

Chelan Fire Chief Tim Lemon to retire at the end of the year

CHELAN – Chelan Fire Chief Tim Lemon will retire at the end of 2019. On behalf of the Chelan Fire and Rescue Board of Commissioners Russ Jones made the announcement during a special meeting held on Thursday morning, March 7, at the Fire Hall. Chief Lemon has spent the last 10 years, of a 40 year career serving as the Fire Chief of Chelan Fire and Rescue.

Jones also informed that the Deputy Chief position will be discontinued for next year. “We are having to take some actions to maintain a viable budget. At a later point this year, we will begin the process of going through and selecting a new Chief,” he said. Current Deputy Chief Mark Donnell will have the opportunity to apply and test for the position clarified Jones.

Commissioner Jones and commissioner Phil Moller both voted in favor of continuing with the hiring process for an administrative assistant, while commissioner Jay Witherbee voted against it.

“My position is that I am not in favor of moving forward now. I don’t believe that we should eliminate that position that’s not how I feel ... we haven’t completed our long-range planning and apparently today we decided that our staffing models no longer includes having a Deputy Chief, we need to figure out what our priorities are,” explained Witherbee as to why he voted against it.

All the decisions the commissioners are talking about are budgetary and Witherbee insisted to delay the position because he takes the responsibility of hiring and releasing

people very seriously. “I just want to look at a blank piece of paper, knowing what our revenues are and determine where the position lays in the list of priorities,” he added.

Commissioner Moller, for the most part, agreed with Witherbee on the fact it would beneficial to put the hiring process on hold. However, Moller stated that he is willing to move forward as he understands that the commissioners might make a decision down the road that will “affect somebody’s life.”

A lot of discussion needs to take place in order to figure out where the district needs to be in terms of staffing, apparatus replacement, and capital improvements. “This is not a time to launch a levy campaign ... but we need to strategize for two or three years down the road,” commented Jones.

Chief Lemon ran projections up to 2023, with the current budget and staffing numbers. “Those projections are not adding anything to the bond paydown, nor include

Manson community shows support for Leffler Field purchase during public forum

MANSON – More than 40 Manson residents gathered at the Manson Grange Wednesday evening, March 6 to show their full support towards the purchase of Leffler Field.

Before receiving the public’s input, the Manson Park and Recreation District presented their comprehensive plan and went over the five current projects that they are trying to tackle in the near future.

The comprehensive plan is a huge part of being able to get any grants and funding. Manson Park comp plan “defines what the park district is, it defines the area, the responsibilities, how it’s operated, its mission, its goals and basically it is the driving road map for the district,” said funding specialist Kara Raftery of Pacific Engineering, who recently worked on updating the plan.

Manson Park maintains seven parks and one of the major things they are working on at the moment is the Singleton Park playground. Director Robin Pittman mentioned that Singleton Park is a big priority of theirs. “Right now quotes are running about \$100,000. These toys are not cheap, but the toys that are there are getting to the point of not being safe anymore,” she said. A safety report of the playground was done by the Park’s insurance and it is

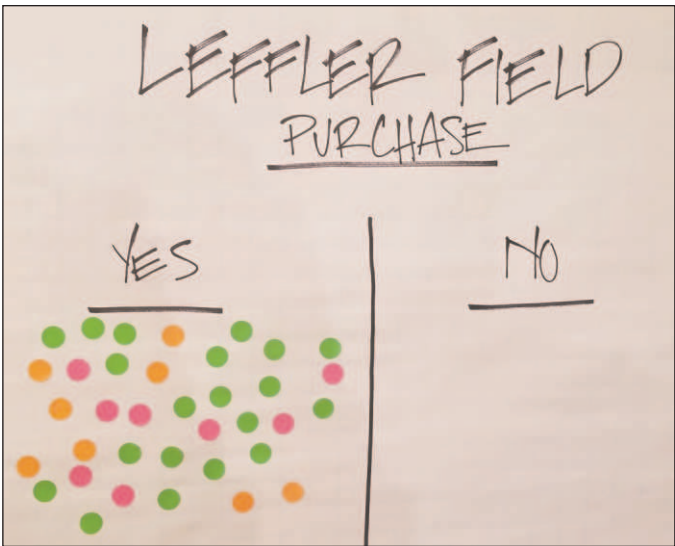

three points away from shutting down.

Another project they are working on is the erosion happening at Willow Point Park. “Along the shoreline there’s land disappearing and that is one of the parks we own,” Pittman said. The Manson Bay Revitalization is another big project. “Right now that’s a standstill. We talked to the PUD and they are doing some asset management right now, so they have asked us to put it on hold for now.”

Starting on April 1, the Chelan County PUD will be working on putting in a step down at the Manson Bay swim area to address kids’ safety. “Based on feedback from the community there’s going to

be some hand railings put in,” Pittman added.

