Chelan County PUD board approves rate plan with moderate increases

Steps now will help reduce risk of larger future increases

WENATCHEE - Chelan County PUD commissioners on Tuesday (Feb. 18) approved a five-year plan of moderate utility rate increases, as called for in the strategic plan, to help reduce the risk of larger increases in the future.

Commissioners unanimously approved the plan outlined in the 2020-2024 strategic plan and discussed over the last several months.

The plan goes into effect on June 1 for the PUD's residential electric, water, wastewater and wholesale Fiber customers. Rate changes for commercial and industrial electric customers are set for Dec. 1. After that, annual changes will be effective on June 1, 2021-2024.

Under the approved plan, the average home electric bill will increase in small annual steps from about \$55 a month now to \$63.75 in 2024. The residential rate change is focused on the

customer charge, which is the fixed amount on the monthly bill that recovers the cost of being connected to the grid, no matter the amount of power used.

As directed by the strategic plan, the increased electric rate revenue will go into reserves to help reduce the risk of large rate increases in the future.

Other rate changes approved are:

- 3-percent, per-year electric rate change for all non-residential customers
- 4-percent water and wastewater change per year to move the systems toward sustainability
- 3-percent per year wholesale Fiber rate change

Discounts for low income senior and disabled customers also will increase by 3 percent for electric and 4 percent for water and wastewater. This is the first change in electric rates in nine years.

General Manager Steve Wright noted the extensive billing system work needed to put the rate changes into place and cautioned that the effective dates could be adjusted if more time is needed. "Our No. 1 priority is producing accurate bills," Wright said.

Commissioners thanked

staff and customer-owners for being involved through strategic planning and in this year's rate discussions.

Board President Garry Arseneault recognized the energy shown by all in getting to this point. "It didn't happen quickly, but it happened carefully. Thank you to everyone," Arseneault said.

Added Commissioner Steve McKenna, "I really appreciate the process... It has been exemplary and well thought out. There was a great deal of time taken and a lot of public comment sought and received."

In other business, commissioners:

- Approved the purchase of a quarter-acre parcel from Scott McDougall that could offer a first step toward a possible loop trail extension and added shoreline access to the Wenatchee River. The land is next to the PUD's new Service Center site in Olds Station. Dan Frazier, Shared Service director, said one comment in support of the purchase was received since discussion at the Feb. 3 board meeting that included points helpful in understanding public access to the river. The sale price is \$300,000

and terms call for closing before March 5. (00:42)

- Reviewed Energy Resources' fourth quarter 2019 results. Energy Trading Manager Janet Jaspers reported 2019's net wholesale and other energy-related revenue was \$7.7 million more than budget, noting that retained surplus proceeds on a long-term hydro contract and real-time agreement revenues more than offset impacts from low stream flows and unit outages.

- Rescheduled the board workshop to 9 a.m. on Friday, May 1, at Confluence Technology Center, 285 Technology Way, Wenatchee. (01:22)

The Manson FFA was started in 1955 and current has 35 members.

The Manson FFA participates in a wide variety of activities throughout the year starting in the fall with the North Central Washington Fair, followed by the Chelan County Fair, where students take their livestock projects and shop projects to be judged. They start their livestock project's as earlier as November or December of the past year. Most livestock projects will start in the spring.

After the fairs are over they move on to Apple Judging both at the local, and district level which Manson FFA host at the Manson Grange Hall, followed by state competition.

During the winter months they participate in numerous shop contest showing off their shop skills, as well as traveling to Spokane to take in one of the largest Agriculture Exhibits in the Northwest called Ag Expo.

In the spring time they move into leadership events like, first year member for freshman, Creed Contest, Public Speaking, and Job Interview. Livestock judging at Okanogan happens in March, followed by the state FFA convention in

May.

WASHINGTON OUTDOOR REPORT

The politics of fish, fishing and boating

The States of Washington and Oregon have taken a number of actions in the last week that will affect both our fish populations and those who fish for them. Here's a brief rundown of the four issues at the forefront this week:

GILLNETS TO REMAIN IN THE COLUMBIA RIVER IN 2020: The Directors of the Oregon and Washington Departments of Fish and Wildlife released a joint announcement on Valentines Day as to how salmon will be allocated between commercial and recreational anglers in the Columbia River this year.

The main thing that stands out in this announcement is gillnetting will again be allowed on the mainstem of the Columbia River for fall Chinook, a practice that was supposed to end in 2019. The Northwest Sportfishing Industry Association and Coastal Conservation Association say this new rule opens the door to increased gillnetting on the river, a charge WDFW denies. All this comes at an inopportune time for WDFW which is hoping for support from the state legislature to fill a gaping 26-million-dollar budget shortfall.

MANDATORY LIFE JACKETS? Currently, personal flotation devices (PFDs) are required to be used by children under 12 in small boats but a bill introduced in the State House proposed making the wearing of life jackets mandatory for boaters of all ages.

The original bill (HB 2443) made this mandatory on a lot of powered fishing boats under 19 feet in length as well as drift boats, row boats, canoes, kayaks and stand up paddleboards (SUPs).

