#### Commissioner of **Public Lands Hilary Franz visits** Chelan

By Diana Piñon, Staff Writer CHELAN - This wildfire season is predicted to be a very significant one coming ahead. Since January 1, 386 wildfires have already been reported, breaking previous records. The Chelan area has been impacted by a few of those wildfires and the current dry conditions have local, state and federal fire agencies ready to fight them together

Department of Natural Resources Commissioner of Public Lands Hilary Franz and the DNR staff held a Town Hall Meeting on June 27 at the Chelan Senior Center.

Chelan was one of the six cities Franz visited in order to prepare and en-gage the public on the fire season soon approaching.

"We had more snow and rain that we might of had in 2014 and 2015. The snow and rain that we got were at

higher elevations which left many of lower elevations still very dry. May was the driest on record for our state," said Franz. Due to this, the DNR has recognized the severity of the situation and the likelihood of significant fires in the Chelan Valley area.

# **Chelan Valley Housing Trust** talks layouts for future homes

CHELAN - Members of the Chelan Valley Housing Trust board, engineers and architects came together to determine layouts and footprints of the future affordable neighborhood, on Monday, Dec. 17.

The group met for majority of the day at Campbells' River Room. The day started with introductions from those present and a brief explanation as why they were part of the project.

Recently retired Director of Sales and Marketing for Campbell's Resort Clint Campbell was one of the 12 people in the room.

"I'm excited to be involved with this group that seems to have the passion and expertise to help solve our community's housing crisis at this point in time, here and now," he said.

After introductions, Murray Hutchins of GCH Architects went over the goals for the dav.

Hutchins explained that the site where these homes will be built is by The Lookout. The ideal goal is to integrate the affordable homes to the Lookout development. "It sets an example for others," he said.

However, for a while the residencies will stand on their own while The Lookout continues to develop.

The land donated by The Lookout is right next to Manson Highway and to the side of a storage facility.

"There is a 10 foot grade change across the whole site, which is about a six percent

a few years. Hutchins and Mike Johnson from Nash Architects went ahead and designed a couple layouts to present to the attendees.

Johnson presented three basic home footprints that are more of a cottage style home and could potently cost an estimated \$200,000 based on the income of the buyers.

The size of the cottages would range anywhere from 800 square feet to 1,200 square feet, with two or three bedrooms and the possibility for a fourth one if needed.

Hutchins then talked about

four different layouts for the site itself. The options presented green area with remote parking space. Based on the layouts only 17 homes could be constructed.

The final design has not yet been determined. This meeting served as a stepping stone and a lot more has to be finalized for all the details for the new neighborhood in Chelan.

Based on the feedback it was determined that the sites would be small homes with open space for young professionals, seniors, young families or first time buyers with an income of up to \$50,000 a year.

It was also determined that the homes would be for single families with one, two or maybe 3 bedrooms. This way the neighborhood is diverse and it

CHELAN - Community members came together at the July 11 Chelan Fire and Rescue Commissioner meeting to share their opinions on the Fire Levy Lid Lift rejection in the spring.

In summary, the property tax lid lift was placed on the April 24 ballot. Which would increase the tax rate to \$1.32 per \$1,000 of the value of a residence. Since this tax lid lift did not get approved by the voters, the Fire District was affected by losing \$863,052 which will cause the level of services in the District to decrease. The public had lots to say to the commissioners. More than a handful of people

spoke their minds on the subject which it is of major concern to them In general, the community members present all agreed that cutting staff members

by half is a crucial factor that will affect Chelan as a whole.

## bonds than projected

SUBMITTED BY LAKE CHELAN COMMUNITY HOSPITAL AND CLINICS

CHELAN - A recent drop in interest rates means tax savings for local homeowners, who will pay approximately 33 cents per thousand for 25 years on the community's new hospital building project. This is both a lower amount and a shorter time period than anticipated.

When the capital bond measure was passed by almost 65 percent in 2017, the hospital district projected voters would pay a rate of 38 cents per thousand for 30 years. A 4.55 percent interest rate secured by the District in December allows the hospital to pass savings on to taxpayers.

"If a home is valued at \$300,000, the owner will pay just under \$100 a year," explained Jim Nelson, Bond Underwriter, from D.A. Davidson, at December's Lake Chelan Community Hospital & Clinics (LCCHC) Board meet-

ing. Taxpavers will begin paving for the project in 2019.

