CCFD7 deadlock moves candidate choice to county commissioners

CHELAN – The choice of a third Chelan county Fire District Commissioner to replace the vacancy left by the resignation of Tom Peters, has been referred to the Chelan County Commissioners after CCFD Commissioners Russ Jones and Phil Moller were unable to compromise on a candidate during a special session, Wednesday morning, May 23.

Four candidates for the commissioner's seat remain from six who originally applied for the position. They are Jay Witherbee, Nan Bolomey, Karl Jonasson, and Karyl Oules. Of the two other candidates who originally applied for the post, one withdrew from consideration and the other was ruled ineligible.

The third commissioner's seat became available when Peters announced his sudden resignation on March 12 stating that he believed he could no longer help fulfill the mission of Chelan Fire and Rescue. Peters' six-year term would have expired at the end of 2019.

When queried by the Mirror about the Chelan County Commissioners' involvement to resolve the deadlock, District 3 Commissioner Doug England cited Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 42.12.070 relating to Filling nonpartisan vacancies. Part 4 under the

section states: "If a governing body fails to appoint a qualified person to fill a vacancy within ninety days of the occurrence of the vacancy, the authority of the governing body to fill the vacancy shall cease and the county legislative authority of the county in which all or the largest geographic portion of the city, town, or special district is located shall appoint a qualified person to fill the vacancy."

"By RCW 42.12.070(4) we are given the responsibility of picking a replacement," said England. "When we meet Tuesday (May 29) we will be deciding what process

Chelan Council selects SCJ Alliance, Stormin' Towing for city services

CHELAN – It was a workmanlike, business-as-usual bi-monthly meeting of the City Council last Tuesday, May 22, featuring AWC appointments, a PUD interlocal agreement, a few changes to the municipal code, and a couple of contract awards.

Council members authorized Manor Mike Cooney to finalize and execute a Professional Services Agreement with SCJ Alliance of Wenatchee for construction administration and inspection oversight for the Woodin Avenue Bridge Project.

Council also gave the major go-ahead to execute an agreement with Stormin' Towing for city towing services to replace the previous contractor, Burkhard Towing, that closed its doors last year. Council

members also approved a minor to Chelan Municipal Code language to allow the city to pursue services with the new towing service.

The council approved delegates to attend the 2018 Association of Washington Cities (AWC) annual business meeting June 26-29 in Yakima.

An Interlocal Agreement for the LED Relight Project was given the green light with the Public Utilities District.

Council members authorized the mayor to finalize and execute the Lookout Winery District Phase 2 final plat.

Mayor Cooney also delivered a special presentation on the Trust for Public Lands.

A council workshop is scheduled for Tuesday, June 5 from 4-6 p.m.

The Chelan City Council meets at 6 p.m. on the second and fourth Tuesday of every month.

Lake Chelan Hospital Board appoints LaPorte as new commissioner

CHELAN – Lake Chelan Community Hospital & Clinics (LCCHC) Board of Commissioners appointed Jordana LaPorte of Chelan to fill the vacancy left by Commissioner Tom Warren at its regular board meeting Tuesday, May 22. She will serve until the November 2019 election.

"I applied for this position because I believe our valley should have the best possible healthcare facility, and I believe I can contribute to that goal," said LaPorte, who is the President/CEO of LaPorte Financial Alliance, Inc., a full-service accounting firm in Chelan.

"I want our hospital to be successful," she said. "To me, that means it can provide efficient, quality and compassionate care, that it is sustainable, and that it is not a burden to the taxpayers... I believe I have the education, business experience and desire to facilitate that success."

"Jordana LaPorte has a skill set that will be invaluable to the Board," said Mary Signorelli, LCCHC Board Chair. "She will

be an excellent addition."

LaPorte founded LaPorte Financial Alliance, Inc. and purchased a local CPA's sole proprietorship in 2003, after 17 years in the industry. She completed her BA in Business Administration with an emphasis in accounting at the University of Washington in 1985 and worked for one of the largest local accounting firms in Bellevue, continuing her education at Golden Gate University and receiving a Master's Degree in Taxation in 1993. Professionally, LaPorte has focused on providing tax and business consulting and compliance to a wide variety of clients in many industries.

