Parade and VFW, American Legion events for Memorial Day

CHELAN/MANSON - Hosted by the Lake Chelan Chamber of Commerce the Memorial Day Parade will be held Thursday, May 23, 7-7:30 p.m. in downtown Chelan, and will honor soldiers, police officers and firefighters who lost their lives in the line of duty as well as those who have served and are currently serving our country.

On Friday, May 24, VFW 653 will have Buddy Poppy distribution at the Chelan Post Office, Chelan IGA Market, Manson Red Apple Market and Safeway. The poppy flower is the official memorial flower of the VFW. On Saturday, May 25 the veterans will be going to both cemeteries, Fraternal and Riverview to place flags on all the gravesites of veterans. They will be heading up to the cemeteries at 9 a.m.

In Chelan on Memorial Day, May 27 there will be a Memorial Service at Riverwalk Park by the flag pole at 10 a.m.; and in Manson on Monday, May 27, 11 a.m., join members of the Manson American Legion, Post 108 as they celebrate Memorial Day at the American Legion Park.

Candidate filing week concludes, three vying for mayor of Chelan

CHELAN/MANSON/ENTIAT - All positions up for election in Chelan, Manson and Entiat had at least one candidate file during election filing period last week.

City of Chelan has three candidates for Mayor, Mike Cooney, Stan Morse and Bob Goedde. Morse a former councilmember of Chelan and Goedde who was once Chelan Mayor want a chance to serve again.

The City Council positions that are held by Wendy Isenhardt and Kelly Allen have new candidates for election. During a council meeting in May, Isenhardt announced that she had no intention of filing again, leaving her spot open. Jon Higgins and John Olson have filed for council member position #1. Allen's name doesn't appear on the candidate list. Peter Jamtgaard has filed for position #4. Current councilmembers Ray Dobbs and Servando Robledo are both back seeking re-election.

Kimberly Thorpe and Andrew Baker are both looking to gain a spot as District #4 school board member for the Lake Chelan School District. Back for re-election are incumbents Agustin Benegas and Jeff Fehr.

Fire Commissioner for District 7, Jay Witherbee will not be running for re-election. William Bassett and Karyl Oules have filed to take over his spot as Commissioner #2.

Hospital District No. 2 has no new candidates as the only

ones who filed for Commissioner #3 and #4 are current members Fred Miller and Jordana LaPorte.

Funding, succession plan key items for town hall meeting

CHELAN - Four members of Chelan Fire and Rescue have been nominated for the EMS Awards by the Greater Wenatchee EMS Council, announced Deputy Fire Chief Mark Donnell during the May 15 meeting. The event will take place on May 29 at the Pybus Public Market in Wenatchee. The nominees are Fire Chief Tim Lemon, Firefighter/EMT Adam Jones, Firefighter/EMT Samantha Rains and Deputy Chief Donnell.

With the 2019 recruit academy wrapping up earlier this month, Assistant Chief Brandon Asher mentioned that he already has signed up four recruits for the upcoming academy in 2020. Two recruits from Chelan made it in time for training and will be available for wildfire responses this summer. "They will get their structure training in the next academy," stated Asher. The other two recruits are from Orondo and Entiat.

Asher also reported that all crews have done training on Ladder Truck 71 that recently arrived from Alabama. "We are just getting a few last minute items that we'll start working on next week and it will be ready to go," said Asher. Radios will be installed on May 22 and equipment will be mounted. In terms of the rescue boat, Commissioner Russ Jones men-

tioned that it was scheduled to be tested on the water on the morning of May 18. "I will order paint ... get some folks together next week to paint it," Jones stated.

Commissioners reviewed the final Long Range Plan presentation that will be given to the public during the town hall meeting on May 30. Lemon briefly walked the commissioners through the presentation and heard their feedback. "I envision about 15 minutes of presentation so we don't lose our audience and then open things up for discussion. My preference is to cut out a lot of the statistical stuff," said Jones

To Jones, it is highly important for the audience to be updated on the future funding options for the fire district.

"At the beginning of this we should be talking about the succession plan," said Commissioner Jay Witherbee. He stated that the two key points of the presentation should be funding options and succession plans. For Commissioner Phil Moller, the current presentation feels like it's giving information that is given at regular board meetings with "lots of numbers." "I want to see more tangible information here, rather than all these numbers," clarified Moller.

