LCSD board approves 2019-20 budget, hears presentation

CHELAN - Lake Chelan School District Board Chair Jim Colbert began the July 30 meeting with a questions and comments period relative to the 2019-2020 budget in which no members of the public had any input.

District business manager Scott Renick provided the Board an overview of this year's budget. Renick mentioned that there are three items that make up the budget; 1. State funding which is based only on enrollment, 2. Transportation and 3. Food service based on number of meals. In the General Fund, the District estimates over \$21 million in revenues. "Both the revenue piece and the expenditure piece include about \$800,000 in added capacity," said Renick. That extra money is added in case next year's enrollment fluctuates, the extra is also there in case the District gets grants that would require them to use money from the General Fund. This year, Renick anticipates that the District will have "a break even year."

Afterwards, the Board voted and approved the 2019-2020 District budget.

The Board heard Teaching and Learning Director Heidi Busk presentation on the highly capable, English Language Learners (ELL) and Professional Development programs in the District. In her presentation Busk reported that this year 57 students qualified for the highly capable program, out those students 21 percent are Hispanic. Busk compared 2018, 2019 District and state wide ELL data to show the Board the success the program is having in exiting students in the third through tenth grade. In 2019, 51 students exited the ELL program which Busk mentioned is a good percentage number. Last year alone, 103 teachers logged 1,325 hours of in-District professional development training. For the upcoming school year, Busk reported that in the teacher's contract for the year, the teacher will get an

additional paid day to attend a professional development workshop after school.

Superintendent Barry De-Paoli reported to the Board that five candidates will be interviewed for the Special Programs Director position. DePaoli also mentioned that WSDOT needs a small portion of land on Farnham Street owned by the District in order for them to upgrade the ADA ramp. "They would pay us \$500," said DePaoli. The board agreed and Colbert signed the authorization for the easement. The two flashing beacons in front of Chelan High School are almost completed and should be ready for the upcoming school year. "We should have a safer pedestrian crossing, it is not going to reduce traffic, but it is going to make it safer," said DePaoli. Similarly, the beacons at Morgen Owings Elementary will be "safer for the kids."

DePaoli presented a proposal of rental rates for the conference and board rooms.

Planet walk at Riverwalk park is ready for you to orbit around

CHELAN - The Lake Chelan Rotary has been in the process of installing an interactive planet walk on the south side of Riverwalk Park that will educate young and old about our solar

After three months of conversations with Chelan Public Utility District (PUD) Commissioners, Rotarian Russ Jones was able to receive the green light for the project.

Jones first brought up the educational concept five years ago. "I thought it would be a cool thing to have here, where people can get the basic knowledge of our solar system: the order of the planets and just a little bit of astronomy information," he explained.

The different planet stations will be spaced along the walk to a scale of true distance from the sun, and each will be made out of durable material. Each planet will be scaled down to match the 18-inch sun. In the stations there will be a picture of the planet along with a plaque full of information and a QR scan that will take you directly to NASA's website for more information.

Twenty-five fellow Rotarians have been involved with the project, plus a number of astronomers have also reviewed the information that will be posted at each station. The total cost of the project is \$15,000 and roughly half



Heritage Heights to host reception Chelan's Jerry Isenhart talks about his featuring portraits of the residents life and times now that he's in 'the Hall' SUBMITTED BY LAKE CHELAN

CHELAN -- Jerry Isenhart sat down with NCW Media Managing Editor Gary Bégin on his back porch overlooking the beautiful southernmost part of Lake Chelan for three hours of history lessons and days gone Q&A discussion.

This is a shortened version of a much longer article to be found in the September Wenatchee Business journal:

"I remain humbled and honored, to say the least. It is the most meaningful professional honor I have ever received in my entire career," said Jerry Isenhart, a local journalism and civic leader icon about his recent induction into the Edward R. Murrow Journalism Hall of Fame last May.

Isenhart grew up on a farm on the outskirts of Wenatchee and eventually came to Chelan as a 24-year-old and immediately made an impact on the life of this tiny resort village. He was to be the new owner/ operator of KOZI. He literally reinvented and reinvigorated the tiny rural radio station in the 1960s making it a "must listen" for the residents of Chelan and

It was especially important back then as a way of tracking wild fires.

From the day he took control of KOZI, time flew by. By the mid 1970's KOZI had become a solid member of the Lake Chelan Community. "I was 25-years-old when the purchase was approved. I was told that I was the youngest owner of any broadcast station in the U.S. at that time," Isenhart said.

About the Hall of Fame award, Isenhart said, "It is especially meaningful because Murrow College has produced an incredible list of highly respected graduates over the

KOZI went on to be named the best small market radio station in the state by the Associated Press in the early 1980s.