She is also a member of Lake Chelan Rotary, the American Institute of CPA's, the Washington State Society of CPA's, and Eastern Washington Advisory Board Member for the

Washington Policy Center. She served as president of Lake Chelan Rotary in 2015 and 2016, as well as president of the North Central Washington Business Loan Fund. Additional experience includes

Chairman of the Young CPA's, a subgroup of the Washington State Society of CPA's, and Chair of the Membership Committee of the WSCPA. LaPorte also participated in training through Financial Peace University and is a certified counselor. This program encourages the use of budgeting, financial responsibility, investing for the future and discourages the use of debt.

LaPorte looks forward to her time on the LCCHC Board and will begin orientation shortly. "I don't pretend to know or understand all that this job will entail," she said, "but I am

confident that I have the skills and desire to get up to speed quickly and be a productive board member."

"I don't believe everyone will agree all of the time," she continued, "and even when we do agree, I think it is still important to play the devil's advocate, thereby looking at different sides of the issue, something I am particularly good at."

LaPorte moved to the Chelan area in 1999, having married a farmer local to the valley; they have three children. The family farm includes apples and cherries as well as the occasional pig, steer or produce for sale.

Six individuals submitted letters of interest for the vacant LCCHC Board position. After initial review at a special Board meeting May 15, the Board asked two applicants, LaPorte and Guy Evans, to submit additional information, which they reviewed and discussed during an executive session at the May 22 Board meeting.

"We want to sincerely thank all of the applicants," said Signorelli. "They were all quality candidates, and we appreciate their interest and support of the hospital."

Chelan PUD staff briefs commissioners on Chelan slope instability

1,200-foot area along the Chelan River being monitored by PUD due to recent rockslides

CHELAN - The slope along 1,200 feet of Reach 2 in the Chelan River Gorge is being closely monitored Chelan County Public Utility (PUD) staff reported to commissioners at Monday's (April 30) board meeting. One location, Site A (see map), is a known area of ground movement. The PUD has been watching this area for more than 25 years with little activity. It's located about 750 feet from the Gorge Road. Site B is a more recent movement area. Chelan PUD employees were scouting the area with Chelan-area residents to identify potential locations for extending the Reach 1 trail. What looked to be an old road was actually a newly formed striation or furrowed ground at the north end of the PUD property. On closer examination, it was obvious that there had been a slide area just below Site

B and it traveled down to the river shoreline.

Bill Christman, PUD Chief Dam Safety Engineer, said PUD staff has determined this new location seems to be more active than Site A. This earth movement is natural phenomena. Out of precaution, the area is being closed off to public access and signs will be set

up to make the public aware of the potential hazard.

The PUD is contracting with a geotechnical firm to help with the assessment. PUD staff and the consulting engineers will look at what might occur if an earthen dam resulted from a large rockfall. Also to be studied is what impact an earthen

dam would have on hydro operations, as well as conditions further downstream in Reach 4.

Likely, there would be a large release of water below the dam, similar to what occurred in the 1990s, leaving sand and gravel in Reach 4 on its way to the Columbia River.

Until more information is known, the public is urged to stay out of the signed area. Christman went on to say that there are no structures in the path of the unstable ground. While it is possible a large ground movement could release material that could block the gorge, the gradual nature of the ground movement makes it unlikely that there would be a large release that could block the gorge.

No protected fish travel to Reach 2. There are resident fish in the area. If there was a greater slide release into the river, a potential response might be to increase flow into the Chelan River from the Chelan Dam to create a "flushing" action to push the debris downstream, similar to what would naturally occur. The PUD would monitor this action carefully to protect listed species in Reach 4 and to minimize water quality impacts.

The PUD has reached out to state and federal agencies, stakeholders and tribes to advise them of the situation. All those who have been contacted agree with the approach being taken by the PUD.

Reduced services at Weaver Point Campground

SEDRO WOOLLEY - Throughout the 2018 boating season, potable water and flush toilets will not be available at Weaver Point Campground in Lake Chelan National Recreation Area. Outhouses will be open for

use at the campground. Winter storms knocked down poles and damaged the Chelan PUD lines which provide power to the area. The water system depends on electricity to run the pumps.

Per Washington State Department of Health at www.doh.wa.gov:

Purifying by boiling

If your tap water is unsafe, boiling is the best method to kill disease-causing organisms.

If tap water is unavailable, the following may be considered as potential water sources. Water taken from these sources should be boiled before drinking.

Rainwater, Lakes, Riv-

ers and streams, Natural springs and Ponds

Caution: Many chemical pollutants will not be removed by boiling.