Commissioners will meet one-on-one with Chief Lemon to finalize the presentation in the next upcoming week.

"If you are interested in what the future of the fire department looks like you have to be there," said Witherbee. The town hall meeting will begin at 6 p.m. on May 30 at the Chelan Senior Center, 534 E. Trow Avenue.

Chelan Council goes forward with pumptrack project

CHELAN - American Ramp Company will be in charge of developing a concept design for a pumptrack at the Chelan skate park in Don Morse Park as approved by the Chelan Council on May 14.

In a special meeting on April 23, City Administrator Mike Jackson reported to councilmembers the terms of the agreement with American Ramp. "It essentially includes engagement with the community, take a look at our existing site and come up with a design and a cost estimate for the city," restated Jackson about the agreement. For this project the city has budgeted \$8,000 and the services from American Ramp will come in at under \$7,500.

In the initial talks about the pumptrack, councilmembers were intrigued about the pumptrack in Leavenworth and wanted to hear more about it. "The consultant thought it cost about \$300,000 ... the City of Leavenworth donated land," reported Jackson. Based on the numbers from Leavenworth, Jackson thinks the development of the

pumptrack would be around \$100,000 or more depending on the design. "Ours might be a lot simpler if we circumnavigate the existing skate park and use that site," said Jackson.

Councilmembers showed excitement for the project. "I am just really happy for skateboarders. It's outdoor recreation, active, physical.

It's a wonderful thing," said Councilwoman Wendy Isenhardt.

The kids are also very excited to have an improved skatepark in town. "The kids down there are already drawing their dream skate board ramp area," said Councilwoman Erin McCordle. Chelan Mayor Mike Cooney mentioned that if the project

moves forward he would like to see the community be involved in fundraising efforts.

Councilmembers also approved the services from Prothman consulting firm to develop a maintenance management plan for Parks and Recreation. "This is something that in the history of the city

American Legion celebrates 100 years End of World War One spawns oldest veterans service organization

The American Legion was chartered by Congress in 1919 as a patriotic veterans organization. Focusing on service to veterans, servicemembers and communities, the Legion evolved from a group of war-weary veterans of World War I into one of the most influential nonprofit groups in the United States. Membership swiftly grew to over 1 million, and local posts sprang up across the country. Today, membership stands at over



2 million in more than 13,000 posts worldwide. The posts are organized into 55 departments: one each for the 50 states, along with the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, France, Mexico and the Philippines.

Over the years, the Legion has influenced considerable social change in America, won hundreds of benefits for veterans and produced many important programs for children and youth.

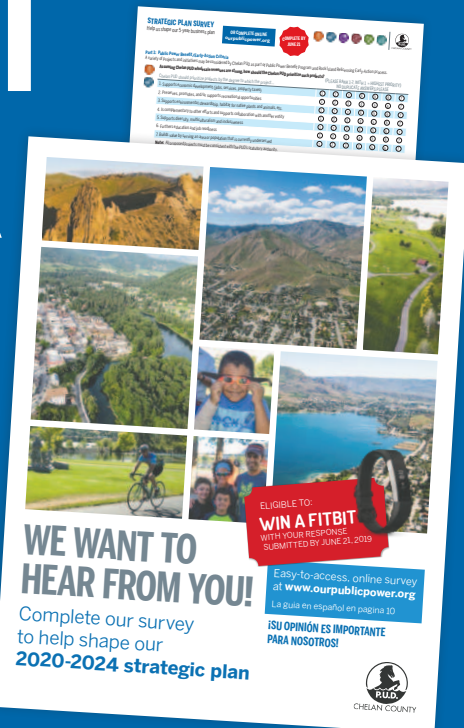


The second picture (right) was of my Grandfather C. E. Tolerton who was in the "Home Guard" in that same time frame. He never went overseas though.

has been talked about but never accomplished," said Jackson. He mentioned he wants the plan to be in place before bringing on a new parks director. "We also want to take a hard look at the proposed maintenance building ... there's a lot of room down at public works to store items and you have a lot of flat space. It is easier to put up a building and it is ready to go," Jackson added. The management plan doesn't include detailed input on the Municipal Golf Course, just a general overview of it.

