Open house Aug. 14 on plans for future work on US 97A/SR 971

CHELAN - Public input sought in person and online to help develop traffic control plans during rock slope scaling work in 2020.

Travelers who regularly use US 97A can help choose the best times for rock slope scaling work during the 2020 construction season.

The Washington State Department of Transportation is seeking public comment regarding the best time for closures during the much needed work. Specialized contractors will remove loose rock and debris from the slopes adjacent to US 97A to reduce the risk of it falling onto the highway.

All of this work takes time. during which traffic cannot scaling in 2020. Responses retravel through the work zone. At the upcoming in person

and the online open houses, the public can comment on whether all day or short closures of approximately 30 minutes make more sense for the area. Longer closures mean more work can be accomplished but with more affect to travel times, and vice versa for shorter duration choices.

Devore Creek Fire near Stehekin now at 450 acres

Final update unless significant new activity occurs

STEHEKIN - As of August 11, 2019 - 9 a.m. Acres: 450. Location: 3 air miles southwest of Stehekin, Wash. Completion: Season-ending weather event. Cause: Lightning. Current Activity: About a quarter of an inch of rain fell over the fire area on Satur-

day and minimal fire activity was observed. While not a "season ending" event that would put the fire out, the rain, cooler temperatures and higher humidity have combined to slow fire activity significantly.

The Phoenix National Incident Management Organization (NIMO) Team that has been working on the Devore Creek Fire for the past 13 days will transfer command to a local, Type 3 organization tomorrow morning (August 12). The NIMO team leaves behind a detailed plan of actions that can be used if the fire comes back to life in a way that threatens people or property. The fire is expected to burn until sus-



Hosting a listening tour allows me to hear ideas that can be turned into successful legislative action. As examples, a suggestion by Leavenworth officials to dispose of brush and yard clippings resulted in a bill that became law in 2018. A funding request related to the Saddle Rock trail in Wenatchee became reality when it was included in the state capital budget two years ago, and a road paving project to a popular fishing location in Okanogan County was recently funded and will be completed in the coming months. All were ideas presented by constituents during past listening tours. In addition to legislative ideas, I also collect helpful insight and comments that prepare me to make better decisions to represent you in Olympia.

As we have done the previous two years, I have invited my legislative staff, communications staff and issue specialists to join me on the tour. It's

Peter got his ham license in Switzerland. He held offices in Chelan's ham club with his dear friend J.M. Bolomey, also from Switzerland.


