CHELAN - Mary Signorelli's term as Chair of the Lake Chelan Community Hospital and Clinic Board concluded last Jan. 22, at their monthly

Signorelli had a few words to say to those present, before moving on to board elections. "I want to thank all the board members for putting up with me for the last three years and for allowing me to serve. I would also like to thank our care givers and care givers throughout the years, all the departments and everyone for working so hard ... I am not leaving, but I am just stepping down, I want to thank you for the time I have served, your support and trust has meant a lot. I feel like I have learned an awful lot and I am grateful for the opportunities and the challenges," she stated.

Nominated for Chair of the board by Signorelli was Phyllis Gleasman. Gleasman has worked side by side with

End of the year presentations given at Chelan City Council meeting

CHELAN - An array of presentations were given to the Chelan City Council on Jan. 22. Councilmembers were able to learn more about Lake Chelan's water quality samples, PUD's strategic plan as well as the 2019 budget for Thrive Chelan Valley.

Before the presentations began, during the public comment portion of the meeting, Stan Morse spoke in front of the council.

"Two weeks ago I filed an F-1 declaration with the Public Disclosure Commission, announcing my intent to run for mayor of the City of Chelan ... I may be a good talker. But I promise to be an even better listener," he said.

His own concerns include fire and fuel load, affordable housing, water rights and soil pollution. "I respect the time and energy each of you commit toward leading this city into what we all hope will be a bright future," Morse stated.

Councilmembers heard updates on PUD from General Manager Steve Wright. He went over the current strategic plan and the upcoming items PUD will tackle this vear.

PUD's strategic plan was adopted in 2015, the plan focused on three main goals which included; reducing PUD's debt, investing in assets and people plus initiating a Public Power Benefit program.

Last year, PUD reached its debt target by reducing it by

almost half since 2010, because of this Wright stated that debt reduction will no longer be one of strategic objectives in the years ahead.

In terms of the asset program things didn't look so good, "PUD uncovered a substantial need for investment in refurbishment and maintenance of its existing hydropower, transition and distribution system and buildings." Wright explained that there's more work to be done in respect to their assets.

With the initiation of the Public Power Benefit program, PUD was able to expand Fiber broadband access. At the moment, 74 percent of homes have access to Fiber, however PUD is struggling to get to the last 15 percent.

According to Wright, Chelan is the fastest growing area in our County. Due to this, he informed the council on the possibility of needing a new substation on the South

Currently land has been acquired for the North Shore substation and in the next 12 months construction will be started with one to two years as turnaround of the project.

Wright reported that PUD is following all guidelines of the environmental conservation plan, while also working to-

DUI arrests doubled in Chelan according to 2018 data



CHELAN - According to Chief of Special Operations Jason Reinfeld in 2018, 92 people were arrested for DUIs in the city of Chelan. That is double the cases from 2017.

Reinfeld presented the Chelan County Sheriff's Office statistics, differences and similarities between 2017 and 2018 to the Chelan City Council during the Jan. 22 meeting.

He first reported on the self-initiated infractions from the officers patrolling the streets. Speeding infractions in Chelan was one of the most significant increases from 2017 to last year.

limit. He believes that phosphorus levels increase due to run off from fire materials. Levels above the limit could affect the water clarity of the lake.

The project has had student involvement from Chelan and Manson High Schools as well as Roots Community School.

Thrive Chelan Valley's executive director gave a brief summary report on Thrive and its budget for 2019. Overall, she stated that the main goal is to expand and grow the Teen Center by providing other resources to the kids in the community, such as tutoring. is combined from water inspections and boat rentals. "We did nine separate visits of rental boat companies last year for a total of hours of 40 hours," said Moody.

The Unit assisted 32 boats for non-emergencies, and there was three Marine search and rescue protocols with 17 people assisted.

In 2018, there were only six reported boating accident. "To be reported there either has to be an injury that requires hospitalization or over \$2,000 in damage."

However, Moody doesn't think that number represents what happens on the lake. He said that many of the boat rental companies do not report accidents.

Moody informed the council that he will be working on repositioning the eight water buoys so they are more visible for people to see. Along with that he will be marking each buoy in the GPS system.

The Marine Patrol officers also presented 12 times to the schools, during one of those days they focused on teaching the kids boat safety protocols.






