428 cases of virus in Chelan, Douglas counties

EAST WENATCHEE - As of Monday, June 1 there are 255 positive cases, up from 236 positive cases of COVID19 in Chelan County on May 25, and 173 cases, up from 159 cases in Douglas County. New cases in Chelan County in the last seven days is 19; and in Douglas County 14.

The age groups with the most cases are: 187 cases in the 20-39 age group and 130 cases in the 40-59 age group.

Entiat is holding at one case, Bridgeport has three cases (no change). Chelan has 27 cases (no increase), Manson 8 (no increase), Chelan Falls 13 (no increase), Orondo 9 (no increase) and East Wenatchee 141 (was 129). Chelan County has had six deaths, Douglas County three and Okanogan County two. As of May 29 Okanogan County has 49 cases, up from 44 cases.

Social Distancing and wearing a mask is good, out of concern for preventing viral spread to others versus catching the virus from someone else.

Gov. Inslee issues Safe Start proclamation

OLYMPIA - On May 31 Gov. Jay Inslee issued his Safe Start proclamation as the Stay Home, Stay Healthy order expired on May 31 The governor announced Safe Start—Washington's Phased Reopening plan (read it at: governor.wa.gov/ sites/default/files/SafeStartPhasedReopening.pdf?utm_ medium=email&utm_source=govdelivery) on Friday, May 29 during a press conference where he detailed the countyby-county approach.

"Thanks to Washingtonians pulling together, we can transition fully to our county-by-county approach to safely reopen," Inslee said. "If we remain diligent and committed to more effective ways to prevent the spread of COVID-19, we will continue to save lives and open up more businesses while protecting our friends and neighbors."

Washington will move through the phased reopening county-by-county allowing for flexibility and local control to address COVID-19 activity geographically. 
Brush fire caused by juveniles playing with matches

Chelan Fire & Rescue Fire Chief Mark Donnell reports that on May 27 at 5:33 p.m., Chelan Fire & Rescue crews were dispatched to a reported brush fire in the area of S. Bradley St. and Prospect St. Calling parties had reported an approximately 10' x 10' fire had started in medium fuels (grass and brush) near the Butte

Units arrived at 5:37 p.m. to find that the fire had grown to approximately 20' x 20' and was within 100' of structures. Crews were able to knock down and contained the fire by 5:41 p.m., and mop up was completed by 6:24

Cause of the fire was determined to have been juveniles playing with matches.

Chelan Fire & Rescue reminds everyone that they expect to see a busy fire season this year and to please be careful when burning or using heat sources near dry grass.

Chelan Valley Housing Trust receives community support in local grants

City, County, State and Chamber Pledge \$650,000 for Workforce Housing

CHELAN - The CVHT has announced the receipt of \$650,000 in pledges, over the next 10 years, from the City of Chelan, Chelan County, and the Lake Chelan Chamber of Commerce to build homes for the valley's wage earners.

"This kind of financial commitment from our local government speaks to the public's support of our mission," says CVHT Executive Director Mike Cooney. "it's an enormous boost."

Cooney reports that Chelan County has pledged \$20,000 a year for the next three years with an option of additional two years based on CVHT's performance. Chelan County Commissioner Doug England states, "We are happy and eager to partner with hard working families to create reasonably priced Valley." The City of Chelan has

also committed \$20,000 a year for the next five years to help the land trust's efforts. In addition, the City has earmarked \$100,000 to help offset hookup fees for affordable housing projects including those of CVHT. "We so appreciate Mayor Goedde and the council's support," says Cooney. "It's great they understand what our group is doing here."

Cooney also reports that the Lake Chelan Chamber of Commerce is dedicating \$10,000 a year for the next 10 years to the

homes in the Lake Chelan CVHT. President of the Lake Chelan Chamber of Commerce Sandy Calicoat explains, "We recognize the challenge employers face when trying to hire employees. The high cost of housing in our valley is a difficult hurdle for families and business owners alike. That's why our board is committed to helping address the housing shortage head on by partnering with the CVHT."

Lake Chelan blast from the past

It was my first major holiday weekend, during my term as Mayor of Chelan. We had our hands full.

Most of the visitors were college kids who had circulated (using a FAX Machine) a poster that said "Lake Chelan was The Place To Be" for the upcom-

ing three-day Memorial Day weekend.

We had some time to prepare, so we asked for help from the King County Sheriff's Office and Washington State Patrol. We were able to bring in about 250 additional law enforcement officers, but it wasn't enough. The kids drank and danced in the streets and made it impossible to get a vehicle through from Safeway to the Bowling Alley.

At least not a police car or ambulance. I drove the quarter mile to the park, but it took me an hour.

The worst thing was the way the kids just camped in people's yards. Some of them even walked into people's homes uninvited, using bathrooms and eating food out of the refrigerator

without asking

permission. Frightened grandmothers and other citizens would call dispatch, but it would take 30 minutes to get vehicles to the "scene of the crime.'

By Saturday we knew we needed backup law enforcement on bicycles, because patrol cars would be impossible to navigate through the many other vehicles and people in the streets.

We brought all the extra bicycle cops we could find to assist our efforts at controlling the chaos.

The crowd wasn't horri-

to utility costs for a future CVHT project.

Cooney says he keeps the generous amount of public funding in perspective, considering the size of the housing problem. Providing subsidies to make homes affordable takes significant resources, he elaborates. "Land and infrastructure is just plain expensive. Our goal is to leverage this public money with private donations to get where we

need to go. Our studies show an immediate need for an additional 80 affordable housing units in the Chelan valley, so we've got a long row to hoe." The CVHT is now taking

applications for Emerson Village, its five townhome development being built at the corner of North Emerson Street and East Chelan Avenue in Chelan. These 1179 square foot townhomes will be two-story, two bedrooms, 1.5 baths and built with quality in mind, for \$200,000. The townhomes are available to homebuyers who earn up to 110% of the valley's
