
Chelan Fire & Rescue holds town hall meeting

Dozen plus community members attend

CHELAN - As it was announced in April, Chelan Fire and Rescue held a town hall meeting on May 30 to inform the public on their future plans regarding funding, apparatus replacement, fire chief succession and staffing. The evening's event was held at the Chelan Senior Center, only a dozen or so community members gathered together to hear from CFR's chief officers and commissioners.

Chelan Fire and Rescue Fire Chief Tim Lemon commenced the presentation with an overview of the night's agenda. Lemon also introduced the three fire commissioners who were present: Russ Jones, Jay Witherbee and Phil Moller and thanked all for attending the event. Lemon then tran-

sitioned into talking about CFR's mission and responsibilities. He clarified that the primary mission of CFR is to protect the lives and property of the year-round residents and visitors. "We cover 125 square miles and we operate five fire stations," said Lemon. CFR works with neighboring fire agencies in Manson, Entiat, Orondo and Pateros.

"If we call they come, if they call we go," however CFR only responds to mutual aid if they have the staffing capabilities to do it. Some CFR firefighters/EMTs are signed up to aid with the State Mobilization Fires which create revenue for the district. "Our people get significant experience and they bring that home. That skill is valuable to us," stated

CFR is responsible for containing and extinguishing structural and vehicle fires. They also respond to wildland fires in partnership with the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and U.S. Forest Service. In terms of emergency medical responses CFR is responsible for basic

life support services and it's supported by Lake Chelan Community Hospital and Clinics EMS. Lemon mentioned that all CFR staff are first aid trained. CFR also deals with vehicle extractions and runs a special operation unit. Public education and fire prevention services are also provided by

New personnel introduced at LCCHC meeting

 $Hospital\ Project\\ Manager\ replaced$

CHELAN - Lake Chelan Community Hospital and Clinics Board of Commissioners approved the hiring of Dick Bratton as new hospital project manager and of Jerry Boyce as the owner's representative at the May 28 regular meeting.

The recommendation of hiring both individuals came from the Facilities Steering Committee whose members met on May 6 and interviewed the candidates. LCCHC CEO Steve Patonai explained that both interviewed very well and have strong experience. "Both had special skills and each had advantages over the other," said Patonai. On May, 28 the committee met early morning and made the decision to move forward with hiring them both. Bratton will over-

see the entire project and coordinate it while Boyce will be onsite during the construction. This made the most sense to the committee, since, Bratton lives in the West side of the Cascades and Boyce lives in town and will be more "cost effective." Both contracts came under the budgeted \$400,000 originally set aside for a project manager. With the approval of the board, Bratton and Boyce will begin working on June 1.

New LCCHC Chief Financial Officer Mike Ellis and Chief Human Resources Officer Kate Pina were introduced and welcomed by Board chair Phyllis Gleasman. In the last five years Ellis has been working with small critical access hospitals and has an administrative experience of 15 years. Pina brings to LCCHC 25 years of human resources experience, both have Execu-

Chelan City Council approves funding for summer shuttle marketing program

CHELAN - Chelan will have a summer shuttle rolling through the streets of Lakeside Park up to Appleblossom Drive starting Fourth of July weekend and wrapping up in September. Link Transit's board approved \$38,500 to fund the shuttle in this month's meeting, in hopes of giving locals and tourists another option to move from

place to place. Link Transit's funds will help fund the shuttle for this calendar year only. In order to continue with the program, Chelan council member Ray Dobbs explained that Link Transit would like to see "a minimum ridership of 5 people per hour."

The shuttle concept would be a great addition to Lakeside Park and its parking issue. Last year, Chelan Parks and Recreation Department applied for an RCO Grant from the State that would fund improvements over at Lakeside. Unfortunately, the Parks Department was unable to get it. "We have been in contact with RCO and they have been kind enough to give us some feedback ... they feel that there was not enough parking and it is very difficult to have parking. If we can help make the shuttle successful we can put

that on our application," said City administrator Mike Jackson. He mentioned that they are already working on the RCO Grant application for 2020.

Dobbs wants the program to be successful and for the shuttle to exceed the minimum ridership. "It's a free shuttle, we have no money invested in the shuttle ourselves ... I would like for the council to approve \$2,000 or \$3,000 for this summer

for marketing and advertising to encourage people to ride the bus," said Dobbs to the council. He then went ahead and made a motion for council to approve \$2,500 for the program from the existing budget, which unanimously passed. The marketing portion of the project will include making signage for the shuttle stops, the locations of

which are not yet determined. City Council heard from Port of Douglas County Executive Director, Lisa Parks, on the possible functional consolidation with the Port of Chelan County. "We have ben trying to reaching out to the small communities in both counties ... we are wanting to explain what's going and hear concerns from our constituents before moving on," said Parks. Parks explained where the idea of consolidating the Ports came about and how it will work. "Both County Port Districts will remain, port county commissioners will be elected by their independent constituency. Once a year, they will meet and establish their individual tax levies and once a year they will approve a budget," Parks told the council. The consolidation will save the Ports \$500,000 by combining all operations into one. Changes that will help saving costs will include shortage in staff. Parks position will be eliminated by the end of years, as she willingly stepped down.