From there Pittman proceeded to talk about Leffler Field. “Most of you guys know that the Manson Chamber has been working their tails off as something they want to acquire.” Manson Park had to get involved because a lot of the funding needs to go to a public entity she explained.

“We quickly started looking for money and support, we have letters of support from the Manson School District, Port of Chelan County, Manson Chamber of Commerce and half a million dollars from the Chelan County,” said Manson Chamber Director

Wildfire town hall presents the community with an array of prevention, protection resources

CHELAN – In an effort to prevent and protect the City of Chelan from wildfire, a town hall meeting was held on March 7 at the Chelan Senior Center.

“We think of fire season a constant threat to our town, tonight’s meeting is about looking forward at what we can do in our neighborhoods that would make a difference when the lighting strikes and its 90 degrees out,” said Chelan Mayor Mike Cooney as he began the town hall meeting.

Chelan Fire and Rescue works hard every year to improve its abilities with DNR and the U.S. Forest Service said Chief Tim Lemon. The partner agencies have a philosophy. “That the closest available agency engages, let’s get there and it done, keep it small, manageable and get it out,” he mentioned.

Chief Lemon clarified that at the moment CFR’s goal is to continue to build on what they have learned over the years. CFR wants to make sure people’s homes have a “defensible space” by providing vegetation around them that is fire resistant “that way if there’s an event that comes down to your neighborhood, that will buy us time until we get there and take care of it.”

Lemon encouraged everyone to contact CFR and him personally in order to schedule an appointment to get their homes evaluated. “The fire guys will come out and will do walk through your property identify those risk factors that you may want to consider, it goes hand-in-hand with the fire wise program we support,” said Lemon.

District Ranger Kari Grover-Weir of the Okanogan-

Wenatchee Forest Service was excited to see many residents show up to the meeting wanting to do their part. Grover-Weir elaborated on the work DNR, the Forest Service and local fire departments do. “We train together, we do practices, we make sure we have the right radio frequencies, that we know each other’s faces for when we show up on a fire that everyone knows each other.”

Outside of the city limits, the Forest Service is working thinning trees and prescribed burning. “In the last couple of years we have been working on the Bear Mountain area, Forest Mountain, 25 Mile and we are starting to work up in First Creek, also in the Falls and Coyote area,” she said. In the 25 Mile area and First Creek area, private property owners are

Local donor to match up \$10,000 for the Chelan Valley Community Nurse program

CHELAN – A local anonymous donor has offered to match up to \$10,000 in donations pledged from the beginning of the year up to March 31 as the Chelan Valley Community Nurse program continues with fundraising efforts.

Earlier last week, CVCN nurses Suzie Zimmer and Michelle Jerome received the news, “that’s really exciting to us because that could mean \$20,000 for us,” said Jerome. So far, they have received \$4,500 towards their goal of \$32,000 to maintain a part-time nurse, plus other expenses.

Jerome has been focusing a lot of her time on fundraising since now Zimmer is doing visits on her own. “It’s been kind of nice for me to freed up for me to write grants,” she said. Jerome is working on different ideas to help the program self-sustain.

“We really trying to get some funding to expand so we can do an outreach project for the Hispanic community,” said Jerome. An additional \$20,000 would be needed on top of the \$32,000 to proceed with the new project she explained.

“The Hispanic community is 40 percent of this valley and our numbers in the caseload do not reflect 40 percent at all, we really want to start getting out, but that’s going to involve another person who contracts with us and helps out,” Jerome added.

Lake Chelan Rotatory, Lions Club, Kiwanis, Lake Chelan Community Services Council and the Lake Chelan Health and Wellness Foundation all have been contributors to the program. “They are very supportive of us and they are very open to our requests,” said Jerome. They have all made donations and some even more than once. Jerome will be moving away from Chelan in April and “having a pocket to leave behind it’s a nice way to turn it over.”

At the moment Chelan Valley Community Nurse Suzie Zimmer is working towards getting her Faith Community Nursing Certification. The eight week course is based in the recognition that health has to do with body, mind and the spirit. “It’s an expansion of the way you look at nursing,” explained Michelle Jerome. The Lake Chelan Community Services Council paid the cost of the course for Zimmer, who at the end of the eight weeks will be certified.

CVCN logo contest

The Chelan Valley Community Nurse program is currently in the process of selecting a logo for the program. A CVCN board member came up with an idea to have the Chelan High School art department and the School of Innovation participate in a logo contest. One lucky winner will receive \$100 and her/his logo will be used by CVCN. “We are excited about the idea because it makes the kids aware of what we are doing and it gets them involved,” said Chelan Valley Community Nurse Michelle Jerome.

funds for capital improvement plans, which is not realistic,” said Lemon.

