## Short term rentals scrutinized at meeting

WENATCHEE -- A packed house attended the Chelan County Planning Commission (CCPC) meeting at the Confluence Technology Center Wednesday, August 26.

The two-hour evening affair featured residential speakers from throughout the county and non-residential rental property owners, many who live on the westside of the state.

Manson resident and Community Councilwoman Kathy Blum stressed to the Commission that she felt the “quality of life” has experienced a “steady decline” due to under-regulated short term rental properties in the Lake Chelan town.

She called for a “well regulated” rental industry that will ease the concerns of Manson residents and help all parties coexist.

Dan Beardslee, BNCW’s Government Affairs Analyst, spoke to the Board on behalf of that housing industry non-profit trade association, say-

ing it would take \$750,000 to hire enough county personnel to enforce new regulations as it is currently understaffed.

BNCW CEO Lee Pfluger, stated in an email reply to this reporter, “BNCW has not taken a position against nor in favor of STRs at this point. We

do however oppose the proposed code changes currently in front of the Chelan County Planning Commission.”

Pfluger continued, “The current proposal as written has not been vetted out properly and leaves many unanswered questions, many of which we

addressed in our letter. Since drafting the letter there are a number of other questions and issues that have come up.”

BNCW is a well known advocacy group defending the rights of the building community. Pfluger said, “One being since the STR permit is a land use permit involving zoning issues it is very likely that a court would find that all of the current STRs would be exempt from the permit requirements as they have been legally operating at their current locations for years in many cases, and would be considered a “legal non-conforming use” under the new standards. Just like if someone legally built a duplex and subsequent zoning changes barred duplexes, existing duplexes would be considered “a legal non-conforming use.”

Pfluger states, “There is really nothing in the proposed regulations that would lead to better enforcement of existing parking, noise, or nuisance ordinances already in place.”

He continued, “There is language in the proposal stat-

## American Legion celebrates 100th birthday

MANSON - One hundred years ago the American Legion evolved from a group of war-weary veterans of World War I into one of the most prominent nonprofit groups in the United States. American Legion goals include a commitment to mentoring youth and sponsorship of wholesome programs in our communities, advocating patriotism and honor, promoting strong national security, and continued devotion to our fellow service members and veterans.

March 15, 1919 members of the American Expeditionary Force convene in Paris for the first American Legion caucus. May 8 “The American Legion” is adopted as the organization’s official name. The Legion’s draft preamble and constitution are approved. June 9 the National Executive

Committee adopts the Legion emblem and September 16, 1919 the United States Congress charters the American Legion. Today, membership stands at nearly 2 million in more than 13,000 posts world-

wide.

Manson American Legion Post 108 celebrated this special birthday on August 24 with a “100th Birthday Barbecue” at Singleton Park in Manson. Event organizer, Vice Com-

mander Brian Stausbaugh said, “The celebration not only recognized the American Legion’s 100 years, we acknowledged and gave thanks to

ing that after 3 complaints an STR's permit can be revoked, however no appeals process is defined and there is no protection for unfounded complaints. If the county were to adopt the current proposal there would certainly be costly lawsuits around a number of issues. The current proposal would impose significant burdens on current and future STRs while at the same time not really doing anything to alleviate the issues that STRs neighbors face, all while opening up the county to costly lawsuits...

"We do not believe that Chelan Community Development engaged the community adequately before drafting this proposal. I find it odd that County Commissioners have stated publicly that 'we are in the early stages of drafting this proposal.'"

Pfluger commented, "Typically a hearing in front of the Planning Commission takes place near the end of the process, with their recommendation being forwarded to the County Commissioners for adoption or rejection."

He concluded, "It is our position that the county needs to go back to the drawing board on this issue. Unfortunately at this point parties on both sides

of the issue are dug in and there doesn't seem to be much interest in coming together in an effort to reach a workable solution."

A large group of meeting attendees wearing bright yellow T-shirts, members of the Short Term Rental Alliance of Chelan County, or STRACC, were in attendance to show solidarity in favor of less draconian regulations.

One member, Tom Latta of Auburn, claimed that the Chelan County Sheriff's Office has only had "two complaints in two years in regards to tenants of rental properties."

Latta said the SCSO responded to area hotels and

motels at a far greater rate.

The irony of Chelan County having two major destination resort towns, Leavenworth and the Lake Chelan area, is that both areas spend a small fortune to attract tourists every year and those advertisements have been successful.

Some short term rentals easily cost \$400 a day with higher rates during festivals, especially Leavenworth's Oktoberfest, Christmas Lightning and Chelan's Winterfest and summer lake season.

Though the massive influx of money is great for business owners, some residents aren't too happy with what they perceive as lax enforcement

of ordinances by the town councils. The CCSO is the only law enforcement entity these towns have, but civil zoning enforcement is a matter for each town to figure out for themselves. Now there is the possibility that the CCPC will move to take care of short term rentals that exist out of town boundaries, but in the county.

It is that board's job to make recommendations to the Chelan County Commissioners for any suggested policies to be enacted into law.

