It is an honorary title given to a person or couple in the Manson Community who have been very active in serving the community. The Marshal(s) have the honor of starting the parade, kicking off the excitement. Dave and Betty Pettit are the perfect example of why Grand Marshals are chosen. They have truly been an active part of the Manson community for many years, giving of their time and caring, touching lives throughout the whole community with their generosity.

Traditionally, the reigning Apple Blossom Royalty go to the person'(s) home and present the honor of Grand Marshal. When the time came to honor Dave and Betty, they were gone in Arizona, soaking up some much needed sun. Due to today's technology, bestowing the personal honor was still possible through Skype. Dave and Betty were both delighted when they received the call and were deeply honored to be chosen.

Dave Pettit grew up on a dairy farm in Ferndale, Wash. After graduating from Ferndale High School in 1956, he went onto college to get his engineering degree from Washington State University. Betty Pettit (nee Ashmun) was born in Lakeside and grew up in Manson, the daughter of long time farming residents Vic and Sunny Ashmun. After graduating Manson High School in 1957, Betty also found herself heading off to Washington State University, majoring in Elementary Education.

One would think the couple would have met at college, but it was in the basement of the Manson United Methodist church playing a youth party game over Thanksgiving weekend in 1960 that they were first introduced by Norm Adams. Both being good friends of Norm's, the couple stayed in contact at college. After graduation, Betty told Dave good luck and goodbye, thinking she would never see him again.

Because the couple share the same birthday, they would stay in some contact as they would once a year acknowledge each other's birthdays. Several years later, they finally became an "item". After marrying, they had two children, son Mark who lives in San Francisco, Calif. and daughter Sue, who lives in Manson. Now, the couple have numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren.





My husband and I are both retired, me from Premera Blue Cross and insurance bookkeeping for several doctors and dentist and my husband from Boeing. We wanted to move to an area with warmer summers and a change of seasons.

In 2004 we moved to Chelan from Hansville on the Kitsap Peninsula. We rented a house off of Boyd Road while our house was being built in Chel-

an Ridge. In October of 2004 we lived in our motor home $while \ we \ finished \ all \ the \ inside$ walls, plumbing, electrical etc. We were able to move in at the end of May 2015.

I love to garden and our lot was almost an acre so that kept me busy all summer and

it's still a work in process 13 years later. When winter came I was getting bored with nothing to keep me busy so my neighbor invited me to come to a Wednesday gathering of ladies at Rosie's Woven Threads quilt shop. Everyone was working on some type of stitchery project. I had not sewn much in the past because I was always working and the weekends were for house work and yard work. The 'backroom girls' as we were called taught me so much, I had never done any embroidery or appliqué and they were very helpful.

In 2007 I took Beginning Quilting Classes from the three sisters, Adrienne, Christy and Cinda. After that I took every class that was offered at the quilt shop. One of the classes that were offered was how to do Needle Turn Appliqué. This procedure of doing appliqué caught my eye and I have doing it ever since. I was pretty bad in the beginning but now that I have been doing it for several years I have gotten much better at it and I prefer this method.

I joined the local quilt guild in 2007 and enjoy the meetings and the annual retreat in Leavenworth that we go to each year.

I was very surprised and honored to be voted the featured quilter at this year's quilt show which is part of the Manson Apple Blossom




