Manson votes ‘yes’

## Manson School District voters pass 2 levy propositions

MANSON - The Manson School Board placed a levy proposition on the Feb. 12, Chelan County special election ballot. Such was approved by the voters with 68.27 percent as of Feb. 15. The levy will replace an expiring Maintenance and Operations (M & O) Levy passed by voters in February 2017. The levy is for two years 2020 and 2021. The current voter approved amount scheduled to be collected this year (2019) is \$1,367,278. The tax rate is \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value. In 2020 \$1,449,314 (\$1.50 per \$1,000) and 2021 \$1,536,273 (\$1.50 per \$1,000) Similarly, the Manson School Board placed a second levy for a six-year capital project. This will replace an expiring capital levy passed by voters in 2013 set to expire on December 31, 2019. Voters approved of the levy voting “yes” by 68.62 percent.

CHELAN – A winter storm hit all Washington State last week, leaving behind lots of snow on the ground. In town, Public Works and Parks and Recreation staff were ready to plow away and keep Chelan streets snow

free. During the last Chelan City Council meeting, on Feb. 12, the snow plowing crews were recognized by Mayor Mike Cooney at the regular Chelan City Council meeting on Feb. 12.

“While most of us were doing things Friday night our Public Works crew were huddled together figuring out a plan of attack for the snowstorm, thank you Jake and your crew and Karen and

## Manson Parks needs sponsors for Kids Ice Skating event in March

Everyone welcome to donate

MANSON – Rob Campbell and Travis Schoenwald will hold their current officer positions for one more year as it was voted by the Manson Parks Board. Commissioners met during on a snowy Valentine’s Day to go over a few items on the agenda including Leffler Field. Campbell mentioned that Manson Parks will be more involved with the Leffler Field project soon since now they are on “the drivers seat” of the funding process due to being an official government agency. He also informed them on the approval of \$500,000 from Chelan County Commissioners for the project. Commissioner Randy Reed clarified that the funds that were approved by the Chelan County Commissioner earlier on this month “are set-asides for projects.” He also mentioned that this would be the first purchase of Manson Parks. “Every land we managed has been donated, so this would be the

first purchase.”

Director Robin Pittman informed the commissioners about the meeting on Feb. 11 the Leffler Field committee had and presented them on with the meeting’s minutes. The committee asked the board to decide and vote on a date to hold a public forum to hear the public’s comments on the development of the property. After a brief discussion, they came to an agreement to schedule the forum for March 6 at 5:30 p.m. in the Manson Grange.

Pittman and Campbell attended Legislative Day for Parks in Olympia on Feb. 7 and met with all three District 12th legislators. “We were lobbying the RCO Grant that we applied for Ernie’s acquisition, we went with another 150 people that were lobbying to try to get money set aside for that budget,” she said.

A few meeting back, Pittman mentioned the possibility of holding an Ice Skating event for the elementary school kids at the Town Toyota Center. The event will take place on March 23, from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

## Lake Chelan School District to move into renovated offices by April

CHELAN – Blews Constuction, Inc. of Spokane has been remodeling the property at 307 E. Johnson since January 7 which will serve as the new central offices for the Lake Chelan School District. “We want to take advantage of a vacant building so we are in the process of renovating that,” said LCSD Superintendent Barry DePaoli. The space once occupied by Columbia Valley Community Health Center will now consolidate LCSD’s HR, business manager, food services, the board room and the superintendent’s office in the same area as the special programs secretaries and their Ed Psychologist.

The renovation on the north side of the building began in Jan. 7, Lake Chelan School District plans on moving into their new offices by the end of the school year.

This change will allow everyone to be together and

will create efficiencies for the district as DePaoli stated.

Ten new offices and a larger boardroom will be the feature of the new space. The space in which the district office currently is in will be leased to Chelan Fresh. DePaoli mentioned Chelan Fresh is growing and they are in need of more space. The bid of \$813,900 from Blews was approved during a special board meeting on Dec. 20, 2018, by the school board. It was explained that the district has the funds to do this project which will upgrade the north side of the building and the south side boardroom plus the entrance of the building. DePoali explained that they will move in by the end of the school year with the hopes of being into the new offices by April or May.

## Lake Chelan Basin snowpack 80 percent of normal

How does PUD measure the snowpack?

CHELAN – In a recent preliminary forecast survey conducted by a team of Chelan PUD specialists, it was found that the Lake Chelan Basin is currently at 80 percent of water supply for the year. Compared to last year’s forecast it was a little below average, however as energy analyst John Wasniewski states it’s still early and a lot more snow could develop this winter. It’s hard to predict the amount of snow each year because each year is unique. Based on historical data Wasniewski has seen a wide variety of range levels. “There are years were it may show 80 percent in February and it ends up being above average and other years it may not work that way,” he added. Temperatures, weather and precipitation will determine when Lake Chelan will start to refill with melted snow. This generally occurs during April or May. July 1, is the date PUD tries to achieve having the lake at capacity for the summer, which equals 1,098 feet in depth.