Cloudy water should be filtered before boiling. Filter cloudy water using coffee filters, paper towels, cheesecloth or a cotton plug in a

funnel.

- Bring the water to a rolling boil for at least one full minute.

- Let the water cool before drinking.

- Add two drops of household bleach per gallon to maintain water quality while in storage.

to use." One of the more recent issues facing the full complement of CCFD7 Commissioners will be the failure of the proposed levy lid lift in the April 24 Special Election. Proposition 1 that would have authorized a property tax levy lid lift for fire and emergency services, went down to defeat.

The measure, would have authorized a .40 cent increase per \$1,000 of assessed property valuation, raising the levy rate from .92 cents to \$1.32 per \$1,000 assessed value. The proposition received only 814 of 2,045 votes cast, or a 39.8 percent approval rate, well below the majority required.

Lyndell Elizabeth Crowder

Lyndell Elizabeth Crowder, 94, of Manson died May 20, 2018 from complications of Alzheimer's disease. She'll be lovingly remembered by her family for her courage, strength, and generosity.

Born August 6, 1923 in Leola, Arkansas, to Jim and Maggie Key (Ritchey),

Lyndell and her family came west for opportunity in Brewster, Washington's orchards when she was 17. She got right to work, and fit right in. While working in the orchards, she also joined the girls' basketball team, represented the town as princess in Wenatchee's Apple Blossom Festival, and graduated as salutatorian of Brewster High



School's class of 1942.

Before World War II she met Melvin Crowder, another Arkansas transplant who'd come to Washington with his family. They danced at Maple Hall near Riverside, married in Wenatchee on May 18, 1945,



and honeymooned at Mare Island, California while Mel was on leave from the Navy.

After the war, the couple made their home in Manson, and their living in the fruit industry. Together they planted trees and grew apples in Man-

son and Brewster. Lyndell spent her time in the orchards, warehouses, and offices - laboring, supervising crews, and learning. Mel did the same as a horticulturist. They raised two daughters, Jackie and Linda. In retirement, they sold pollen and nursery trees to growers throughout Central Washington.

For their kids and grandkids, they exemplified hard work, encouraged education and ambition, and offered all the support they could.

Lyndell was a lifelong member of the Order of the Eastern Star, Chelan Silver Star Chapter, and served as its long-time treasurer. She spent many weekends at the family cabin at Conconully Lake, cleaning more fish than she would've liked. Grossberg finishes 31st in state golf competition

LIBERTY LAKE – Chelan High School varsity golf team member Miles Grossberg shot a final-day 85 for the Goats' best finish in the Washington Interscholastic Activities Association (WIAA) State Golf Championships at Liberty Lake, Tuesday and Wednesday, May 22-23.

Grossberg, a freshman participating in his first WIAA state high school competition, finished in a tie for 31st place with a two-day total of 170.

"He finished his round with a birdie on No. 18 to end his round on a high note," Chelan coach Kirk Einspahr said.

Playing at the girls' championships at Hangman Valley in Spokane, Chelan sophomore Kaylin Boykin tied for

60th place with a 108 (56-52) the "best score of all other CTL golfers present," Einspahr said.

Senior Emily Christenson came in with a 116 (59-57) in a tie for 72nd. The top golfer for the girls finished with a 69, Einspahr said.

"On a positive note for both seniors Corbin and Emily, they got to finish their high school golf careers in a memorable fashion, both paring the 18th hole of their respective courses," Einspahr said.

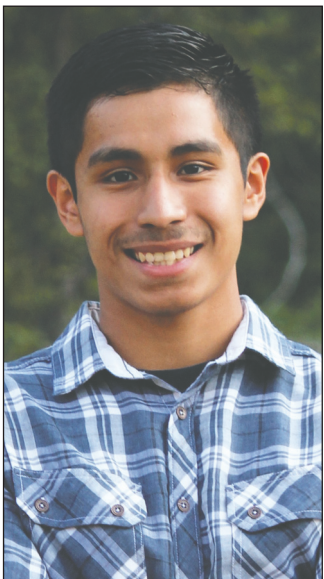

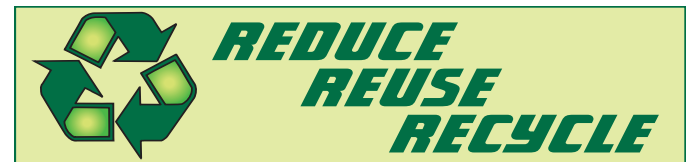
