New hospital space approved

CHELAN - A new decision was announced by the Lake Chelan Community Hospital and Clinics Board of Commissioners, in regards to the new hospital at their meeting on April 23.

In the last several months planning the space of the new facility has gotten the most attention. The clinic and the emergency services seemed to be the center of the campus. However, after going through different variations with the facilities committee, it was concluded that it was financially impossible to make it work.

On April 8, when the committee met, a recommendation was made to present to the board. It was the committee's recommendation to build a 54,000 square foot hospital with the goal to provide the space and services



needed for the next five-plus years and with growth areas designed for expansion. **Steve Patonai, Lake Chelan Community Hospital and Clinics CEO**

Based on regional averages for construction costs in the health care industry, \$44.3 million will be spent on the project. The space proposal includes 21 beds which consist of nine medical-surgical

You are invited to a District Forum for the hospital on Wednesday, May 8 from 5:30 - 7:30 p.m. at the Lake Chelan Senior Center at 534 E. Trow in Chelan. Board members will give short presentations at the event, followed by Q&A periods. Topics will include community, quality, finance, affiliations and facilities. The forum will begin with an opportunity for attendees to post questions and comments on display boards. Refreshments will be served.

beds, 10 sanctuary beds and two floating beds that could be used in either department. In the emergency department, there will be seven beds. Three operation room suites, which double the size of the current ORs, will be in the surgical department plus a procedure room.

"This plan doesn't currently include the clinic," explained Steve Patonai, LCCHC CEO. "We will look at it in parallel as we move forward with the project," he added. An EMS station is not in the picture. "If we want EMS, we would probably use a local construction company

to build what they need for a station," clarified Patonai to the board and attendees. Business offices are also not included.

Commissioner Mary Murphy questioned Patonai on where the committee was planning on stationing the EMS crew. "Right now there is a lot of cross over functionality with EMS and the ER," said Murphy. EMS doesn't need much, said Patonai. It would be less expensive to build onsite with a local contractor since it is not considered hospital square

Manson Community Council accepts resignation of Sara Cushing

VIRIDIAN housing project addressed

MANSON - At a special Manson Community Council meeting on April 24 council members announced that Sara Cushing resigned her position as secretary of the Manson Community Council effective April 16. In her resignation letter to the council, Cushing mentioned she felt bullied and harassed by two other council members.

Cushing attached to her letter a series of emails between former councilmen Chris Willoughby and her addressing Willoughby's personal reasons as to why she wasn't working out in the council. "It wasn't my choice to do this. She was doing some things that were not quite within our code of

ethics and I addressed them to her in email form," explained Willoughby in regard to the accusations.

"I don't feel that the council has done its best job for the past year and a half," Cushing expressed in her letter. "I wish much success to the Manson Community Council in all their endeavors to better the community," she lastly wrote.

The next step for the council is to appoint somebody to take over the spot left behind by Cushing. Anyone who is interested can contact the Manson Community Council at mansoncommunitycouncil@gmail.com and will be required to fill out a form.

The council reviewed the proposed housing development application for VIRIDIAN in Manson. Farrell Prop-

Voters reject \$75.5 million proposed bond

CHELAN - Voters rejected the Lake Chelan School District \$75.5 million bond proposal by voting "no" on April 23 Special Election ballot.

On Tuesday night, April 23 the combined total 2,210 votes from Chelan, Douglas and Okanogan Counties were counted, 947 (42%) for the approval of the proposal and 1,263 (57%) votes against it. The proposed bond would have paid the construction of new high school and renovations of aging school facilities: including Sargent Field.

In a Facebook post made public by the Lake Chelan School District, Superintendent Barry DePaoli said;

"Although I am disappointed that the Bond was not successful, I want everyone to know that the Board of Directors and I remain undeterred in our vision and our efforts to better meet the needs of our students, staff and families. While we are appreciative that community has always been supportive of our schools, the voter turnout was impressive and the message is clear. Therefore, the Board and I are committed to further study and finding creative solutions which the voters can endorse in the future."

A 60 percent "yes" vote was needed in order for the measure to successfully pass. The next ballot count and certification date will be May 3.

Evaluation planned for Johnson Avenue, Sanders Street intersection

CHELAN - Jake Youngren, Chelan Public Works director presented a motion to City Council dealing with the design of traffic improvements at Johnson Avenue and Sanders Street intersection on April 23.

