As COVID-19 spreads schools, meetings, events canceled

lease on Thursday, March 12 the Chelan-Dougls Health stated, "At least 12 of Washington State's 39 counties are now reporting COVID-19 cases and our Health District shares a border with four of them, including the two most affected counties in the nation. There are almost certainly cases already in our communities, though they may be mild or nonsymptomatic cases which are invisible yet still able to infect others. We do not yet have lab-confirmed cases.

Your local health department firmly urges the cancellation of in-person group events of any size, and especially the larger ones with over 20 participants, for the foreseeable future."

Then on Friday, March 13, Gov. Jay Inslee issued an executive order closing

CHELAN - In a press re- all schools until April 24 and banning all gatherings of 250 or more people. On Sunday, March 15 announced that on Monday, March 16 he would order the closure of all restaurants and bars and additionally, set new guidelines all gatherings. Gatherings over 50 participants are prohibited and all gatherings under 50 participants are prohibited unless previously announced criteria for public health and social distancing are met.

Chelan County PUD closed public access to its office lobbies and other public entrances, until further notice.

North Central Regional Library has announced that all of their libraries will be closed from March 16 until at least April 24.

Wenatchee Valley Humane Society has announced they also will be closed until April 24, all events at the Town Toyoto for March and April have been canceled.

Locally, the ever popular Chelan Earth Day 2020 has been cancelled.

CHELAN - Lake Chelan Community Hospital, Lake Chelan Clinic and EMS are preparing every day to care for you and your family; it's what we do and have done for more than 70 years.

City of Chelan statement on Corona Virus

City Council met in special session on March 16. The purpose of the special meeting was to participate in a Covid-19 Webinar sponsored by the Municipal Research and Services Center (MRSC) with Council discussion to follow. CHELAN - The Corona Virus is having a significant impact on the World, our Nation, and Washington State. This is especially true on the west side of our state. In the Seattle area, schools, businesses, restaurants, etc., have shut down and a large portion of the population has been negatively affected. However, North Central Washington has, so far, not been as severely im-

Editor's note: The Chelan pacted. That said, we must be prepared to take the appropriate actions to limit the negative effects of the virus on our City and the Chelan Valley.

> As we all know, there is a great volume of information on the web and in the news on the Corona Virus. Much of this information is accurate, but there is plenty of incorrect information out there. With all of this in mind, the City of Chelan will:

> • Collect and evaluate information about the Corona Virus, make every effort to confirm its validity, and then disseminate all that applies to Chelan and its citizens. We will do this using our website, the local media, and any other means at our disposal.

> • We will coordinate any actions the City may take with Chelan County and follow their lead on any emergency declarations, closures, etc. The City

will also maintain close communication with the Lake Chelan School District and our neighbor, Manson.

 Maintain close contact with our representatives and other State officials to keep them abreast of our local situation and to request any assistance the City may need.

• The City will make all necessary preparations to continue to serve our citizens in the event we are forced to close City Hall and other City facilities. This includes insuring we can provide all essential services needed to maintain health and safety.

The bottom line is that the City of Chelan's Mayor, Council and employees will do everything in our power to protect our citizens and provide the services necessary to keep the City up and running in the event this virus impacts Chelan.

Since the paper went to press the Lake Chelan Food Bank has made the following changes: This Saturday, March 21 will be the last Food Distribution until Monday, March 30 at 8:30 a.m. They will be no Food Distribution the week of March 23. April 6 will be the next Food Distribution after the week off. The schedule will then be reevaluated. Lake Chelan Food Bank provides food for 110 to 160 families each week, depending on the day of the month. Due to the COVID-19 virus those families are receiving their food 'drive-up' style to minimize the possible exposure to the virus to the volunteers. The Chelan Senior Center will be closed through March 25, due to health concerns surrounding the COVID-19 virus. The closure includes all SAIL classes (day and evening), vollevball, meals served at the center and all other meetings and private events, including Tax Preparation by the AARP on Saturdays. AARP Tax Prep is scheduled to start



again on March 28. Call the Center closer to that date to verify.

The lunch program will continue and is being offered on a take-out basis. Those seniors wanting a lunch need to call LeeAnne Weathersby at 509-888-4440 and order their lunch by 9:30 a.m. Monday thru Thursday. Those lunches will be available between 10:30 and 11:30 a.m. for pickup. Seniors who normally ride the bus to the Senior Center for lunch, will be picked up, brought to the Center and given their lunch to take home and eat. The meal delivery of meals by volunteers to the home bound will continue with no changes. Lunch will not be served at North Shore Bible Church in Manson.

The decision to close the Senior Center was made last week by the Chelan Senior Center board of directors. Signs are posted on the door as to the closure. Wenatchee and Leavenworth Senior Centers are also closing for two weeks. Lake Chelan Chamber of Commerce on Gov. Inslee's shutdown

CHELAN - The Lake Chelan Chamber of Commerce is continuing to monitor the developments around business financial impacts and closures. We are working to address business concerns. If you have health concerns, please contact your primary care provider or the Chelan-Douglas Health Department.