Well before that, around 1972, Isenhart invented a new interactive talk show

-- 2nd Cup of Coffee, which he calls, "an early form of Social Media.'

Isenhart had a radical idea and it worked. "We turned the tables on our listeners and said we wanted to make the them

(listeners and callers) the stars of the show and their calls and comments the highlight of the day. Our staff were just the moderators. It worked. Within six months of launch we had gathered an impressive following that never stopped growing," Isenhart recounted.

Isenhart sold the station to Harriet Bullitt of Leavenworth in 1999 for \$2 million. Isenhart

then went on to invent another new concept - Go-LakeChelan. com, which he ran from 2001 to 2018 before selling

"I called GoLakeChelan an experiment in technology, which indeed it was. The vision

was an on-line newspaper and radio station combined, with unlimited space for photos and

videos, he said. "I felt it would be truly successful if it could be interactive with those who patronized the web site. GoLakeChelan was ahead of it's time. It was six more years before Apple released the IPhone, and three more years before Google, Gmail, Word Press, amd MySpace were launched. The biggest challenges to

GoLakeChelan were that there was no model to copy, no book to read on how to do it. Isenhart found a way to

make things work despite the "ancient" technology prevalent back then. "I have come to believe that

nothing is by accident.

The pathway of my journey has had far too many very identifiable landmarks to believe it was all just by chance. To wake up every morning and look forward to going to work is the best way to describe the daily routine. In the world of news, there was never two days the same, and that would keep the energy flowing," Isenhart

He concluded about his journalism adventures, "Exciting would be an understatement."

Why the cloak 'n' dagger Schrier?

Last Monday, July 29, marked the second time (that I know of) newly elected Congresswoman Kim Schrier decided to keep her local events as eerily unannounced as possible, kind of like a Schrier Shell Game.

The first time was a few months ago when she met on a Saturday with a selected audience and Wenatchee Mayor Frank Kuntz in the city meeting room to announce her new area representative would be taking up quarters in an office within city hall. She also spent an hour taking questions from the obviously partisan pro-Kim audience. A great coup for Frank, but a disappointment for the news media, since some of us were never told about this event.

Who should have given out the press release well in advance? City Hall or Schrier's staff? I guess both would have been a good thing, but neither did. I discovered it by accident through a friend who was told about by an-

Then, the Schrier Shell Game struck again on Monday, July 29. Schrier went to visit kids in a Manson school for a summer lunch program, but the event notice came on a Friday afternoon. A typical political ploy when attention isn't wanted. She also visited the Lake Chelan Chamber of Commerce and the CVCH walk-in clinic in Chelan.

It has been said for many years that when Washington, D.C. politicians want to announce bad news, they wait until late on a Friday evening so as little press as possible can shed light on the issues.

Why has Schrier adopted this strategy, or has she? I think I'll just blame her unwitting staff who thinks it is just fine that no local news at an event means no articles or photos or pestering of the doctor turned liberal crusader can occur.

I'm also guessing that she knows this area of the state may be a bit too conservative for her tastes, another reason to avoid the press.

Luckily NCW Media, a family-owned community news organization, has a reporter in the Manson/Chelan area that works for our Lake Chelan Mirror branch.

Exactly what does Schrier gain by hiding her local visits? Nothing, unless she's concealing something.

Let me take a wild guess. Her staff will now blame the school district or the Lake Chelan Chamber or CVCH for not sending out an earlier press release. Yes, that would have been great of all of them to do so, but maybe they were told not to?

Perhaps she needs to understand that conservative North Central Washington voters have as much right to visit Schrier's events as her hand picked audiences do.

Our reporter on the ground in Chelan also said someone from Schrier's staff was there shooting photos, but there was no other media present.

In conclusion, I believe this is an attempt by Schrier and her handlers to "control the news" by not being transparent with her itinerary and then, maybe, sending out a press release after the fact.

I guess I was thinking liberals always wanted as much attention as possible, but

Every three years, the hospital and regional partners from Chelan, Douglas, Grant and Okanogan counties collaborate and perform a CHNA to better understand north central Washington's community health needs. The organizations use gathered information to provide direction and impact population health.

The region developed its last CHNA in 2016. The four highest priority needs identified at that time were mental health care access, access to health care, education and obesity.

The 2019 CHNA steering committee is now collecting community input about what impacts health in Chelan County and, specifically, in the Lake Chelan Valley. The upcoming focus group will help the committee determine the community's priority health needs and provide direction for improving health and wellbeing in the LCCHC hospital district.

Focus group participants will identify strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats related to health in our community. Please join the group to improve the health and wellness of the Lake Chelan valley. The Chelan Senior Center is located at 534 E. Trow.







Drinks and grub, a clown and all manner of critters on four feet, ...and they call it rodeo (apologies to Garth Brooks).




