Health & Safety / Covid-19

Due to not having their annual fair in 2020, they are allowing exhibits to have been made by the exhibitor within the last two years to be eligible for entry at the Chelan County Fair for 2021.

Please view the individual exhibitor departments for any new changes to the rules or regulations for entering your entries at www.chelancountyfair.com

What you need to know before coming the fair

They ask the community to do their best at making personal choices that keep themselves and their families safe while participating in their celebration. If you do not feel well, have COVID-19 symptoms, or are actively positive with the COVID-19 virus, please stay home and refrain from gathering at the Chelan County Fair.

- There will be designated entry and exit points into and out of fair. Please follow these designations.
- The Food & Still Life Vendor Booths at the Fair will be spaced out for your safety, they ask that you maintain a 6-foot distance while in line for food and when viewing entertainment at the Fair.
- The Beer Garden will be open in the same location as previous years and following all COVID-19 protocols given to restaurants. They ask that you maintain a 6-foot distance while in line, and consider wearing your mask in the Beer Garden while walking around or ordering at the bar, you may remove it at your table when you are drinking.
- The Chelan County Fair will provide hand sanitizer throughout the event space and encourage people to either wash their hands or use sanitizer frequently.
- Safety protocols will be in place for the Carnival including hand sanitizing stations, plexiglass where transactions occur and markers for distance. They ask that all patrons always maintain 6-feet of distance while in line and consider wearing a masks unless actively eating or drinking



Cashmere FFA

The Chelan County Fair is on and the Cashmere FFA is ready to roll with 29 market animals. Students will haul in their livestock on Wednesday, September 8 and sell them at 10 a.m. on September 11. New this year is a dual-platform auction. Buyers have the option of bidding in person at the Fairgrounds or through an online bidding catalog at Yarbro.com. Described below are the different ways to purchase and or support Cashmere FFA and 4-H animals. FFA and 4-H programs would like to

thank all of our businesses for their continued support of these agricultural projects.

Option 1: Buyers can buy the animal and then "turn" it to the Packer Buyer who will pay a pre-established market price. For example, a business decides to bid a 275 pound hog up to \$500 and then "turn" it to the Packer Buyer who has a set price of \$.60/lb. The Packer Buyer will pay \$165 (275 lbs x \$.60/lb) and the business will pay the remaining \$335.

Option 2: A buyer can purchase the animal for personal consumption and send that animal to a local

processor of their choice. Typically, a market hog will yield about 55% of its live weight into retail product after processing and fabrication. For example, a fair hog weighing 280 pounds, should yield around 150 pounds of pork cuts. Market lambs and goats should yield just under 50% of their live weight for retail product.

Option 3: Finally, buy-


