## Chelan High School drama nominated for Apple Awards

CHELAN – Chelan High School's Blackhorn Drama Guild has been nominated in two categories for the 2024 Annual Apple Awards. The Numerica Performing Arts Center recently announced nominees for the Apple Awards, which recognize outstanding achievements in high school theater in the region. The awards recognize excellence in musical and stage play performances.

Chelan's production of "The Wonderful Wizard of Oz" was nominated for Best Overall Play, and junior David Kelly's performance as Scarecrow was nominated for Best Supporting Performer in a Play.

"Being nominated for best overall play among such strong casts is an honor," said Cindy Bertomeu, Blackhorn Drama Guild Director. "Our cast and crew put in long hours rehearsing to bring the classic story of Dorothy's and her companions, the Scarecrow, the Tin Woodsman, and the Cowardly Lion, to life," Bertomeu said. "Audience members repeatedly complimented us on how our costumes were fun and original, with just the right nods to the movie."

"The great thing about this show is that while it is Dorothy's story, everyone gets to shine throughout. Our ensemble members filled multiple roles, changing from Munchkins to trees or flowers and then into flying monkeys," Bertomeu said.

"Many of our funniest lines were between the Scarecrow, Lion, and Tin Woodsman, which ultimately led to David Kelly's nomination for Best Supporting Performer in a Play, for his zany antics as the Scarecrow."

Kelly has been acting with Blackhorn Drama since 6th grade and is the club president, Bertomeu said. "His dedication and growth as an actor have well earned him recognition among the region's finest high school thespians," she said.

The awards ceremony will be held on Thursday, May 16, at 7 p.m. at the Numerica Performing Arts Center in Wenatchee. Brian Higgins will direct the awards ceremony. Higgins is a teacher at Wenatchee High School, a frequent performer in local theater, and a director for Quincy's community theater.

"The evening will run like a Hollywood awards show," Higgins said.

## Firefighters, commissioners 'push in' new fire engine

CHELAN – Chelan Fire & Rescue held a new fire engine "push in" ceremony for their 2024 Spartan Emergency Response Vehicle, a 4-wheel drive and Wildland Urban Interface Fire Engine, on April 13 at the station at the corner of Wapato Avenue and Sanders Street.

Chelan Fire Chief Brandon Asher welcomed those in attendance to the ceremony.

"Three years ago we asked for our communities support in updating our aging fleet and bettering our staffing levels. You graciously answered that call and we quickly went to work. We hired three more firefighters, and we put together an apparatus committee to design and replace two 30 year old engines. Today, after 717 long days, we get to place the new E71 in service," said Chief Asher.

Fire Commissioners Karyl Oules and Russ Jones, and former commissioner Phil Moller were recognized for understanding the need and who authorized the purchases.

Members of the apparatus design team were members of Chelan Fire & Rescue and the community.

They were Chief Asher, Lt. Ron Simmons, Assistant Chief Shawn Sherman, Firefighter Sam Belsky, Chelan resident and retired Kirkland Battalion Chief Larry Peabody, retired Chelan Fire and Rescue mechanic John Goyne, and the districts representative from True North Emergency Equipment Steve Brewer.

The goal was to design an engine that could do it all: fight structure fires, brush fires, and have the capability to get firefighters there quickly and safely.

E71 is a 2024 Spartan Metro Star 4x4 pumper. It can carry four firefighters, has a 1,500 GPM pump, carries 750 gallons of water, 1,000 feet of 4 inch hose and has a front bumper turret (nozzle) capable of pumping

while moving. Cost to the district was \$750,000.

The changes in elevation in the Lake Chelan Valley and firefighting challenges in the urban interface made this a top priority.

The 'push in' ceremony dates back to the 18th century. It honors firefighters and traditions of the past. Since horses could not back the apparatus into the fire house after coming back

## Ruby U launches speaker presentations at historic Chelan Ruby Theatre

CHELAN – The Ruby Theatre in downtown Chelan has launched a new speaker series called Ruby U. The series features free public presentations, panels, and discussions on topics of community interest. It aims to inform, educate, and challenge the understanding of the Chelan Valley community and its future.

