

# WorkSource counselor discusses apprentice project at Brewster Chamber

BREWSTER – Job Training Counselor Marcus Alden from WorkSource Okanogan County was the featured speaker at the regular monthly meeting of the Brewster Chamber of Commerce last Wednesday, Sept. 5.

Alden addressed Chamber members about a new student apprenticeship program that he is helping to spearhead with the help of the North Central Educational Service District and Economic Alliance in Omak. Its goal is to present high school students with opportunities to earn and learn through local business mentorships and connect them with needed trade careers in the county.

Okanogan County was recently awarded a grant from Governor Jay Inslee’s \$6.4 million Career Connect Washington initiative to help introduce students to career opportunities in the county.

“A four-year degree isn’t the only path to a fulfilling career,” Inslee said in a media release last December. “Business leaders have told us they are looking for talent in everything from information technology to health care.

And that’s what this initiative is all about: connecting students to great employers and high-quality job training.”

Alden is speaking to school and community groups throughout the county to enlist participation in the upcoming High School Career Connection Expo in mid-October.

As an example, Alden said he is currently involved with creating certified training programs for medical and dental assistants in conjunction with Mid-Valley Hospital and Family Health Centers in the county.

# 71st Okanogan County Fair hosts successful four-day run

OKANOGAN – The Okanogan County Fair, an annual four-day extravaganza that brings the county together every September, opened its gates for the 71st time last Thursday, Sept. 6, with the theme “Stirrup Some Fun.”

Exhibitors, vendors, entertainers, competitors, and spectators converged on the fairgrounds on Rodeo Trail Road right up to until closing time at 3 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 9. In between visitors enjoyed a wide variety of attractions from arts, crafts, agricultural and educational displays to horse racing, mutton busting, and a Pro-West Rodeo.

An interactive utility pole climbing clinic was a big hit with visiting school kids on opening day. Personnel from the Okanogan County Public Utility District equipped the youngsters with climbing harnesses and safety ropes before helping them climb part way up a power pole and experience some of what the pros do to keep the power flowing.

Students from both the Brewster and Pateros FFA programs and Valley Venturers 4H Club hauled steers, pigs, and other livestock to the animal barns for competitive judging.

Pateros FFA advisor Lyle Blackburn said Jeremy Piechalski, Max Ewing, Samantha White, Jillian Piechalski, and Christopher Piechalski all showed stock at the Fair.

“As a team we won the Spirit of the Pavilion Award,” Blackburn said.

Sheryl Curtis of Riverside returned to the Fair with her Old World Oxen Living History camp.

The Okanogan County Long Term Recovery Group brought its Smoke and Reflections display, a comprehensive history of the 2014-15 wildfires told in news articles, photos, and artifacts.

South Okanogan County historian and Brewster alumnus Ralph Fries shared his work-in-progress of pioneer

"In the near future I hope to offer apprenticeships for a millwright and molder apprentice," Alden said. The training offers pay levels beyond the normal minimum wage, but recognized certification that can

be used in other parts of the state. "We want to get young adults on a career track and make a better living," Alden said. Brewster Chamber Secretary Mike Mauk was impressed with Alden's presentation and the opportunities it offers area students. "I didn't even know such

BREWSTER – Coming off a third place at State last year, the Brewster High School varsity girls’ soccer team has its work cut out for it as the girls begin the march for what they hope is an even better finish this year.

The Lady Bears lost to St. Georges in the state quar-

terfinals but rallied to defeat Adna for third place.

Brewster lost five senior All-League players to graduation last June, including Central Washington 2B Player of the Year Marlisa Garcia at the midfielder position. Gone are First Team players Rosa Tinoco and Yalina Vargas, and Second Team picks Yvette Sanchez and Rosa Velasco. Claire Burgett and

Naydelin Arevalo were also lost to graduation.

Returning All-League players include senior defender Beatriz Martinez, senior midfielder Alondra Torres, and senior goalkeeper Kim Nila.

The Lady Bears lost their non-league season opener to Okanogan, 2-0, on Sept. 4, and were scheduled to face league opponent Oroville on the road last Tuesday, Sept.

11. Brewster will host Lake Roosevelt at 4:30 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 13, and Chelan in a non-league match at 11 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 15. The Lady Bears will then travel to Liberty Bell for a 4:30 p.m. league game next Tuesday, Sept. 18.

Other league opponents this season include Bridgeport, Manson, Tonasket, and Pateros.

# Four All-League players lead Brewster varsity volleyball squad

BREWSTER – The Lady Bears varsity volleyball team will be shooting for more post-season play this year on the heels of last year’s elimination in the quarterfinal round against Kalama at the SunDome in Yakima.

Brewster took a long league winning streak to Yakima, holding opponents scoreless through 42 consecutive sets in the regular season and into District play.

Last year’s League and Bi-District 5/6 champion team landed six players on the Central Washington 2B All-League Team and two of those, Maret Miller and Marta Martinez graduated last June. The remaining four, senior Elizabeth Stam, and juniors Karste Wright, Brooklynne Boesel and Sammi Emigh returned to the squad this season.

After losing five seniors from last year’s squad, head coach Marcy Boesel moved seven players up from the JV

ranks to this season’s varsity. They are sophomores Megan Heller, Anah Wulf, and Emerson Webster, and juniors Joanna Espinoza, Emily Esquivel, Ashley Esquivel, and Josefine Martinez. With Stam as the only senior on this year’s team the Lady Bears have a strong and young group of players to carry through the next two seasons.

Brewster opened its regular league season at Bridgeport on Sept. 6 and took up where it left off by shutting out the Fillies, 3-0.

The Lady Bears were scheduled to play non-league Chelan of the 1A Caribou Trail League on the road last Tuesday, Sept. 11. Then it’s on to league opponent Oroville on Thursday, Sept. 13, before hosting Almira-Coulee-Hartline at 1 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 15, for a non-league game.

Brewster’s other CWB opponents this season include Tonasket, Waterville-Mansfield, Manson, Liberty Bell, Lake Roosevelt, and Soap Lake.

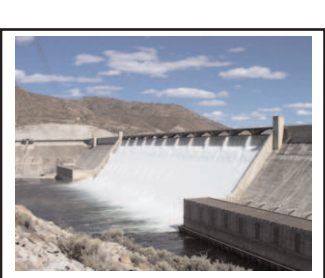
