Chelan Affordable Housing Committee to form a non-profit to continue community service **Community Land Trust**

CHELAN - The Chelan Affordable Housing Committee (CAHC) shifted community discussions concerning the shortage of low and moderately priced housing in the valley into high gear last Tuesday evening, May 29, with a meeting of diverse housing stakeholders at The Vogue.

Contractors, realtors, employers, financial specialists and social service representatives gathered to discuss their areas of expertise in small group exchanges to forge a way forward and address the valley's housing imbalances.

Last April, the City of Chelan retained the services of Housing and Community Development Consultant Julie Brunner from Orcas Island. Brunner, who serves as Housing Manager for Of People and Land (OPAL)

Community Land Trust on Orcas Island, is a nationally acknowledged expert in the field of affordable housing strategies. She spent several days in Chelan participating in more than a dozen meetings as she gathered data and comments for a final Housing Needs Assessment that she will prepare for the Chelan Valley. Brunner concluded her Chelan visit with a presentation at an April 25 community forum hosted by the city and the Chelan Affordable Housing

Committee. The goal of Tuesday's meeting involves the formation of a non-profit, tax-exempt corporation to be called the Community Land Trust (CLT) as a model to meet the valley's housing needs.Advantages of the CLT include:

- · Locally based membership representing and supporting local interests;
- Channeling local donations to meet the affordable housing

- · Using a successful model that has been tested and proven elsewhere:
- · Flexibility to meet the local needs of homebuyers and renters:

• Partnering with Chelan Valley Hope, Habitat for Humanity and like-minded organizations.

The mission of the non-profit entity will be the "the development and stewardship of a stable supply of permanently affordable housing which preserves the dynamic small-town character and diversity of the Chelan Valley," CAHC media release said.

In the meantime, Chelan Valley Hope is accepting tax-exempt financial donations earmarked for affordable housing until the new non-profit achieves eligibility. Interest parties can contact info@chelanvalleyhousing.org for more information or to learn how to become involved.

Local RN seeks grant funding

CHELAN - For the last four of her 35 years as a practicing Registered Nurse, Michelle Jerome has served the greater Chelan Valley from Manson to Chelan Falls visiting, assisting, and educating vulnerable and older adults in their homes. The service Jerome provides is free and is funded by grants and generous donations from those who help Jerome "knit a safety net for the Lake Chelan Community" to use her words.

Jerome's latest funding, a \$23,000 grant from United Health Care, combined with community fundraising to meet minimum budgetary requirements, kicked in last August 1. The problem is, that grant comes to an end on July 31, and Jerome needs to find another one to continue her community outreach.

"I'm looking at a \$30,000 budget to sustain my work, supplies and mileage" said Jerome, and the way demand is increasing "that might not be enough."

Jerome's fiscal sponsor is the Lake Chelan Lutheran Church. As a 501(c)3 nonprofit, the church takes in the funds and disperse them.

Jerome relocated to Chelan from Bellingham four years ago "and never looked back," she said. She came to the community with a strong background in home care, hospice, public health and mother/baby care.

"There aren't very many of me in the health field," said Jerome of her niche service that is part of a push to get

communities more involved in the care of their residents.

"Communities are being asked to be more responsible with hospital dollars," said Jerome. "More and more insurance companies are seeing that hospitals don't misapply or waste money."

Chelan Fire and Rescue's fast response contains brush fire, saves homes

The call-out to local responders and neighboring communities had the fire contained to 6.6 acres in one hour and eight minutes from the initial 911 alarm.

CHELAN – A fast response by fire personnel from Chelan Fire and Rescue Station 71 is credited with containing a wind-driven brush fire and saving two homes on Sunday, May 27.

According to the official CFR release the blaze was first reported at about 10:04 a.m. Sunday, May 27, as a 50-foot-by-50-foot brush fire along State Route 150. Stiff winds pushed the flames up the hillside despite efforts by a number of citizens to stop the fire's rapid progress.

The first units from CFR Station 71, two brush engines and water tender with six firefighters, were on the scene in less than five-and-a-half minutes after the initial 911 call.

"Brush 71 aggressively engaged the fire off SR 150 flanking the fire while Brush 79 and Tender 71 were assigned to structural protection off Orchard View Drive on top of the hillside," the release said. "These two units are credited with saving two homes as the fire reached the top of the hill.'

Chelan County Sheriff's officers also responded to the initial alarm to manage traffic and alert threatened homeowners of the danger.

A second alarm four minutes after the first brought units from Stations 72 (Chelan Falls), 73 (Union Valley), 74 (Chelan Airport) and 75 (South Lakeshore)

A notification to the Central Washington Interagency Communication Center at 10:13 a.m. brought three Department of Natural Resources (DNR) engines and one heli-

"A third alarm was requested at 10:15 hours bringing assistance from Manson, En-

CFR units save new home under construction

CHELAN - Chelan Fire and Rescue units were called out just prior to midnight on Thursday, May 31, to a structure fire on a residential house under construction near downtown

Rescue 71 arrived on the scene within four minutes, 18 seconds of the 11:20 p.m. 911 call and reported smoke coming from the three-story structure and a fire on the first floor.

Engine 71 arrived less than a minute later and, with help from the rescue crew, had the fire knocked down at 11:37 p.m., 17 minutes, 23 seconds from the initial call-out, a CFR media report said.