Youngren explained that before determining a final solution to control traffic at the intersection, consultant SCJ Alliance will conduct an intersection control evaluation. The evaluation will allow the consultant to find the best option to mitigate the intersection, which will then be presented to WSDOT. Public

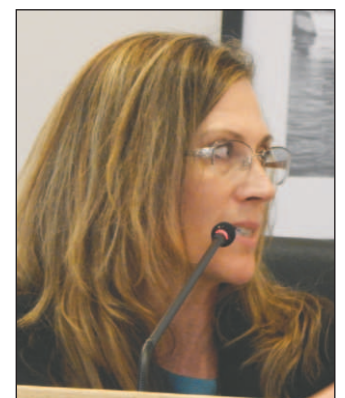
engagement will also take place. "It's important to reach out and get feedback," said Youngren. Council member Tim Hollingworth mentioned that he was happy on the fact that options are being looked at before making a final decision.

The City has money set aside for this project as it was included in this year's City Budget. The city of Chelan also received money from the legislature in 2018 for this project. Youngren mentioned that the plan is to reach out to the Chelan Douglas Transportation Council in order to request a grant near the future.

"Depending on how the intersection control evaluation analysis ends up it can affect substantially the estimated project total costs," said Youngren.

At the moment \$650,000 is set aside for the project. With that, the council voted and approved the motion.

City Administrator Mike Jackson conducted an administrative report on a pump

track design agreement. A pump track is "series of hills and turns that allow one to ride and keep up the momentum without paddling."

"The City budgeted \$8,000 for a conceptual design for a pump track.

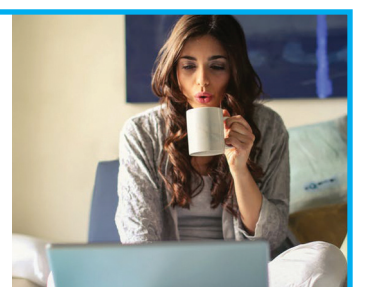

erty Investments LLC is looking to "subdivide approximately 12 acres into 40 residential lots with three tracts; a community pool will be located in tract A and tract B and C will be used for stormwater retention," as

stated in their application. The residential units will average size of 9,355 square feet and will be located off Wapato Way.

VIRIDIAN is identified to be on old orchard land. Community members who attended the meeting and the council were concerned about the issue and how it was going to be addressed

"We lost eight months waiting on USDA, and in that time, we encountered higher costs in around some of the phases we were looking at," mentioned commissioner Mary Signorelli. In order to stick to the budget of \$44.5 million, the committee had to reduce the square foot-

age of the hospital. "We are really working to make the most efficient facility that we can have within the confines of our budget. We will have a top quality medical facility for our community," Signorelli added before making motion to approve the space plan. After

a few last questions to Patoai from the board, they voted unanimously to approve the space plan.

A special meeting will take place in a week or two in order to review the space plan financials and to meet with the project architects.

This is something similar to what The Village currently has in place in order to enter their development.

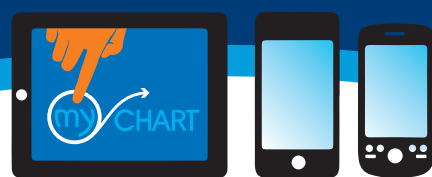

Habitat's 18th, 19th home to be completed by summer's end

CHELAN - Sweat equity hours have been completed by the first two families who will occupy the townhome duplex on E. Wapato Avenue property.

In 2016, the property was purchased by the Chelan Valley Habitat for Humanity with the goal of having eight families have an affordable home on that parcel. "After a couple years of permitting and planning now we are on our way with the first duplex," said board president Hershaj Joyner. Each two-story home is over 1,300 squared feet and will have three bedrooms, two bathrooms in addition to a small, intimate back yard.

At the moment, electrical and plumbing work is getting done at the residence. Heating systems and siding are getting put on. "The roof is on, we still have insula-



tion and sheetrock, painting and a little work around the outside before we turn it over to the new owners," Joyner explained.

Habitat's consultant, engineer and builder, Mike Down mentioned the project is coming along just fine and that it is looking good. "We have a few months to go," said Down as he explained that the two families will be moving in by July or August.