'We are very pleased to have the bonds for our new hospital come in under the originally projected amount," said Mary Signorelli, LCCHC Board Chair. "It was the Board's priority to minimize cost to the taxpayers as much as possible on this project, and this is very good news for property owners in our Hospital District."

In April 2017, local voters voted to approve the bond measure for \$20 million to help fund construction of the new hospital facility. The remaining project costs will be funded by LCCHC, with loans from USDA, grants and the Lake Chelan Health & Wellness Foundation.

The LCCHC Board anticipates breaking ground on the new building in fall of 2019, with occupancy in 2021. It will be built on hospital-owned property at Chelan Apple

## Salvation Army Red Kettle Campaign 2018 wraps up the season with a funding increase for Chelan Valley Hope

CHELAN - 'Twas the Salvation Army Red Kettle season from Hot Friday through Christmas Eve ... and thanks to 125+ volunteer bell ringers stationed at the kettles, \$10,640 in coins and bills was collected from our generous community. This beat last year's total by more than \$3,000. All of these funds remain available to Chelan Valley Hope to distribute to families and individuals with urgent critical needs. This is accomplished using Salvation Army vouchers to pay for rent assistance to avoid eviction, or for help with a utility bill to prevent shut-off or for gas

to get to Wenatchee for a necessary medical appointment when the family is short on cash. or even to pay for a night or two in the motel for a family stranded with no place to stay. Confidential interviews are conducted at our office to verify need and offer coaching and planning for avoiding future hardships.

Last year's Kettle campaign brought in \$7,600, which provided about 21% of the total amount of financial support to client households allocated throughout the year. The chart below shows how the funds were distributed to the 67 recipients in 2018.

Cashmere Valley Bank tellers graciously count the cash in the kettles every Monday and the bank supplies the check to Salvation Army along with the report. Also, we want to express our appreciation to the many organizations in our Valley who recruit bell ringers to fill our kettle shifts in both Manson and Chelan and to the community members who volunteer directly to Chelan Valley Hope.





Ask your florist to work with seasonal foliage to not only give your wedding a sense of time and place but also to save on your budget. If you just have to have that special, costly flower, go for it, but ask the florist to keep it minimal and mix in other, less expensive blossoms.

#### Pump Up the Volume

Go for flowers with large, showy blooms instead of lots of smaller stems. Florists may also opt to mix in structural pieces like branches to make arrangements look fuller. Give the florist their head, but also reiterate that you're on a budget.

#### Go Big, But Just Once

If your heart says flowers everywhere on every surface but your wallet says bud vase, see

if your florist can make one big show-stopping arrangement and deploy it effectively. Place this bad boy in one key area and opt for smaller, lessexpensive arrangements elsewhere.

#### Reuse

Have the florist recycle ceremony flowers at the reception. And, when possible, use the venue's own natural beauty to accentuate the blooms. Use lighting or other decor to add some umph to what you can afford, and guests won't notice what's not there.

#### **Get Creative**

Instead of giant floral centerpieces on tables, mix in smaller arrangements with things like personal keepsakes, pictures, candles or other items for a cozy, intimate feel. Consider using plants, too, instead of cut flowers for a savings.

# Catering on a Budget

he source of many a bridal headache, catering and menus may make up a huge chunk of your wedding budget. Ask these questions to pull off a stunning smorgasboard while staying within your budget.

#### Are you licensed?

This means your caterer hasn't run afoul of your state's department of health (not today, ptomaine) and also carries insurance. If the caterer is also providing bar service, make sure they've provided for your state and venue's rules about alcohol.

#### Do you have references?

Talk to at least two references, preferably those that have had a similar style wedding or a similar number of guests. Ask particularly what it's like to work with the caterer and what their personality is like.

#### What kinds of cuisine do you specialize in?

It should go without saying, but don't hire someone who is known for their traditional American fare to lay out a sushi spread. If you've always dreamed of having a certain

cuisine at your wedding, go for a caterer that specializes in that.

#### Is the meal full service?

This means the caterer will attend to table settings, drinks and cleanup. If it's not, be prepared to hire more staff and arrange for these things on your own.

#### Is there an additional fee for special requests? Someone there is going

to be gluten-free or vegan or require other special meals. Ask the caterer if they can do that and, if so, if there's an extra charge. Make sure to leave room in your budget.

## Can I see serveware, table settings, linens, salt and pepper shakers, etc.?

If your caterer offers these services, make sure to lay eyes on them before

the big day. That way you can be sure the plates and tongs are up to your standards. If the caterer doesn't bring these things, you'll need to know so you can leave room in the budget for rental, either from your venue or a separate company.
