Young entrepreneurs bring glass recycling to Chelan Valley

The story behind Glass to Sand at Lake Chelan

MANSON – Manson High School seniors Megan Clausen and Devyn Smith became interested in glass recycling last year during their junior year after the recycling center in Chelan stopped operations.

"Our families are big recyclers and that impacted us," said Clausen. The girls knew that other community members and business were affected by the recycling shut down.

In order to help not only their families, but also the businesses they decided to look into glass recycling and glass crushing as an option.

After talking to locals, Clausen and Smith did some research. "It's taken a lot of time to look at companies and machines," said Clausen, however they were able to narrow it down.

The GLSand is a four feet tall and two feet wide on wheels machine that "can crush a wine bottle or beer bottle into a fine sand or grit that's safe to handle."

The five gallon bucket has the capacity to hold 160 beer bottles or 60 wine bottles which are equal to 85 pounds of sand. It takes about three to five seconds to crush one single bottle.

Some of the extra costs Clausen and Smith will face

include the replacement of machine parts. "The pieces and parts do have an amount of bottle you can crash with them before you have to replacement," said Clausen.

The total cost to purchase one GLSand is of \$6,000, "we also have the option for leasing it, one of the plans was of \$325 per month."

A GoFund Me was started by Clausen and Smith to raise funds to purchase the machine. "Within three days we had raised over \$1,000, lots of people were asking ques-

tions, it was pretty cool," said Clausen.

Smith created jars that will be placed at local wineries, "if people want to donate, they can donate. It's got all the information on it about the machine and how it works," she explained.

Their main goal is to raise enough funds to purchase one machine, so far they have raised \$1,250.

The repurposed product doesn't contain silicosis dust

Cushing and Willoughby appointed to Manson Community Council

MANSON – Two spots were left open with the resignations of Kim Ustanik and Jeremy Jaech from the Manson Community Council.

Both left the Council 11 months into their three year terms. Due to this the Council had to appoint two new members in the Nov. 20 meeting.

Kathy Blum explained, "when people resign from their position, we have the option to go out and find people to take their places for two years, instead of changing the whole voting structure."

Sarah Cushing and Chris Willoughby will join the Council for two years until their term comes up. Before Blum swore the new members in, they briefly introduced themselves to those present.

"I am here because I've been always interested in the community, interested in what's is happening, I figured it was time to go ahead and volunteer my time," said Cushing.

About seven years ago Willoughby served as a member of the Manson Community Council.

"I am a lifelong member of this community, I was born and raised here and I see a lot of value in this community ... I want to make sure the community changes at a rate we can accept as a community. That's why I am back here," he said.

So far, there are three candidates running for two of the positions up for election. Jorge Valencia is running for re-election. Kathy Miller is not. The Council will hold

elections for on Dec. 11 from noon to 7 p.m.

Blum reminded everyone that there's still time to apply, deadline to turn in applications is Dec. 1.

To apply, you must be resident of Manson and a registered voter within the Manson School District. Have at least 10 required signatures from registered voters within the district. The form is available

Department of Ecology Starts Phase 4 of Chelan Chevron cleanup activities

CHELAN - A team under the Department of Ecology was in town at the beginning of November to start Phase 4 of the Chelan Chevron cleanup.

"Phase 4 began and consisted of another geophysical survey to evaluate the east part of the site. Phase 4 also included the installation of more groundwater monitoring wells and the collection of soil samples," said Cleanup Project Manager John Mefford.

Mefford explained that "the field work spanned about two and a half weeks beginning November 1." Preliminary work was done, it included utility locates one week prior to any drilling/air-knifing.

The evaluation of the east part of the site served as a way to find out if any of the other gas stations contributed to the leak. The team found that there was no new hazardous contribution. The soil samples

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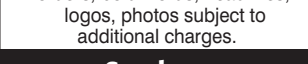

MANSON - The next Manson Community Council meeting is changed to Dec. 11, 2018, and we encourage you to attend the meeting at the Manson Park Office on Pedoi Street at 6 p.m. If you have any questions, feel free to contact any council member: Kathy Blum, Kathy Miller, Jorge Valencia, Sarah Cushing and Chris Willoughby.

The Manson Community Council currently has two at-large positions open for 2019. To apply, you must be a resident of Manson and a registered voter within the Manson School District. Electoral Application for Community Council Positions is available at Allisions of Manson, the Lake Chelan Reclamation District and online at MansonCommunityCouncil.com. At least 10 signatures from registered voters within the district are required.