Concrete was poured last January and framing was done in March. From there everything moved on pretty smoothly.

The construction of the two homes will give the Chelan Valley the 18th and 19th family home completed by the Habitat program.

American Ramp Company for \$7,500," said Jackson. Jackson explained that from their proposed contact, American Ramp would come to the community and look at the existing skatepark facility. "Essentially, they would come up with a design using the community, Council, Parks board, everyone that would like to be involved and come up with a proposed budget for that project," added Jackson. The projects American Ramp has designed range from anywhere between \$300,000 to \$600,000 for the construction.

Thank You Lake Chelan Community

I would like to thank the entire community of Chelan for the resounding defeat of the Lake Chelan School District bond issue before the voters on April 23, 2019.

This massive and far reaching bond issue was simply not needed. The community fully understood this by researching the facts regarding the lack of enrollment growth in the

past 21 years to justify a new building and campus (\$59M). As many concluded, there would be additional revenue required to maintain, operate, and staff another school site if this bond issue would have been successful. This needed revenue would come from new and additional taxes to the local community.

Furthermore, the decisions to ask the community for nearly \$2.5M to improve the parking lot at the football field, and another nearly \$2.25M for a synthetic turf

field were uncalled for and unjustified. Again, the community understood this, and sent a clear message to the superintendent and school board.

Finally, the decision to spend \$1M+ to remodel space for a new district office for the administration was a misuse of capital tax funds that the voters approved in the 2013 special election. These funds, collected through our local tax revenues, should have been used in the school buildings and facilities for the benefit of

all our students. This is what the community approved the additional funds for; not new administrative offices.

Again, thank you to the entire community. Continue to stay involved; seek and demand reasonable solutions to the challenges that all schools have in the education of our students. Let us look at the needs, not the wants and excessive spending solutions, to truly solve the challenges ahead in our community and school system.

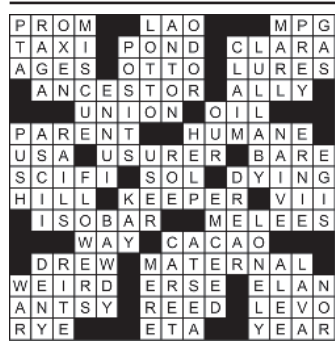

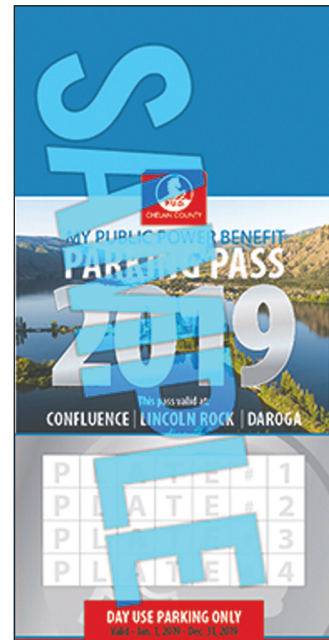

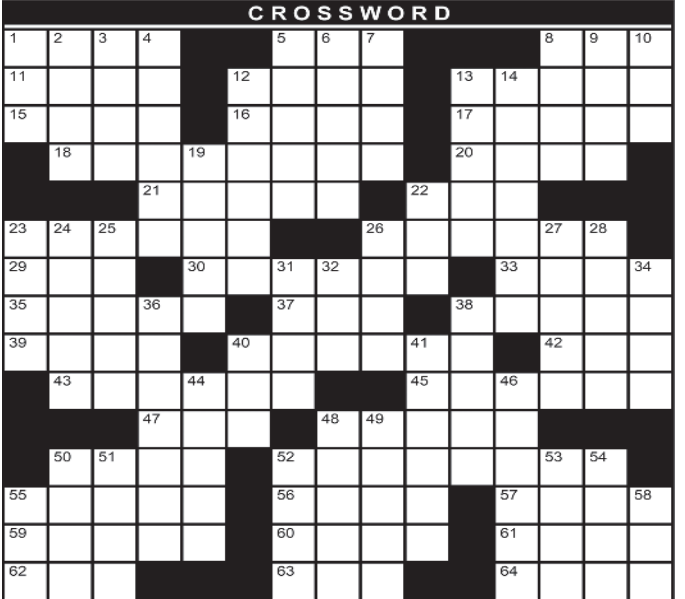