### Italian Villa

Massive stonework architecture defines the exterior aspect of this custom home set in a terraced rock garden and built by the owners. The floors are acacia hardwood and the walls are finished with silky Venetian plaster applied by a European artist. In the Great Room, a Craftsman-style chandelier illuminates the tall ledger stone and Saturna porcelain tile fireplace and a gathering of roomy leather chairs and sofas. Beyond the dining area, the designer kitchen is finished in gorgeous “brown rainforest” granite, chrome fixtures, and professional Viking appliances. Throughout the home, all the

doors are knotty alder, and mirrored wall niches add texture and interest.

The master suite features a king sleigh bed, a private balcony with sweeping views, and a two-sided fireplace. In the ensuite bath, glass tiles accentuate cool tones of gray granite. Above the elevated tub, a wide picture window overlooks the lake.

A bath with an enormous shower leads to the swimming pool, on its private terrace with views of the lake, surrounded by stamped concrete and gardens of red roses.

## Sen. Cantwell gets \$225K grant for Chelan, Douglas, Okanogan counties

Small Business Committee. “Creating strong private and public partnerships will help the region find new and innovative ways to increase job growth and economic opportunity.”

## THE WASHINGTON OUTDOORS REPORT

**September Dove**  
Sept. 1 was opening day for dove hunting, a season much more popular in years past than it is now. Mourning Dove are migratory birds, here for the summer and gone with the first frost though there are a few tough ones that remain into the winter months.  
For many hunters, dove provide a fun warm-up for the season ahead. It’s an opportunity to fire a few (or a lot) of shells at birds that can be surprisingly hard to hit not only because of their smaller size but also because of their acrobatic maneuvers.  
The dove opener is also a social event. The competitiveness seen amongst duck hunters racing to their favorite spot to beat out other hunters isn’t really a factor here. In fact, fast friends can be made in a dove field and the more eyes the better when it comes to spotting these birds as they approach. Add to the fact

that several hunters may shoot at any given bird before anyone manages to hit their target and some good-natured laughing at the misses and congratulations at the clean hits are often the norm.  
Then there are the dogs. Like their owners, it is usually the first hunt of the season and the excitement is palpable. During the dove opener you’ll likely see a variety of hunting breeds racing to sniff out and retrieve these birds after a successful shot; not an easy task given dove give off very little scent. It being the first of September, it is important to keep your dog hydrated with plenty of water and don’t over work that pup as the heat of the day comes on.  
Hunter orange is not required for dove hunting and camouflage clothing does help. Another tactic involves the use of dove decoys. Put a few on barbed wire fences or bare tree limbs and you’ll be in a good position to attract some dove your way hoping to roost near them. Shotguns favored by

hunters range from 12 gauge to 28 gauge. Light loads (#8 in lead shot or #7 ½ to #6 in steel shot), work well on these birds.  
What makes a good dove location? Quite often, a freshly cut wheat or alfalfa field will bring in flocks of mourning dove intent on feeding. If you can find good roosting locations bordering these fields such as trees or a nearby water source, you’ll likely be in for a very good hunt. In years past the Washington Dept. of Fish



and Wildlife allowed farmers to plant crops dove and other wildlife were attracted to in select State Wildlife Management Areas but that is rare now due to budget constraints. This means knocking on doors and getting permission from farmers to hunt on their land is often the best way to secure a good hunting spot. Absent that, look for public land that abuts a farmer’s field the birds are drawn to or find an area near ag fields with roosting trees

or water sources on them like ponds and lakes.  
Where should you go to find dove? You’ll want to head East of the Cascades into Central and Eastern Washington. If you look at the harvest statistics from the last five years there are three counties, all of which have lots of agricultural land, that stand out. Grant County is year in and out the best place to go if you are after a limit of mourning dove but both Yakima and Franklin Counties offer excellent oppor-

tunities as well with some 8,000 to 9,000 birds taken by hunters every year. Walla Walla, Benton, Adams, Douglas and Spokane Counties are options too. Harvest numbers in these counties range from 1,300 to 4,000 birds each season.  
Last, but not least, enjoy the harvest. There are several great recipes for dove ranging from apricot dove to dove kabobs to dove poppers. Google search any of these dishes for some great ideas on how to prepare these tasty birds which offer great table fare.  
If you plan on going out for a mourning dove hunt, you’ll need not only a small game license but also a state migratory bird permit. The season runs from September 1 through October 30 and the daily limit has expanded to 15 birds.

# Good fire planned on over 11,000 acres across forest this fall

CHELAN - From the Canadian border to south of Yakima, firefighters in Central Washington are planning to burn thousands of acres this fall to increase forest health and protect nearby communities. Excluded from the ecosystem for nearly 100 years, frequent,

low-intensity fire is essential for restoring public lands and the communities who depend on them.  
“This is a fire forest plain and simple. We should no sooner starve a rainforest of its rain than a fire forest of its fire,” said Forest Fire Management Officer, Rob Allen. “Be to better protected and prepared for when

wildfires visit, our communities nestled in this fire forest need frequent, lower intensity fire on nearby public lands.”  
While over 11,000 acres are planned this fall, fewer acres may be completed if conditions are not favorable. Conditions include correct temperature, wind, fuel moisture and ventilation for smoke. When these

criteria are met, firefighters implement, monitor, and patrol each burn to ensure it meets forest health and public safety goals including air quality.  
“While this summer was relatively quiet, there will always be fire and smoke here,” added Allen. “Every acre we burn now is one less acre burning under high-intensity, unsafe, dense smoke conditions in future summers.”