The inaugural presentation, held on April 11, attracted over 75 attendees to the Ruby Theatre. Rich Beausoleil, Statewide Bear & Cougar Specialist from the Washington Department of Fish & Wildlife (WDFW), along with his Karelian Bear Dog Milo, discussed black bear ecology based on

a ten-year North Cascades research project. Beausoleil also provided updates on orphaned bear cubs from the Twenty-Five Mile fire, human-black bear conflict at Lake Chelan, and WDFW's successful use of Karelian Bear Dogs in the area.

Beausoleil's data-rich presentation, which included videos of Karelian bear dogs in action, highlighted the prevalence of black bears in North Central Washington, particularly in the Chelan Valley on the south shore of Lake Chelan between the State Park and Twenty-Five Mile Creek State Park. He emphasized that relocating resident adult bears is not a viable solution, as they can travel hundreds of miles to return to their home range.

The root causes of human-black bear conflict in the Chelan Valley were identified as non-bear-resistant and unsecured garbage bins, plastic lid dumpsters, calorie-rich food items like bird seed and hummingbird feeders, and unpicked fruit trees. Beausoleil provided tips and resources on how Lake Chelan residents can co-exist with bears and become a BearWise community (<https://bearwise.org/>). He stressed the need for revising garbage contracts and ordinances at both the city and county levels while engaging community residents.

## Willoughby throws hat in ring for Chelan County Commissioner race

MANSON – Chris Willoughby, a longtime resident of the Lake Chelan Valley, has announced his candidacy for the Chelan County Commissioner District 3 position.

The announcement, made on April 18, comes as Willoughby seeks to address concerns and find solutions for

the county's residents.

In his announcement letter, Willoughby stated, "Change is inevitable, and progress can and should not be stopped. It is how change and progress are managed that is important to most communities."

Willoughby, who has been a member of the Manson Community Council for several years, has a long history of public service.

"Public service has been a lifelong passion for me," he wrote. At the age of 16, I started as a volunteer firefighter with several others when we helped to form Explorer Post 57, which allowed young men and women the chance to explore firefighting as a career."

Since then, Willoughby has served as a Volunteer Firefighter/EMT for over three decades and currently serves as a Chelan County Fire District 5 Fire Commissioner in Manson. He has also served as an EMT



for Lake Chelan Valley EMS for nearly 20 years and as a Reserve Marine Deputy for the Chelan County Marine Patrol.

With a background in agriculture, Willoughby has worked and managed several apple orchards throughout his career and currently manages a family orchard in Manson. "As a family, we have suffered through all of the lows and also enjoyed the highs. Some of those orchards still have trees that were planted by my grandparents and great grandparents, and still are going strong today," he wrote.

## Cappell announces candidacy for Chelan County Commissioner

WENATCHEE – Brandt Cappell, a Wenatchee resident and Senior Legislative Assistant to State Rep. Keith Goehner, has announced his candidacy for Chelan County Commissioner, Position 3. Cappell, who is running as a Republican, previously ran for the position and is now seeking to build on his prior bid.

"I know what it takes to be an effective servant to those I represent. Actions in Olympia directly affect our ability to govern in Chelan County. I've spent 13 years navigating the bureau-

cratic mess of state government. I will work to ensure Chelan County government isn't part of the problem," Cappell stated, emphasizing his experience working alongside two state representatives serving the area.

Cappell's platform focuses on addressing issues related to housing, property rights, taxes, and the growing prevalence of drugs, crime, and homelessness in Chelan County. "One thing that has changed is the prevalence of drugs, crime, and homelessness in Chelan County. It's no longer just a big city problem. We have all been affected by these tragic issues in some way. We can't have people dying on our streets while criminal activity runs rampant," Cappell said.

"This is no part-time endeavor, and I am already in the community listening and learning. I want Chelan County to be where my children choose to live, work, and raise their families. I commit to being open and available to



everyone and making informed decisions. The citizens of Chelan County should expect nothing less," Cappell added, expressing his dedication to the future of North Central Washington.

A Wenatchee Valley native, Cappell graduated from Wenatchee High School, attended Wenatchee Valley College, and holds a Bachelor of Science

## Former Snoqualmie City Councilmember Jim Mayhew enters State Senate race in redrawn 12<sup>th</sup> Legislative District

SNOQUALMIE – Former Snoqualmie City Council member and business executive Jim Mayhew announced his candidacy for the State Senate in the recently redrawn 12th Legislative District on April 16.