A decision making body will be formed and will include three members from Port of Chelan in addition to three from Port

of Douglas. Jim Kuntz will be Executive Director and a single staff will run the Ports. "We felt that it was a really good first step in terms of savings costs," said Parks.

The consolidation has not been voted in yet. Later this month both Ports will meet during their regular meeting and vote on the item. If approved, the functional consolidation between the two Ports will go into effect next January.

apparatus to do more with less and make it safer for our firefighters and our community," Asher stated. At the end of the year Chief

Lemon will retire and fire commissioners have been working on succession planning. Commissioner Russ Jones spoke about the plan and how it would look like. The idea will be to promote Chief Donnell to Fire Chief and to reduce from three chief officers to two. "Donnell will be a pretty good guy to take the chief's place, he has 29 years with the fire service," said Jones. The second chief then will be Asher, "he is currently working for us under a fouryear grant," Jones added.

Funding was another item talked about during the town hall. Commissioner Jones explained that currently CFR collects .88 cents per 1,000 of assessed value. Out of those .88 cents, .11 cents go towards administrative staff and .14 cents towards chief officers expenses. "Our career firefighters cost about .05 cents per firefighter," stated Jones. He clarified that in order to keep up with the growth in the community, the district needs more funding available. "What we feel is our best route currently would be a fire lid lift of .21 cents per 1,000. That would give us funding for two additional career firefighters, that would take us to nine career firefighters with the idea of one volunteer as stipend ... it gives us the ability to provide that two in two out service," said Jones. The levy would help expand the stipend program for volunteers, in addition to generating revenue to replace apparatus. With the .21 cent increase, \$1.09 per 1,000 would be the new amount to be paid by the homeowner. The levy will not be run until conversations with the community take place. "We want to make sure we are heading in the right direction and have the right plan," said Commissioner Jones.

Bernice Ward McCullev passed away Sunday, May 26, 2019, in her beloved home surrounded by family after decade's long fight against cancer. She was born January 3, 1935 to Hiram and Oma Bowers Ward in Yakima, Wash. The family soon moved to Oroville, Wash. where she spent her entire youth until her 10th grade year in high school, at which time they uprooted and moved to Magazine, Arkansas. Bernice graduated from Magazine High School in 1953 as Senior Class President.

Bernice married Norman Evans in 1956 and had two sons, Mark in 1957 and Mitch in 1960. In 1967 Bernice married Roy McCulley and had daughter Kelly.

It was then that the couple purchased a Sears and Roebuck catalog merchant store business out of the classified ads in



the newspaper and her very successful business woman career began. She owned and operated the Sears Store in downtown Chelan until 1985. Bernice employed many local women over those 18 years, many of whom grew to become lifelong friends. Mark and Mitch delivered Kenmore appliances in their teen years and Kelly spent her afterschool days sticking phone number stickers on the Spring, Fall and Christmas Wish catalogs. In 1985 Bernice decided to switch

gears, sold the Sears Store, got her Real Estate License and went to work for Lake Chelan Properties. In 1988 together with Morgan Picton, they purchased the firm and she then proceeded to have a very successful second career as co-owner of Lake Chelan Properties until 1999. She was very proud of the remodel she did on the downtown Chelan building that she had originally purchased for the Sears Store in the 1970's, turning it into a modern 1990's space for her thriving Real Estate business. Bernice cared deeply for the Lake Chelan community. stating "I'm willing to invest my time and input to the future of Chelan" and thus began her commitment as a Councilmember on the Lake Chelan City Council from 1995 to 2002. Bernice was a 1965 original charter member and still current member of the Lake Chelan Community Hospital Guild 'Y'.

She served both as President and Treasurer over the past 54 years. After retirement, Bernice served as a Lake Chelan Community Hospital Commissioner as well as a dedicated and faithful volunteer and advocate for the Lake Chelan Food Bank.

Bernice loved to purchase old homes, give them a freshening up and turn them into rental properties. She was proud of helping a few of her renters become first time homebuyers by selling them her property and carrying the contract. But her most favorite old house purchase and project was that of her own home of 30 years. The little grey Tudor on the corner of Nixon and Bradley which she lovingly remodeled brought her immense pride and joy, even earning her Yard of the Month in June 1991. But without doubt, her absolute greatest joy in life was her three children, grandchildren and family.