Parking always seems to be an issue, especially in downtown. Councilmember Tim Hollingsworth brought up his concerns about a letter that was addressed to all councilmembers on parking in the

downtown corridor. "The letter made a very convincing argument for changing the time limit. It was two hours for a long time, it seemed to work out for me," said Hollingsworth. He brought this up because he wants the council to look into this in order for downtown to remain "vibrant."

Councilmember McCardle commented on the parking issue. "We never seem to have a goal or a solution. It's never clear to me what is the problem we are trying to solve. Before moving forward with this complaint, we need to identify what's our goal," she said. She suggested to do more data collection to help them understand "true patterns in downtown and then make an educated decision."

Chelan City Council will meet on May 28 for a regular meeting starting at 6:00 p.m.

Chelan's Barber Shop to close May 25, owner to retire

CHELAN - Shannon Maitland will retire after working at her barber shop in Chelan for nearly 14 years.

It was 1972 when Maitland got her license as a barber and soon after she began working in Chelan. The Pateros native then headed up north to Brewster, working there for six years. Maitland didn't stop there, she kept on commuting to work up farther up the Methow River to Twisp for 10 years, before finding a job in her hometown. In Pateros, Maitland worked for a little over 10 years.

"There's not enough head-count there, so I came back down to Chelan," she said.

Her second time back in Chelan, she worked for Del Hanson for two years before opening up her own shop on Sanders St. in 2009. "I grew up driving in the winter. Once you have a good car you are good to go," she said about her commute to work.

The best part of her job has been meeting new people every day. "You never know what the day is going to be like, because everything is all walk-ins ... you don't know if you are going to have six haircuts or 12 haircuts. It's just up in the air, I like that," Maitland described as a typical day on the job.

Typically her customers go in to get a haircut every six weeks. However, she mentioned

there are others who wait six months. "It gets busier every year and I am getting to the age where I can't stand up all day," she mentioned.

After serving in Chelan for 14 years, Maitland will retire on May 25 when Chelan's Barber Shop closes its doors. She will be packing her belongings and moving to Ellensburg. "My daughter and her family live there. I will be watching the grandsons' baseball game and their basketball games,"

she said.

Maitland's retirement is leaving her customers with mixed feelings. "They are happy for me and my next chapter in my life, but they are sad they are losing a barber that has cut their hair for 14 years," she explained.

The lifelong barber also feels "melancholy" about her departure. "I have been thinking about for a few years ... I am looking forward to it now," Maitland added.

Second location opens in Chelan

CHELAN - Six years ago in East Wenatchee the Olguin Sarabia family began their journey in the food industry when they opened the very first Fonda Oaxaqueña.

The family-run business focuses on serving authentic food from southern Mexico. Fonda Oaxaqueña features traditional dishes from Oaxaca, which incorporate a variety of flavors. Their mole and hand-made tortillas along with carne asada are a few of the house specials. The business rapidly seemed to attract people's attention and started to flourish. "In the back of our minds our idea was to expand the business if it worked out," said owner Paul Lopez Olguin.

The opportunity to come to Chelan opened up. While doing some research the family found that the town was growing and more food options were needed for locals and tourists. "We wanted to be that one more option for the town. In December of 2018, we started working and preparing the restaurant," explained Lopez as to how everything got started with a second location.

Fonda Oaxaqueña held a ribbon cutting ceremony on May 3 which officially inaugurated the restaurant. So far, the past week, a lot of people have stopped by the new restaurant to dine in and have had nothing but positive feedback for the family. "The family is very happy, everyone has been welcoming us to town. The atmosphere is friendly and they all wish us well," said Lopez.

Local business owners have also taken the time to stop by and welcome their new colleagues. "They have given us advice and have said to us to prepare for the summertime because it gets crazy," Lopez

mentioned. At the moment, there are 11 employees working at the Fonda. Lopez mentioned that they are looking for a few more people to join the team for the summer time.