The Democrat, who supports women's reproductive rights and increased funding for public education, will face incumbent Republican Brad Hawkins in what is now considered a competitive "swing" district following a Federal judge's decision to redraw the district boundaries.

The new 12th District spans both sides of the Cascade Mountains, including most of Chelan County and portions of King and Snohomish counties.

Mayhew emphasized his commitment to uniting the

ties are addressing affordable housing, improving access to behavioral health and addiction recovery services, and increasing investments in public education.

Drawing on his personal experiences with poverty and housing insecurity as a child, Mayhew stressed the importance of ensuring that every child in the state has access to quality education, nutrition, and stable home environments.

Mayhew also plans to leverage his business and budgeting expertise to tackle issues such as freight mobility, workforce training, and infrastructure funding. To better understand the needs and perspectives of the district's diverse communities, he will embark on a "listening tour" as part of his campaign.

In the wake of the U.S. Supreme Court's Dobbs decision, Mayhew has positioned himself as a strong advocate for women's healthcare and autonomy. "One of the clearest contrasts in this race is my unflinching commitment to reproductive health care and rights," he stated.

"We'll be handing out awards to winners in each category, and interspersed amongst those awards presentations will be performances from nominees and cast members from each of the high schools."

"We are highlighting nominees in each of those performances, both musical and dramatic scenes, and they will, for the most part, perform scenes and songs from the shows their schools performed this year," he said. "We have a few other performances we'll see during the evening, but we're trying to keep some things as a surprise for our audience," he said. "Ultimately, we want to provide our attendees with a show – a meaningful experience and a chance to celebrate and share their gratitude for the hard work these groups have put in across our communities."

"We look forward to highlighting some of our cast in the awards with a brief scene, and we are excited to see other schools recreate moments from their shows as well," Bertomeu said. "The awards night will be quite the event."

Alex Haley, Director of Programming and Marketing for the Numerica Performing Arts Center, said the nominees were chosen by the Apple Academy, a group of community members, actors, and directors in the Greater Wenatchee Area.

"Schools nominate two performers in each category (Lead and Supporting), and the evaluators can nominate additional standouts they see during the performances," Haley said.

Academy members attend each show throughout the school year and provide feedback that gets scored for each award category. After all the scores are tabulated, they reconvene to discuss each production and performer in detail, he said.

"Finally, they use a ranked voting system to determine the final winners, announced during the ceremony," Haley said. "The Numerica PAC facilitates this entire process but remains neutral throughout. The Apple Academy, presenters, and director of the ceremony are all unaware of the award recipients until they're presented that night."

"My personal goal for the evening, second to celebrating those students, is to connect those students to the people in their communities who are continuing to make the arts a part of their daily life," Higgins said. "To do that, I am inviting people from each of those communities that serve our high schools to be a part of the awards show."

"Our list of awards presenters includes people from Chelan, Cashmere, Wenatchee, Quincy, East Wenatchee and Leavenworth," Higgins said. "We have representatives from the arts organizations in these communities, including Music Theater Wenatchee and Quincy Valley Allied Arts."

Tickets are \$20 for adults and \$15 for students and can be purchased at NumericaPAC.org or at the Numerica PAC Box Office (123 N. Wenatchee Ave.), which is open Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