An amended bill that passed the State House now eliminates the length of the boat and now says PFDs would be required for anyone between the ages of 13 and 18 using a human powered watercraft except for competitive rowers, surfers and those on stand-up paddle boards if the user is tethered to the board with a leash or (and I'm not making this up) participating in yoga on a SUP in a designated swimming area or within 100 feet of shore.

There is no doubt this bill will save lives. However, some question whether our state government is acting too motherly by mandating the use of life jackets in vessels that may only be floating in two feet of water. The bill got its first hearing by the in the Senate on February 18th.

SOME FISH ARE MORE EQUAL THAN OTHERS: In Washington State, cold-water fish such as salmon, trout and steelhead are definitely more equal than their warm-water brethren bass, walleye and catfish. In recent years limits were abolished for these warmwater fish on the Columbia River below Chief Joseph Dam to help with the survival of steelhead and salmon smolts. This will undoubtedly impact a world class walleye and smallmouth bass fishery on the Columbia sooner than later as anglers keep as many fish as they want.

Now the Washington Dept. of Fish and Wildlife has announced expanded limits for warmwater spe-

cies in 77 lakes across the state where salmon pass through as well as in all rivers and beaver ponds statewide. Those limits are:

Largemouth bass: Change from 5 to a 10-fish daily limit; anglers must release fish between 12 and 17 inches, and only one fish may be over 17 inches.

Smallmouth bass: Change from 10 to a 15-fish daily limit; only one fish may be over 14 inches.

Channel catfish: Change from 5 to a 10-fish daily limit. No minimum size.

Walleye: Change from 8 to a 16-fish daily limit; only one fish may be over 22 inches.

In the short term this will provide lots of meat for anglers who enjoy catching and keeping these fish. In the long term though, a number of quality fisheries will be turning into not-so quality ones soon as fish in both size and number are depleted. A few examples include Silver Lake in Cowlitz County known for a great largemouth bass fishery, Osoyoos Lake in Okanogan County which is one of the better smallmouth bass destinations in the state and the Palouse River in Southeast Washington where anglers go for big catfish in the spring.

As to whether or not these rules will significantly help salmon and steelhead which face a host of other survival issues? That remains to be seen.

COLVILLE RIVER IS OPEN FOR YEAR-AROUND FISHING: Last but not least, another rule change from WDFW returns year-round fishing to the Colville River from the mouth of the river at Lake Roosevelt upstream to the bridge in the small town of valley.



Tips to prepare you and your loved ones for an emergency

(BPT) - Fires can occur when you least expect it, leaving little time to plan your escape, so the time to prepare for an emergency isn't when your alarm sounds. According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), only 32% of American households have actually developed and practiced an emergency escape plan. Make time to sit down with your family to plan and practice what you would do in case of a fire or carbon monoxide (CO) emergency. Consider the following tips when helping to prepare yourself and your loved ones:

1. Map it out. Begin thinking about a home fire escape plan by first drawing a map of your home, making sure to label each window and door. Identify two ways out of each room and walk through your home to make sure the doors and windows you've chosen as exits open easily. If your family's home has a second floor, consider having escape ladders in each room. You can find templates online to help you get started.
2. Choose a meeting spot. After you have mapped out all of the ways you can exit, pick an outside meeting spot a safe distance away from your home, such as across the street, at a mailbox or in front of the neighbor's home. Be sure that your family knows that once they are outside, they need to call 911 and stay outside. Additionally, explain it is important that everyone knows never to re-enter the home for any reason and to let a firefighter know if someone is missing.
3. Help your loved ones. Assign someone in your family who can assist infants, seniors or pets during a fire. The responsible person should be in good health and be able to provide the assistance needed.
4. Check your smoke alarms. Having working smoke alarms on each level of the home and in every

sleeping area is key to having a safe home. Check that you have alarms properly installed throughout your home and remember to test all of the alarms regularly and replace them at least every 10 years. If you have children, consider installing a First Alert Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Alarm with voice and location technology throughout your home, and especially in their bedroom. This alarm will notify your child of an emergency, distinguishing between a fire or carbon monoxide incident, in a human voice as opposed to a regular alarm. This is especially helpful if a fire strikes at night. Studies have shown children may have an easier time waking up to the sound of a human voice rather than an alarm.
"Smoke alarms are designed to give early warning in case of fire, and making sure your home has properly installed and maintained alarms is the best defense

against one," said Tarsila Wey, director of marketing for First Alert. "As far as CO is concerned, the only way to detect this fatal gas is with a CO alarm, so have one installed on each level of the home and near every sleeping area."
5. Plan. Practice. Repeat. Once your escape plan is finalized, your job is not done. Gather your family together and put your plan in action. Practice this plan at least twice a year, so if disaster strikes, your family will feel confident in their ability to exit the home safely. To make the drills as realistic as possible, conduct them both during the day and at night.
"Planning ahead can save a life," added Wey. "Talk with your family to make a plan that fits all of your needs."