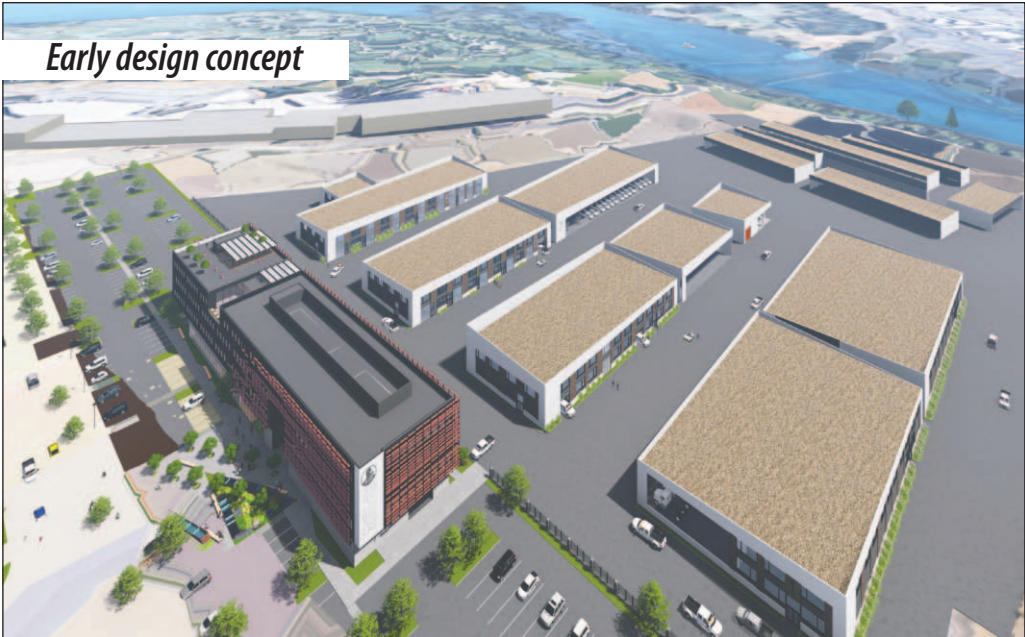
The Long Range Plan will help commissioners determine when and how much they will have to make an ask for. “You can’t survive

without asking for additional funds from the community, it’s going be a tough one, but we need to start working on it now whether it is in 21, 22, 23,” said Jones.

By working it now Jones hopes that by the time it comes down to pushing for a levy the community will be educated on why they are

asking for additional funding. The Long Range Plan meeting is scheduled for March 28 at 11:00 a.m.

The regular monthly meeting for Chelan County Fire District #7 is now held the third Wednesday of the month, at 3 p.m. at the fire station, 232 E. Wapato Avenue. The next meeting is March 20.

Jeff Conwell.

Conwell stated that they are waiting to hear back from the State Ways and Means Committee on the half a million dollar ask which might not be approved until April. “It is almost five acres of fun just waiting to happen and for our community to put its footprints all over it,” he said.

In the updated Manson Park Comp Plan, one of the goals is acquisition and land development. “The park district really wants to preserve land for recreation ... since the acquisition was identified as a goal Leffler Field is such a great opportunity,” said Raftery.

During the Q&A portion of the forum, Pittman clarified

that each of the projects Manson Park is working towards could get funded through different grants. “There are different pots of money for those,” she said. In order to fund the acquisition, Conwell explained that there would be fundraising efforts within the community taking place to cover the remaining costs.

After the presentation concluded, the attendees unanimously voted “yes” to the Leffler Field purchase. At the same time, they voted on their project priorities, Leffler Field acquisition and Singleton playground took majority of the votes.

Talks regarding the acquisition will carry on to the next regular meeting for Manson Park board on March 20 at 4:10 p.m.

encouraged to get their land treated if their land is adjacent to U.S. Forest land. Grover-Weir mentioned that the Forest Service will do this for free, all they have to do is contact them.

City of Chelan Planning Director Craig Gildroy presented on what the city is doing in regards to wildfire planning through the years. After the 2015 wildfires, the community requested the city to implement wildfire regulations and from there the city jumped on the Community Planning Assistance for Wildfire (CPAW). CPAW then had some recommendations for the City of Chelan, which the planning and building department has checked off over the last two years as they have worked on codes that apply for the most part to new developments.