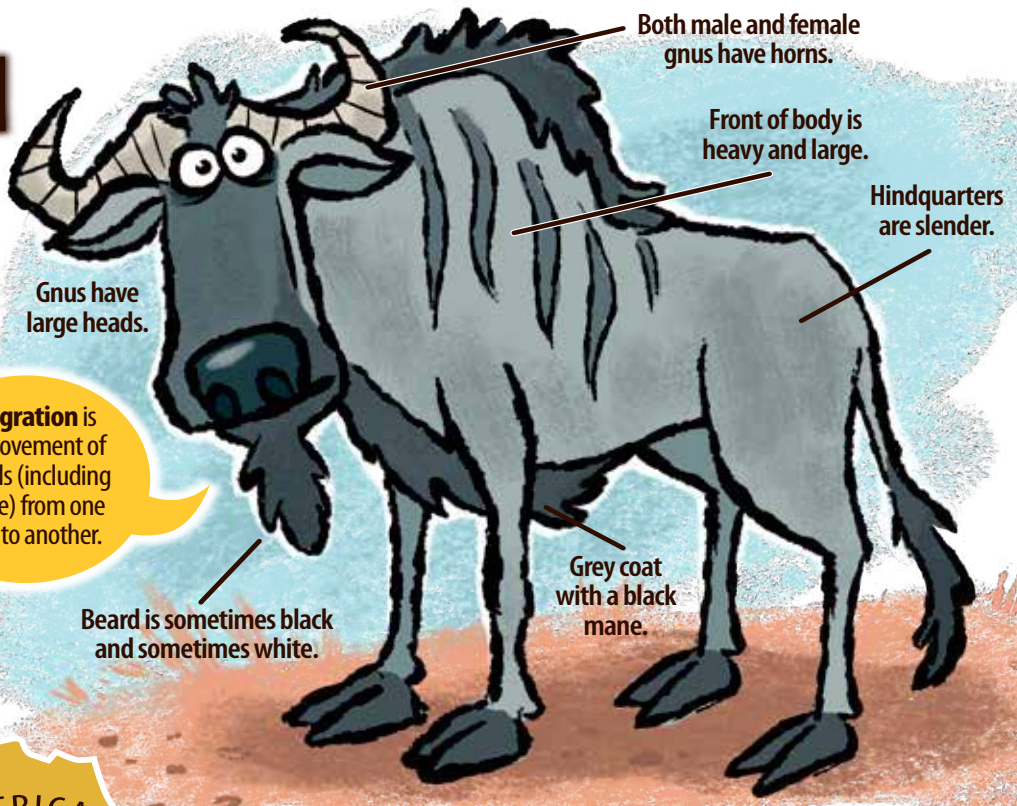


# The Great Gnu Migration

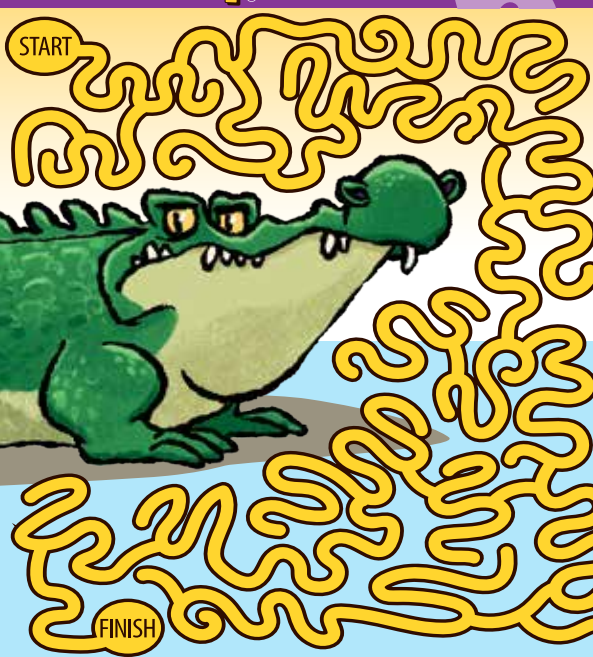

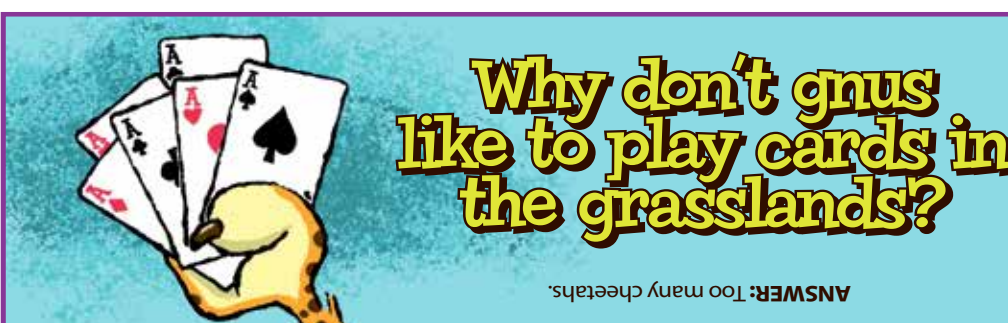