Governor Inslee's statement on statewide shutdown of restaurants and bars and new gathering limits are expanded.

Gov. Jay Inslee released a statement tonight (March 15) that further expands protections against COVID-19:

"Given the explosion of COVID-19 in our state and

ily shut down restaurants, bars and entertainment and recreational facilities.

"Restaurants will be allowed to provide take-out and delivery services but no in-person dining will be permitted.

"The ban will not apply to grocery stores and pharmacies. Other retail outlets will have reduced occupancy.

"Additionally, all gatherings with over 50 participants are prohibited and all gatherings under 50 participants are prohibited unless previously announced criteria for public health and social distancing are met.

"These are very difficult decisions, but hours count here and very strong measures are necessary to slow the spread of the disease. I know there will be significant economic impacts to all

"Tonight, after consultations with me and with the Department of Health, King County announced that they will be taking these actions immediately. King County has been the hotbed of this outbreak and has the largest population center in the state. I have spoken to Executive Dow Constantine and I applaud their decision to act quickly. We will do a joint media announcement with more details tomorrow morning."

The Lake Chelan Chamber of Commerce and our Board of Directors will continue to work with our regions' business and government organizations to monitor this very fluid situation. We will have additional information available to our membership as early as possible tomorrow (March 16). We appreciate your continued diligence and calm as we move through these uncertain times.

then be asked a few screening questions to determine your level of care before entering the building.

The Emergency Room entrance located behind the hospital building will remain unlocked. Our Patient Access staff will greet you. Staff will also ask you a few screening questions to determine your course of care or providing

you with visitor instructions.

Visitor Restrictions remain in effect:

Lake Chelan Community Hospital and Lake Chelan Clinic will continue to be on HIGH visitor restrictions.



Please feel free to reach out to me if you have any questions or concerns.

What does this mean?

• If you have a loved one in the hospital, it is highly recommended to keep visits to a minimum (one or two people) and practice hand hygiene for the protection of loved ones, other patients and staff. If you are sick or believe you might have COVID-19 symptoms, visits will be prohibited.

• Upon arriving at either Lake Chelan Clinic or Lake Chelan Hospital, you will initially be asked health screening questions and may be asked to wear a mask.

• If you have scheduled appointments, you may receive a call prior to your appointment and asked a few questions about how you are feeling. If you do have symptoms consistent with the Coronavirus of fever, new cough, or shortness of breath, your appointment may be rescheduled.

 As a precautionary measure, if you have an appointment at the hospital or clinic, please consider not bringing extra people with you to your appointment, especially people who are of high risk of severe illness.

Who is at High Risk?

• People 60 and older

• People with underlying health conditions including heart disease, respiratory illness and diabetes

· People who have weakened immune systems

• People who are pregnant

What do I do if I think I may be feeling symptoms consistent with the Coronavirus?

• If you are exhibiting symptoms such as fever, new cough and shortness of breath, that you feel may be consistent with Coronavirus. we ask that you DO NOT show up at the hospital or clinic unannounced. Instead, please call the hospital at 509-682-3300 or Lake Chelan Clinic at 509-682-2511, so we

may ask you a few questions that will best determine your course of care.

• If you have an emergency and need immediate medical attention, please call 9-1-1 or go to the nearest emergency room.

Do I need to be tested for **COVID-19?**

There are currently no restrictions on who can be tested for COVID-19 and commercial testing is becoming more available. Healthcare providers may test any patient with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 (e.g., fever, cough, shortness of breath), but until testing supplies and laboratory capacity are widely available, public health is asking providers to follow specific processes for testing.

Patients with COVID-19 symptoms should contact their healthcare provider and be tested for COVID-19 if their symptoms worsen or their healthcare provider recommends testing:

• Patients older than 60 years

 Patients with underlying medical conditions

· Pregnant women

Younger, healthy individuals with mild illness do not need to be tested and testing is not recommended in persons who are asymptomatic due to the current national supply shortage.

The LCCHC Emergency Preparedness Team will continue to work with Public Health and implement or consider recommendations as they develop. Together as a community, we can help minimize the risk of exposure to COVID-19. Do you need an antibacterial soap? No! The key to effectively cleaning your hands is removing bacteria and viruses from their surface by using friction and then rinsing them away, not by attacking them with a chemical.

4.Don't skimp on hand gel.

Many people swipe hand gel around and that's it. Apply enough gel so that it takes about 15 seconds to dry completely.

Sing or hum a catchy song that lasts for at least 15 seconds while you wash your hands. It helps kids learn effective handwashing and keeps you (and them) from stopping too soon

6.Antibacterial soap is not required.

Effective handwashing or sanitizing depends on using good technique, not on wiping with soap that contains an antibacterial chemical.