Wasniewski and his team measure the snowpack from three different locations above Stehekin. “We go to Park Creek Ridge, back up northwest of Stehekin. That’s one indicator. We also go to Lyman Lake which is the headwaters for Railroad Creek up above Holden,” he explained. Those two places are used year after year to get snowpack measures. “We plan three trips per year, one in February, a March one and an April one,” said Wasniewski. Sometimes the helicopter can’t make it to the sites due to the weather. Three PUD staffers fly to the sites where the snowpack survey is conducted. Two staffers screw together a set of aluminum tubes to measure the snow depth. “We try to pull out a core of the snow melt all the way from the dirt up to the top and measure the length of the core.” The third staff member is usually the team’s scribe. The snow collected in the tube then is weighted, the weight of the tube gets subtracted in order to calculate the exact weight of it. “The weight of the snow itself it’s what gives us the water content, the water content is the most important number,” said Wasniewski.

The team spends around 20 to 30 minutes and take four samples at each of the sites they visit. A whole trip usually takes four to six hours. From there it takes a couple of days to analyze the data collected. Once a week, Wasniewski

writes a brief narrative on what he is seeing at Lake Chelan. He publishes his writing on the website [www.chelanpud.org/parks-and-recreation/lake-chelan-lake-levels](http://www.chelanpud.org/parks-and-recreation/lake-chelan-lake-levels). The website includes a graph that shows the current level of the lake at a real time.

Blake has two pigs and Cole has one. The Cochran twins have been attending the Chelan County Fair since they were two weeks old, so at this point all of this is normal to them. However, “it’s fun and you get to hang out with people. It is something that changes up your routine,” said Cole.

After all this time with their pigs, the twins have a set schedule that they follow, “me and my brother switch off each day to take care of the pigs.” The twins give their pigs water, check their

your crew,” said Cooney.

Bear Mountain Water District proposes new ULIDs

CHELAN – Two years ago around March, the Bear Mountain Water District proposed a Utility Local Improvement District (ULID) along the South Shore which would benefit certain parcels in the area.

The ULID would help bring fire flow to properties around the Bear Mountain Golf Course, Hawks Meadow and lakefront parcels along SR 97A from Tsillan Cellars to Pat & Mikes. Such ULID was split into two after it was shut down by Hawks Meadow, leaving the lakefront property owners on the hook to pay for around \$2.1 million of the total \$2.6 million project.

On March 29, 2017, the District held a public hearing in which 60 plus property owners were in attendance. Many of them showed frustration and responded with protests against the ULID. They were

even thinking of petitioning the district to get them removed from the district.

The project shut down on April 19 of the same year after former Bear Mountain board member and Tsillan Cellars owner Bob Jankelson withdrew his support for the ULID, giving the 40 percent needed to reject the ULID.

This year, in late January, the District’s board received a petition from the majority of the residents who want the District to create a ULID for the construction of water improvements. The board adopted a resolution declaring its intention to create a ULID No. 2 and to order the construction of certain improvements to the water system.

The improvements consist of replacing the existing well pump, the addition of a 53,000 gallon concrete reservoir and another reservoir of 265,000 gallons, interconnecting piping between new and existing reservoirs and fire hydrants plus upgrading the fire risers. Electrical service upgrades at reservoirs and the necessary engineering, contingency and plan upgrades are also part the improvements.

An estimated cost for the improvements is \$800,000, which will be paid in full by property

owners living within the proposed ULID No. 2.

A meeting will be held by the board on Feb. 27 at 1:00 p.m. at the Chelan Fire District No. 7 Fire Hall, 232 E. Wapato Ave., Chelan. The meeting will serve as a way to share more information on the ULID formation and improvements. It will also serve as a way to determine the payment method of the project.

Those desiring to object the improvements and the formation of the proposed ULID may appear at the hearing and state their views.

Similarly, the District is proposing to form a ULID No. 3 and to order the construction of certain improvements to the water system within the said ULID. The proposed improvements deal with the installation of an intertie to the District’s water system sourced from Lake Chelan, related infrastructure along with the necessary engineering, contingency and plan upgrades.

The cost of the proposed improvements is of \$200,000 and those properties benefiting by such improvements are accountable for the full cost.

During the Feb. 27 meeting at the Chelan Fire District, the board will also go over ULID No. 3 and will hear the public’s views on the proposal.