Fonda Oaxaqueña, located on 127 E. Johnson Ave., is open Monday - Saturday 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Sundays 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. "On Sundays we serve Mexican breakfast items such as Huevos Rancheros, Huevos

The Goats would like to thank all the members of the Chelan Community for their continued monetary,

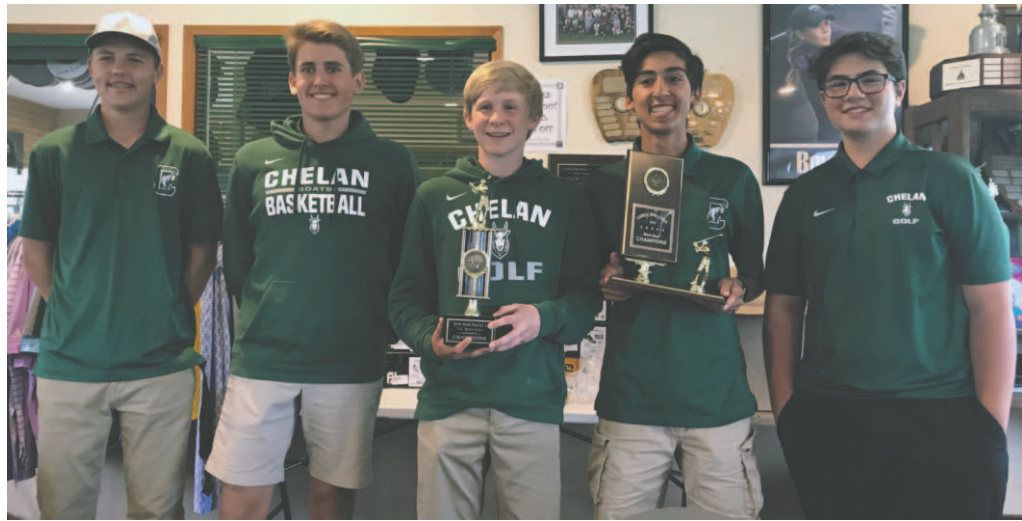

Chelan boys golf take District, CTL Team Championship

Chelan High School hosted the District 6 and CTL Golf Championships May 7 at Lake Chelan Golf Course under cloudy and drizzly conditions. The late afternoon brought relief from the drizzle but also cooled the temperature considerably.

On the boys side of things, a hot duel between the top two

players led to Okanogan's Billy Norwill (Sr.) taking individual medalist honors and named CTL Player of the Year, coming in with an 8-over par 80 (41/39) to take a one stroke victory over Chelan's Miles Grossberg (Soph.) who shot an 81 (40/41). Coming in 3rd was Chelan's Joey Gasper (Fr.) with a 90 (45/45). All three of these boys qualified for state, as did the following (with their scores): Brady

Tonasket (Fr.) Omak 97, Destyn Markel (Jr.) Omak 99, Isaac Cortes (Soph) Cascade 100, Parker Brown (so) Chelan 101. In a playoff for the alternate position to state were two boys from Okanogan, Jacob Stanley (jr) and Weston Wood (Soph); Weston won the alternate position on the second playoff hole. Chelan will take 3 boys to state, Omak 2, and Okanogan and Cascade 1 each.

Taking the District 6 and CTL Team Championship for the boys was Chelan, coming in with a 375, beating the team from Okanogan by 17 strokes. The other two CTL teams did not have enough boys to have a team score.

For the girls, Riverside Christian (RCS) took the District 6 Championship with a team score of 465, while Cascade took the CTL championship with 508. Chelan came in 3rd overall

with a 539. RCS will take the District 6 Player of the Year, Jessica Yve (Sr.) 98, to state, along with the alternate, 5th place Greysen Swanson (Jr.) 120. Cascade will take 2 girls to state, 2nd place Emma Halseth (Jr.) 99, and 4th place Emma Nielson (Jr.) 116, and Chelan will take one to state, 3rd place Kaylin Boykin (Jr.) 108.

The State Championships will be held at Olympia Country & Golf Club

(Olympia) for the boys, and at Tumwater Valley Golf Course (Tumwater) this week Tuesday (May 21) and Wednesday (May 22), with a practice round on Monday (May 20).

District 6 Tennis Tournament - Day 1, May 15

MANSON - All of the 1A and B tennis teams in north central Washington met at Harmony Meadows today (May 15) for Day 1 of the District VI Tennis Tournament, which is the qualifier for next week's state tournament. We got off to an early start on May 15 (noon rather than 3 p.m.) due to the threat of late afternoon rain.

In this tournament, the top three girls and top four boys will move on to the state tournament. Each entrant played once May 15, and will

play two or three times on Saturday (May 18) at the North Cascades Athletic Club in Omak beginning at 10 a.m.

Chelan had about as good a day as you can hope for, winning all four matches and sending all four entries to the Saturday semifinals.