The top two vote getters will be the council members for the three-year duration. Applications can be returned to Allisions, the Reclamation District, or sent to the Manson Post Office, Manson Community Council, General Delivery.

Deadline for returning the completed form is December 1, 2018.

If there are more than two candidates, there will be an election at the Manson Parks Office on Pedoi Street in Manson between noon and 7 p.m. on Dec. 11, 2018. No write-in votes will be considered or counted.

If elected, the term of office will be effective as of Jan. 1, 2019, and run for three years. Election of officers will be held at the Jan. 15, 2019, meeting.

In other business:

The Council went over two notices received from Chelan County.

• One of them being a SEPA notification that was non-significant for a parcel zoning change from UR1 to UR3. A UR 3 allows to have 12 units per acre and up to 200 units could be built in the two parcels asking for that zoning change. This land will be used for low income housing and the Council submitted comment to the County

again in the spring time.

The Chelan Chevron Site cleanup started back in the 2000s, after "contamination from gasoline was found in soil and groundwater."

Some might ask why the cleanup is taking so long? Well, according to Mefford, "it's a complex site." There's a lot of history that the DOE isn't

and it can be used for gardening, asphalt for roads and "it can also be reused to make glass work again, so it can be melted down to make glass art," explained Smith.

However, at the moment their plan is to "put it in sand bags and we will try and sell those sand bags through Lake Chelan Building Supply in Manson and Chelan and the sand will be available to the community too."

"The big plan for this project is presenting an opportunity to the community, it's not a money maker and it has a lot of flaws," clarified Clausen.

To give the machine a first go, the girls are going to start exploring crushing with local businesses and see how that goes.

At the moment Glass to Sand has partnered up with local wineries to get crushing started. "We will have them rinse and clean their bottles and then for the first few months set a limit of boxes they can bring to us, that way we don't get too overloaded," explained Clausen.

Once the GLSand is pur-

chased, it will be housed at the North Shore Cafe owned by Carman Fretwell in Downtown Manson.

Before the girls graduate they want to create a system that will be sustainable through the school. "Students will be able to go down, crush glass and get community service hours through that. They can also learn more about recycling," said Clausen.

The two will be meeting with Mike Steele sometime this month in hopes of some contribution from the Lake Chelan Chamber of Commerce.

By the end of the month they are hoping to have the GLSand here in the Valley ready to crush some glass. Both Clausen and Smith know that this is not a permanent solution to glass recycling, but only one of many solutions out there.

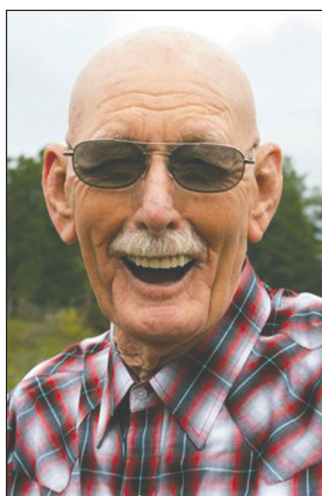
William Alfred Parker

Joining the Grizzlies next fall will be Lexie Gleasman (OH) from Chelan, Amethyst Harper (OH), Kelly Horning (MB), Isabel List (OPP) and Katie Semadeni (OH) "We're really excited for this group to join our program," Lawrence said. "We wanted athletes who love

the grind, athletes who know exactly where this program is and where it needs to be, and want to be part of it because they know that challenges pull the best out of them."

The group has a heavy emphasis on attackers, with three left sides, a right side and a powerful middle blocker joining the team. The focus was intentional, with Montana graduating three pin hitters.

"We knew that we needed athletes who could come in and at least fight to contribute right away," Lawrence said. "We wanted hitters who not only had a wide range of strengths offensively, but then also could contribute in the back row and pass and play defense as well."

Montana will graduate six players this fall after having zero seniors a year ago. While the six is a large number, Lawrence said that last year's lack of senior class allowed her and her staff to really foster relationships with this week's signees, in addition to future classes.

"We weren't scrambling last year," the second-year head coach said. "We were able to take our time and focus on building relationships and being with them for a longer period of time."

Her versatility is one of the things that drew Lawrence to the prep star.

More than her versatility and leadership, though, Gleasman has talent on the volleyball court, helping her team to three consecutive top-eight finishes at state.

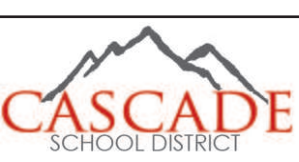
