

Brewster opens football season with non-league loss to Chelan

Six All-League veterans return

BREWSTER – The Bears varsity football team opened its 2019 season with a 35-25 non-league loss to the visiting Chelan Goats of the 1A Caribou Trail League, but it took the Goats the better part of four quarters to finally lead by double digits.

Chelan started with a bang after recovering a Bears' fumble on the very first play of the game and scoring a 40-yard touchdown on the next play. A pass play to Cade Gebbers near the Chelan goal set up Brewster's first TD to end the quarter, 7-6.

Chelan jumped out to a 14-6 lead early in the second quarter but would not lead by more than a touchdown until late in the fourth when the Goats added seven points to a 28-25 lead to win by 10.

"I thought that Logan McGuire played a great game offensively for his first high school football game," said head coach Jake Johanson. "He made some big plays to bail us out."

Johanson added that Adaih Najera "ran well all night and played tough on defense."

Other defensive highlights went to Gio Nila and Arnie Arevalo with seven tackles each. Cade Gebbers picked off a Chelan pass and returned it 83 yards for a Bears' TD. Jorge Ramirez added another interception.

Brewster finished second in the Central Washington 2B League last season, earned a spot in the state playoffs and fell to Napavine in the first round. The Bears lost seven seniors to graduation but have six returning CWB All-League players. They are seniors Mason Kelly, Jorge Ramirez and Rodolfo Madrid, juniors Gio Nila and Mario Guzman, and sophomore Arnie Arevalo.

The Bears travel to Quincy for a non-league on Friday, Sept. 13.

Lady Bears volleyball eyes return to state

BREWSTER – With the loss of only one senior from last year's fifth-place state team, the Lady Bears are back with a strong nucleus of veteran players for another run at state.

2018 League Coach of the Year coach Marcy Boesel has a senior-heavy lineup this season comprised of five seniors, three juniors and three freshmen. They include All-League First Team player Karste Wright and League MVP Brooklynne Boesel, Second Team nominee Sammi Emigh, and Honorable Mentions Karina Martinez and Anah Wulf. Brooklynne suffered two concussions during

the later basketball season and was cleared to get back onto competitive sports last May.

"She is working hard to come back in full capacity," coach Boesel said.

While she has some players who will swing between the varsity and JV, Boesel said her varsity roster includes veterans, a couple of new faces to the Bears volleyball program and some freshmen.

Last year's 1B/2B Northwest League champions defeated Ocosta in the opening round of state play but lost to defending state champ La Conner. In consolation play the Lady Bears lost to Toutle Lake and defeated Kalama for fifth place.