Four on-duty career personnel and one on-duty volunteer comprised the initial response crews from Rescue 71 and Engine 71.

Engine 79 arrived at 11::35 p.m., less than 15 minutes from the initial 911 call, and was assigned to hydrant standby in case a water supply was needed, the CFR report said. "Other responding personnel and apparatus were cancelled and returned in service."

The flames were out and an investigation underway less than 15 minutes after the initial call came in.

A survey of the site revealed that the fire started outside the home and burned through the exterior wall, into the wall space, and lower floor joist space damaging some electrical wiring. The flames were contained in a small portion of the front room of the nearly completed house. Paint materials including stain-soaked rags, brush and stain cans stacked against the house exterior spontaneously combusted, causing the fire, the CFR report said.



CHENEY - The Manson Trojans took nine competitors to the state meet in Cheney at the EWU track on Thursday, May 24. On Thursday, Cole Beazley ran the 300 hurdles in 44.69 placing 15th yet did not qualify for finals. Bailey Cameron also competed on Thursday in the 1600 meters and finishing in a time of 4:56. Friday brought more competition for the Trojans including high jump and shot put finals and prelims for the laned events. Fernando Flores threw the shot 36'5" and Eduardo Escalera jumped 5' 8" in the high jump. The boys 4x1 relay ran well but did not qualify for finals as well as Connor Torgesen's tough double in the 400 and 800 meter runs. Kendall Petre ran and qualified for the finals in the 400 meters with a personal best of 62.87. Also qualifying for finals was Fernando Flores in the 200 meters in a personal best of 23.62. Another highlight of the day was our boys 4x400 relay qualifying for finals running season best of 3:35.69.

Saturday, the Manson Trojans wore their game faces in hopes of medaling and setting personal best in their events. Events began with Petre's high jump with tough competition. Kendall placed 8th winning the first medal of the day with a jump of 4'8". Grant Torgesen ran a tough 3200 meters in a time of 11:34. Kendall and Fernando came back in the finals in their events setting personal best. Kendall placing 7th with a time 62.78 in the 400 and Fernando placing 6th in the

As the competition was ending, the Manson Trojans were waiting for their final event the boys 4x400 relay. The boys were seated in lane 8, not a preferred laned but with the Irojan tenacity, nothing was going to stop their goal of doing their best. Joe Strecker set the pace in the first leg leading the race. As Cole Beazley took the baton, he held some of the competitors off finishing well giving the baton to Connor Torgesen. Connor fought a hard leg and holding the position. Eleven Goats make All-League teams

Emma McLaren places eighth in state girls' singles tennis

YAKIMA – The Chelan Goats varsity tennis team qualified six players to compete in four brackets at the Washington Interscholastic Activities Association state tennis championships on May 25-26 at the Yakima Tennis Club. The Goats also had 11 of their number nominated to the Caribou Trail League 2018 All-League Tennis Teams, more than any other CTL school.

Sophomore Emma McLaren emerged from state competition with an eighth-place medal in girls' singles play and picked up the WIAA Sportsmanship medal among the 16 players in her bracket.

McLaren's opening match was across the net from 2017 state runner-up Penelope Owen of Seattle Academy.

"Emma held her own, played inspired tennis, and nearly pulled off a major upset before dropping her debut match 4-6, 6-1, 6-1," said coach Marty Rothlisberger. "That loss forced Emma to win her next two to stay alive in the medal hunt, and she did just that."

Owen went on to finish second in state singles.

McLaren defeated Freeman's Sarah Simmerman 6-1, 3-6, 6-2, and Michelle Busey of Naches Valley, 6-4, 6-1 to advance to the following day's medal round. McLaren fell to Bailee Wallace of Three Rivers Christian, 7-6, 6-3, to finish eighth overall.

Senior Micah Larsen staged a strong opening match in his final state appearance with a 6-1, 6-2 win over Granger's Malachi Cumpston, the South Central Athletic Conference's No. 1 seed.

"In the second round, Micah faced Ezra Magaram of Seattle Academy, and Micah definitely raised his level of play," said

Rothlisberger. "After losing the first set quickly, 6-0, Micah caught fire, played the best tennis of his career, and almost sole the second set before falling 5-7."

Magaram would end up taking third in singles.

Larsen was eliminated in a loser-out match against Tonas-ket's Caleb Hardesty, 6-4, 6-`1.

"Micah had a spectacular tennis career at CHS, including over 60 wins, multiple state appearances, and three consecutive years as 1st Team All-League," said Rothlisberger. "His biggest contribution, a fifth-place state trophy in 2017 in boys' doubles that helped the boys team finish second in state as a team."

Rothlisberger said his girls doubles teams could not maintain the momentum of their successful CTL and District tournaments against state opponents.

Freshman Elle Rothlisberger and Bella Gatzemeier had a challenging opener against Mary Zisette and Allison Papritz of South Whidbey," said Rothlisberger. "Elle and Bella hung in well against the even-

tual second-place finishers, but lost, 6-1, 6-0."

Roethlisberger and Gatzemeier, the youngest doubles entrants in the tournament, were eliminated in the loser-out second round by Granger, 6-3, 6-3.

The district champion tandem of junior Sierra Rothlisberger and senior Madeline Peebles lost their opening two matches to Coupeville, 6-4, 6-3, and Tenino, 6-1, 6-3.