Project Coordinator at Cascadia Conservation District Patrick Haggerty went over a few resources that Cascadia puts together. One of them being the free brush disposal days at the Chelan Transfer Station. This year Cascadia will be accepting trees and brush up to 12 inches in diameter and 8-feet-long, as well as pine needles and shrubs on May 3, 4, 10 and

11. He also talked about the free-roving chipper program available in the county and the city. “You thin some trees, prune trees and cut bush around your property and then we hire a contractor crew to come out and chip that material,” he said. For the chipper program, one must sign up on the Cascadia Conservation District website. Other programs such as the firewise community USA program, cost-share assistance for forest landowners and the post-fire assessment program are also provided by Cascadia. (visit www.cascadiacd.org to learn more)

Executive Director Carlene Anders of the Disaster Leadership Team and Okanogan County Long Term Recovery Group invited all to the Fire Strong Workshop which is a call to action to become fire resilient. On Tuesday, March 19 from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. the workshop will take place at the Pateros School Gym. The same thing happens again on Wednesday, March 20 at Campbell’s Resort in Chelan.

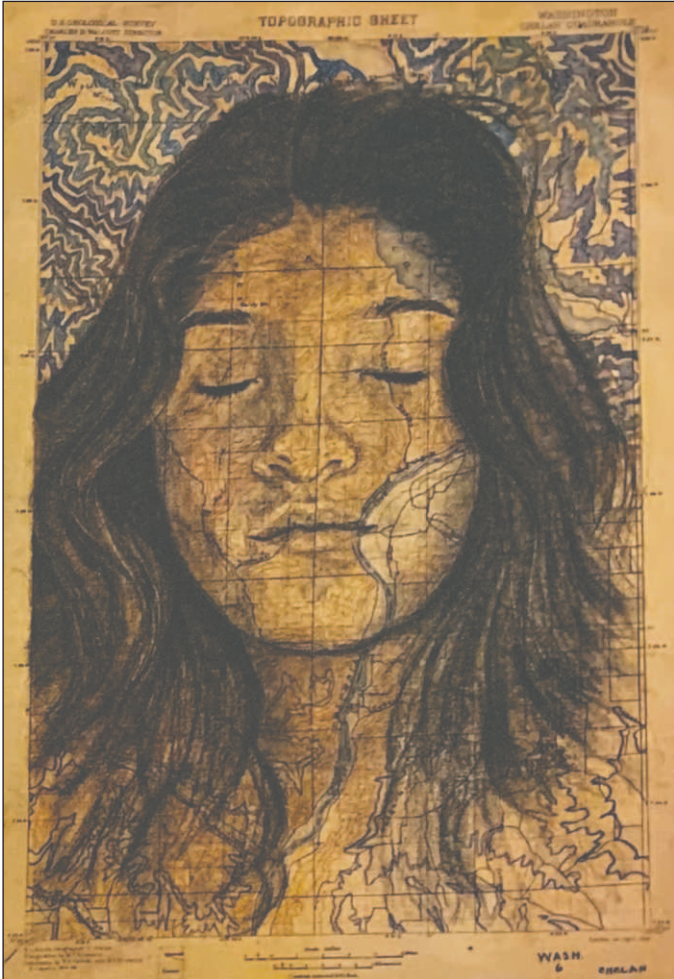

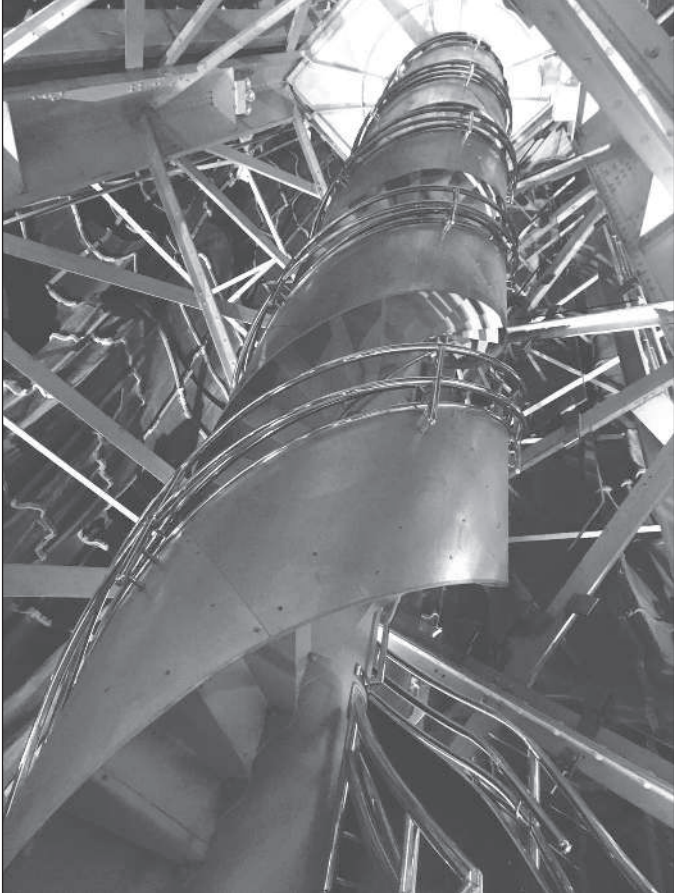