Emma McLaren entered as the #1 girls singles seed from the CTL, pitting her against the #4 seed from the NCW B-league Savannah Hobrecht of Lake Roosevelt. Emma came away with a 6-2, 6-3 victory, and will face Molly Wisner of Cascade in the semifinals on Saturday, which is a rematch of the CTL tourney semifinal from last weekend.

Wyatt Habich was also CTL champion in boys singles, so he opened up against #4 seed Connor Hardesty of Tonasket. Connor was a tough opponent, and it took

all that Wyatt had in the tank to sneak by Hardesty 7-5, 6-4. Habich will face Kane Andruss of Cashmere on Saturday in the semifinal.

Tobin Wier is the #2 seed in boys singles coming out of the CTL, and faced Nicholas Fitzmaurice of Liberty Bell today. Tobin had a dominant opening set, but had to work hard to get by Fitzmaurice in the second set 6-2, 7-6(2). That puts Tobin in the other boys semifinal on Saturday morning vs state tourney veteran Caeleb Hardesty of Tonasket.

The Chelan doubles team of Abby Martin and Bella Gatzemeier are the #3 seed from the CTL, and battled Tarissa and Raven Clark of Lake Roosevelt, which was a rematch from the final week of the regular season. Abby and Bella coasted to victory 6-0, 6-2, and will face the Kert sisters of Cashmere in a rematch of their CTL semifinal last week.

So, for all of our entries, Saturday's (May 18) path to a state berth looks like this: either win the semifinal and their ticket is punched, or lose the semifinal and have to fight back through the consolation bracket.

District 6 Tennis Tournament - Day 2, May 18 On to State

Chelan began the day with five athletes competing in the district tournament, and we finished the day with all 5 players qualifying for the state tournament. The Chelan tennis team will be sending the most entries of any other District VI squad (four state berths)!

In today's (May 18) tournament, the top three finishers in the girls' brackets and top four boys finishers move on to the state tournament. All of our Chelan entries began the day in "best case scenario mode" (they had worked their way to the semifinal match via their play on day 1 of the tournament on May 15), so Saturday's path to a state berth looked like this for each of them: either win the semifinal and their ticket is punched, or lose the semifinal and have to fight back through the consolation bracket.

Emma McLaren entered as the #1 girls singles seed from the CTL, and faced Molly

Wiser of Cascade in the semifinals, winning 6-0, 6-4. In the district championship match, Emma defeated Dorothy Espinosa of Cascade 6-2, 6-0. Congrats to Emma McLaren - the 2019 District VI Girls Singles Champion! She'll enter the state tourney as a #1 seed.

Wyatt Habich was also CTL champion in boys singles, and faced Kane Andruss of Cashmere in the semifinal. Wyatt had a tough match vs Kane, and fell 4-6, 3-6. That forced Wyatt into a loser-out/winner-to-state match versus Nicholas Fitzmaurice of Liberty Bell, which Wyatt handled well, winning 6-3, 6-1. Wyatt will enter the state tournament as a #3 seed.

Tobin Wier was the #2 seed in boys singles coming out of the CTL, and had his semifinal match state versus state tourney veteran Caeleb Hardesty of Tonasket. Tobin played well against the eventual champion, but lost 0-6, 1-6. Like teammate Wyatt, Tobin faced an immediate loser-out/winner-to-state match vs Elijah Burnell of Oroville. Tobin excuted a perfect game plan, and impressed while defeating a tough opponent 6-2, 6-2. Tobin will enter the

state tournament as a #4 seed.

The Chelan doubles team of Abby Martin and Bella Gatzemeier were the #3 seed from the CTL, and faced Aleah and Lauren Kert of Cashmere in a rematch of their CTL semifinal last week. Abby and Bella fell to the eventual champions from Cashmere, but you guessed it, had to win their next TWO matches to earn a trip to state. In their first consolation match, the Chelan duo defeated Hardesty/Capote of Tonasket in gutsy comeback fashion 4-6, 6-0, 6-1. 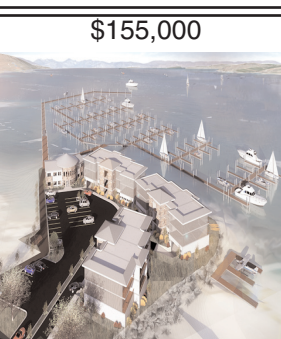
