WENATCHEE - Chelan PUD commissioners are considering a proposal that would support affordable housing development by waiving connection fees for qualified homebuyers working with local housing trusts.

The electrical connection fee waiver is currently \$1,900. Chelan PUD has offered waivers to nonprofit, affordable housing trusts since 1995. About one home per year has qualified. Working through the housing trusts, about 20-25 homes per year are expected to qualify under the expanded program.

Three community land trusts - Chelan Valley Affordable Housing Trust, Com-

mon Ground Housing Trust in Wenatchee, and Share Community Land Trust in Leavenworth - presented a summary of local affordable housing programs to PUD commissioners in February. A community land trust is a community-led development of individually owned buildings on community-owned land.

In North Central Washington, community housing trusts have developed 42 affordable homes. That number is expected to grow by about 10-20 homes per year over the next five years: Three homes in Leavenworth by 2022, five homes a year in Wenatchee starting in 2022 and five-10 homes a year in Chelan.

Commissioners asked staff to further develop eligibility criteria to keep administra-

tive costs low and total costs for the program predictable.

In other news, commissioners:

1. Heard an update about advanced two-way digital metering. Staff are wrapping up contract negotiations with the vendor, which also supplies Grant PUD's advanced meters.
 2. Heard about resource adequacy planning in the Pacific Northwest.
 3. Heard about lower-than-average streamflow in the mid-Columbia in March.
- The next PUD commission meeting is at 10 a.m. on Monday, May 3. The public is welcome to attend remotely in accordance with the latest guidance from the state Department of Health.

THE WASHINGTON OUTDOORS REPORT

A really big bass tournament

The biggest bass tournament to hit the Pacific Northwest in a long time took place April 10 at Potholes Reservoir in the Columbia Basin. The competition in question was the Berkley Big Bass Tournament and Ground Zero was MarDon Resort, a place that has hosted more than its share of fishing tournaments over the last 50 years. The event, cancelled twice in 2020 due to Covid pandemic restrictions, drew a record number of anglers from not only Washington, but also Oregon, Idaho, Montana and even Arkansas. Altogether, 200 teams registered to fish this unique contest.

Normally, a team of two anglers attempts to catch five bass with the heaviest overall weight winning. In this tournament though, there were seven hourly weigh-ins and the biggest bass caught each hour was worth \$2,000. Better still, if you caught the bass with an Abu Garcia rod or reel you got an additional \$1,000. On top of that, the next four heaviest bass weighed in each hour were worth anywhere from \$500 to \$150.

One interesting twist to this tournament is the fact that you were limited to only

using hard and soft baits from Berkley or other Pure Fishing brands like Johnson or Sebile. While this may seem overly restrictive, it's not. Berkley has a full range of soft plastic baits and lures and they are very effective. The night before the tournament there was a meeting where members from all of the teams went over the rules and then it was off to bed before launching the boats in the morning and blasting off from MarDon Resort shortly after 6 a.m.

The biggest challenge facing anglers on tournament day wasn't the fish; it was the wind. There was already a stiff 15 to 20 MPH breeze when we started and as the morning progressed it only got worse, with gusts up to 37 mph. A few boats decided

not to launch and a few more decided to come in early but the vast majority of anglers battled the winds and the waves searching for a big bass.

I'd like to say my fishing partner, Rusty Johnston and I, got into the money but that didn't happen. I caught a decent bass on my first cast and 10 minutes later Rusty caught one just shy of three pounds. Not long after that though the fuse for our electric trolling motor blew and 45 minutes later, the spare did too, putting us at a huge disadvantage for the rest of the day. In fact, the only other fish we caught was a hefty 17-inch rainbow trout, not exactly the fish you are looking to catch during a bass tournament.

The biggest hourly winning bass weighed in Saturday was

How to relieve dry eyes

Due to the COVID-19 coronavirus, I still wear a surgical mask every minute while at work, putting it on as I step out of my car into our clinic parking lot, and wearing it until opening my car door again to head home.

At my clinic we are expected to keep our masks on unless we are eating, drinking, or are alone in our office. After hours of exhaling into my mask, my eyes feel tired and gritty, like they have bits of sand in them.

Exposure to windy, dusty, or smoky conditions can trigger dry eye symptoms. Another common cause of dry eyes is taking medicines that interfere with making saliva and tear fluids, especially bladder control medicines, antidepressants, and heart medicines.



Tears help keep your eyes healthy by keeping the surface of your eye moist, lubricating the inside of your eyelids, and helping wash dust and foreign objects away. We make about 1ml (one-quarter teaspoonful) of tears every day. While most tear fluid evaporates directly from your eye, excess moisture can drain out through tiny holes in the inner corners of your eye called punctums.

Some diseases like Sjogren's syndrome cause dry mouth as well as dry eyes. Parkinson's disease can cause you to blink less frequently, reducing the lubricating effect of your tears. Bell's palsy is a temporary paralysis of the face, often affecting eye muscles, and can prevent an eye from closing all the way, allowing more tear fluid to evaporate.

Some strategies that can help relieve dry eyes include keeping yourself hydrated, increasing your environment's humidity, eliminating medications that are causing discomfort, taking Omega-3 fatty acids, and using eye lubricant drops and ointments.

If you are on a medication that you suspect may be causing your eyes to be dry, contact your doctor and ask if you can either have a trial off of it or switch to another medicine. Avoid dry, dusty conditions, and consider using a humidifier.

People who wear protective face masks may notice that

their glasses fog up when they breathe out. To keep that to a minimum, when wearing a surgical mask, put it on so that the metal strip is across the top edge. Pinch that strip in so that the metal edge hugs your nose and upper cheeks. This helps direct your exhaling breaths out through the sides of your mask instead of the top, preventing your glasses from getting fogged up.

After I had LASIK surgery 20 years ago to correct my vision, they told me that I would probably need eye drops for the rest of my life. After carrying around a bottle of eye drops everywhere, I tried taking fish oil with Omega-3 fatty acids, which worked great and was far more convenient. Fish oil and flaxseed are good sources of Omega-3 fatty acids.

When choosing an eye drop for dry eye, consider how much lubrication you need. The more viscous the eye drop, the more lubricating it is, but also the more clumpy residue they will leave on your eyelashes.

Most eye drops contain a preservative to discourage infections. Those that don't are sold in single-use containers and are significantly more expensive. During the years that I wore contact lenses, I developed a sensitivity to two common preservatives used in contact lens solutions and lubricating eye drops: benzalkonium chloride and parabens. "Disappearing preservatives" are now widely available, which break apart when they contact your tear fluid.

Personally, I find using an eye ointment very soothing, but I only use them at bedtime

because they make my vision blurry.

Here are 7 tips to help relieve dry eye symptoms:

1. Hydrate and humidify your surroundings.

Make sure you drink enough water and avoid dry and dusty conditions. Consider using a humidifier indoors.

2. Check your medicines.

Tell your doctor about your dry eye symptoms and ask if any of your medications could be the cause.

3. Try Omega-3 fatty acids.

Fish oil, flaxseed, and other Omega-3 supplements may relieve dry eye symptoms.

4. Use just one drop.

Adding more than one eye drop at a time only forces the extra out of your eye, wasting it.

5. Keep it clean.

Always wash your hands before using eye drops, and keep uncapped tips from touching any surfaces.

6. Choose eye drops with disappearing preservatives.

Disappearing preservatives are much less irritating than benzalkonium chloride, EDTA, or parabens.

7. Consider using eye ointment at bedtime.

Bedtime is the best time to use eye ointment to avoid having blurry vision.
