#### 203 cases of virus in Chelan, Douglas counties, 25 in Okanogan county

EAST WENATCHEE - As of Monday, May 4 there are 122 positive cases, up from 95 positive cases of COVID19 in Chelan County, on April 27 and 81 cases, up from 73 cases in Douglas County. The numbers for Chelan, Manson, Chelan Falls, Orondo and Waterville did not change and the number of deaths remains at six for the two counties. and one for Okanogan County. There are 15 recovering in Chelan County, eight in Douglas County and 15 in Okano gan County.

Statewide total confirmed cases are 15,185, up from 13,521 last week; with 834 deaths, up from 749 deaths last week. Total tested statewide is 212,005.

#### Inslee signs new COVID-19 order for phased re-opening of Washington's economy, extends Stay Home, Stay Healthy until May 31

OLYMPIA - Some businesses could re-open as early as this week under the new COVID-19 order signed by Gov. Jay Inslee today (May 4). The state's "Safe Start" plan is a phased approach to re-opening Washington's economy.

Under the plan, smaller counties can apply for a variance from the order which would allow them to open even more businesses than allowed statewide.

Safe Start sets a careful approach to emerging from the pandemic. It allows for modifications of business closures and physical distancing measures while minimizing the health impacts of COVID-19.

"This phased approach to re-opening our economy will allow us to move forward with a careful and thoughtful balance of our state's health and economic needs," Inslee said.

### **Manson Apple Blossom History**

Wednesday, May 11 was the first Manson Apple Blossom Festival. Nearly 500 guests responded to Manson's "Farm Bureau" invitation. The exercises were held at the Manson Pavilion, Mrs. E.A. Butterbaugh played the piano, while senior members of the Sunday School sang a song. M.E. Field delivered the welcome and spoke of what Manson was 30 years ago and the struggles early settlers had to undergo to make Manson what it was. Thirteen little girls gave a blossom drill with a song. After the program came the unique banquet at the new Manson Fruit Growers packing room nearby. This was followed by an auto parade of 125-200 autos through the orchards. A dance was held later that night at the pavilion.



M. E. Field was again the toastmaster for the Manson Apple Blossom Festival which took the form of a picnic at the Growers Union Warehouse. This was followed by a lively game of baseball between the Chelan and Manson boys at the Mission Church diamond, and a dance at the pavilion in the evening.

#### 1923

J. O. Killian was the general chairman. About 700

people gathered at the Manson Growers Warehouse for a basket lunch. The programs, "Johnny Apple Seed" and "Mid Summer Eve", were presented by both the high school and grade school students, as well as community members.

1924

Friday, May 1 is the day set aside for the Manson Apple Blossom Festival and therefore the afternoon has been proclaimed a holiday. All business establishments are requested to close during the Festival and join with Manson in celebrating their Apple Blossom Festival" The festival began with a basket picnic at the Community Hall, attended by an estimated 1000 people. After a baseball game played near the old Indian Church everyone returned to the hall for the evening program A dance followed with approximately 300 attending.

#### 1926

Friday, April 23 saw the largest crowd to date at the festival. J. O. Killian, entertainment chairman, introduced A. N. Banks who gave the welcome. School children performed "Yankee Doodle" and a pageant depicting various episodes in American history. Wenatchee's queen was in attendance. The afternoon baseball game between Wenatchee and Manson was followed by an evening program with various entertaining selections, including a Maypole Dance. By ten o'clock the floor was cleared and the dancing began.

• The 1947 Manson Apple Blossom Festival was special for two main reasons. The Festival was moved to Saturday and the first parade was held that year. The parade route was uphill, from west to east.

• The first Manson Apple Blossom Festival button was added in 1949. Many buttons were ordered and the extra buttons were used the following year. The date 1950 was printed over the previous year's date with fingernail polish.

• There were three Bennett women (Edna Bennett,

Nita Bennett, Susi Bennett) who created the first crowns for the royalties

starting in 1948. Mona Ferguson is the next Bennett family member making the royals crowns. She took over from Susi Bennett who retired from crown making in 2019.

- · The only outdoor coronation was held in 1949.
- The coronation robe was added in 1960 for Queen Jeanine Ferree.
- · Picnic and Basket lunches were served until 1938 when the chicken noodle dinner was added, yet in 1969 and 1970 fried chicken box lunches were served.
- · The Lake Chelan Fortnightly Club began honoring the Royalty in 1970. • In 1973, Edna Bennett
- made a permanent crown and scepter, with personal tiaras for the Queen and Princesses which The Apple Blossom Committee kept.
- The Edible Apple Contest began in 1980 in which Jama England was the first chairperson.
- In 1985, the Royal Court had a Queen and seven Princesses.
- · Two queens were ill during their reigns. Barbara Fort had the mumps in 1943 and Pam Blessin had the measles in 1973.

#### 1927

The Manson Grange conducted the festival this year (and many to follow). The Manson Military Band attired in their new uniforms appeared on the streets

of Chelan playing lively military music to remind Chelan folks of the festival. Wenatchee's Queen Beatrice ad Princesses Marjorie and Ruby were in attendance for the afternoon program. Mr. Wellington Pegg of Wenatchee addressed the audience and "went so far as to predict that time would see

10,000 people living on the shores of Lake Chelan". The usual evening program and dance followed.

Queen Ruby Phelps was the first queen of the Manson Apple Blossom Festival. Flower Girls were Juanita Davis and Betty Holden
